THe 10 instant sayled hence the *John* and *Thomas*, laden with Pi ce goods and Pilchards, with the *Oak* of London with Pilchards and Tinn for the streights. Here arrived the same day the *African* of London to lade upon the same voyage; and the *Susanna* from New-Tork in America laden with the commodities of those parts, whose thriving condition they commend, and are bound for Holland.

Yesterday came in a vessel from *Rochal*, telling us of a Report in that place that several *New-found-land* ships have been lately call away by Storms.

Warsaw, Sept. 2. The intended Marriage between the late elected King and the Arch-Duchess *Eleanor* the Emperours Sister, is discoursed of with greater confidence then ever, with whom, besides the Portion of an hundred and Twenty thousand Crowns, the Emperors Dowager is said to have offered the summe of an hundred thousand Ducats to be paid upon the Marriage in Gold and Jewels; and as much more to be assured after the death of the said Emperors, besides an Obligation from the Emperour for the procuring an annual Pension from the Crown of Spain.

The King has been for some days diverting himself in *Tasdowa*, a House of pleasure about a League from this City giving free access to the Father less hither by the Emperors and the Emperours Ambassadors whom he receives and Treats with much kindness, and is preparing in few days for his removal towards *Cratow* in Order to his Coronation; which when ended and the Diet began, tis believed the proposal of this Marriage may be there published, for which end an Ambassador Extraordinary is suddenly expected here from their Imperial Majesties.

Of preparatory Diets which have been held within the several Provinces and Palatinates of this Kingdom, of them have broken off without any resolution, having either disagreed in the election of their Marshal or Speaker, or in the nomination of their Deputies or Representatives which are to be sent to the Grand Diet at the Coronation.

The States of *Prussia* have withdrawn the Guards which they had put into *Poland* during the Inter-regnum, or vacancy of the Crown, which tis feared may expose that place to the attempts of our Neighbours if any disturbances should happen at the time of the Coronation.

The report of the beating of *Borofearke*, with great slaughter by the Tartars Army is not yet confirmed, neither is that of the retirement of the Cham of *Tartary* with his Army out of *Ukrania*, yet tis said His Majesty has received Letters from that Province assuring him that the greatest part of the Cossacks which were formerly subject to the Crown of *Poland* have lately declared their willingness to return to their obedience.

The King was lately by a private Letter advised to take a particular care of his own persons since which he fell into a distemper, at which at the first gave him an apprehension of some Treasonable attempt upon him, but he is since recovered through those fears are blown over.

Venice Sept. 7. We have not had this last week any Letters from *Candia*, nor any certain advice from other parts of the State of that City.

Here lately arrived 3 vessels which departed in July last from *Constantinople*, where the French Ambassador was in little time expected from *Adrianople*, having as was then given out, prevailed much with the Grand Signior for the

procuring of several advantages and privileges for the French Merchants.

They affirm that every week brought thither express from the Grand Visier, whose great confidence of prevailing in his Siege had somewhat quieted the spirits of the people in *Constantinople* still reduced them to a more peaceable temper, though not fully reconciled them to his person, yet have some numbers of men lifted themselves into that strikes and embarked themselves upon several Saichs with a considerable quantity of Corn, Biscuit, and other conveniences for the supply of the Visiers Army.

In *Adrianople* have happened lately some tumults in the City upon the arrival of a certain person from the Court which endeavoured to lay new Imposts upon them, whereupon the people fell into a passion, and getting tumultuously together knocked him on the head with stones, dragging him about the City, and speaking desperate and injurious words against the Grand Signior, the Divan and his other Ministers.

Some Vessels which came the 14th past from *Zante* give us no other Information but that about 30 sail of ships were in that Port lading Men and Provisions for *Candia*, amongst whom was the Convoy under the Command of the Duke of *Mirandola*, with six other ships which put to sea some days after from hence upon the same service, the rest of those ships were there arrived from other parts, and amongst them several from *Candia* itself, for the transportation of Provisions and Ammunition for supply of the Garrison.

A Caich from *Dilmaria* tells us, that 4 Privateers of *Cefel Nuovo* having pursued men on shoar and made several prisoners upon the Coasts, were upon their return towards their Port closely pursued by two Christian Flutes, who seized on the most considerable of these Privateers, delivering the prisoners and making slaves of the Turks.

Proveditor General *Priulli* is visiting the several Garrisons within his Province, which he intends to leave in a good posture in the hands of his successor Signior *Antonio Barbaro*.

On Thursday last arrived two Couriers in 5 days from *Paris*, dispatched thence with great diligence by our Ambassador in that Court, to consist to the Senate His most Christian Majesty resolution of hastening forwards the fresh factors under the Command of the Marshal de *Bellefonds* for the farther relief of *Candia*, and that he had dispatched his Orders to the Duke de *Navailles* to continue his abode there with his forces till the arrival of the said supplies, which he was intreated to do upon the desires of the Pope who had sent the like Orders to his General *Bald Francisco Vincenzo Rospigliosi*.

All the Companies of the *Comte de Poissia's* Regiment are here arrived and were yesterday mustered at *Lido*, where they advanced the Popes Banner, under which they are to serve in this expedition; the rest of the forces which are to pass for *Candia* under the Conduct of Proveditor *Bernardotte* also in readiness to embark; the whole number of men belonging to this Convoy being somewhat above 2000. On Wednesday the Procurator intends to embark himself and to sail with the first fair wind.

Legorn, Sept. 9. The Seventh instant appeared before this Port 3 Portugis men of War from *Lisbonne* with the *Conde de Prados* Ambassador Extraordinary from the Prince *Don Pedro* to the Court of *Rome*, the Conde came last night on shoar, intending after 7 or 8 days continuance here *incognito*, to make the rest of his voyage by Land,

the ships by contrary and violent winds hindered as yet from putting into this Port, after 13 days stop here they intend to return homewards.

This night take hence the *Marwick* with the Experiment bound for London, and the *Waisy* for Holland. The *Robert and Eliza* may depart this week for *Smirna*, as may also the *Speedwel* for *Scanderoon*, and the *Evanam* for *Messina* and *Puglia*.

The 6th instant put out to sea from hence 2 Gallies belonging to the Great Duke intended for *Marsilles*, there to attend for the embarkation of the Prince of Tuscany on his return home.

Hamburg September 17. Here is lately arrived the pretended Prince *Sigala* but living in several places and on several accounts been discovered for an impostor, 'tis believed he will not have much encouragement to make any long continuance here.

From *Vienne* we are informed that several Treagues of Marriage are there on foot, one between the late Elected King of Poland, and the Emperors Eldest sister, a second between the King of Sweden and the Emperors second sister, and a third between the Duke of *Mantua* and the Arch Duetess of *Inpruck*.

They farther tell us, that the Emperor having lately sent for the Archbishop of *Gran*, imparted to him his resolution as to his disposal of several Churches and commands in *Hungary*; and particularly since the present Chancellor of *Hungary* began to be of so great an age as to exempt him from the burthen of that employment, he was willing to ease him of that load, and to confer on him the Bishoprick of *Agria*, as most suitable to his present condition, and to bestow the vacant Chancellorship on *Misegnor Palfi*, with the addition of the Bishoprick of *Neutra*.

Letters of the 31 instant from *Stockholm* tell us, that the Constable *Wrangle* being there arrived at a time when most of the Senators had retired themselves for their diversion, was also passed into the Country where he intended to continue for some time in taking a view of his own private Affairs.

The Office of great Treasurer to the Crown of Sweden is lately vacant by the death of the *Sieur Scuenboodt*, but his successor in the employment not yet nominated.

Brussels, Sept. 20. On Sunday last a body of 2500 French Foot and 500 Horse were drawn together near a Fort of theirs near *Ipre*, but with intention only to secure a Convey of Coals from *Dunkirk* in its passage between *France* and *Dismuid*; they are now with all diligence labouring about their Fortifications, and have sent away their workmen from *Charleroy* to *Methu*, where they intend to complete their Lines before the end of the next month.

Here is lately arrived the Baron *de Droesbeck*, Grand Provost of *Liege*, who was introduced by the Bishop of *Ghent* to his Audience on Munday last from the Constable, upon whose desire, Commissioners (all of them of the Council of the Finances) are nominated to Treat with him for the settling and fixing of the Customs with those of *Liege*.

The Deputies from the four Members of *Flanders* have been lately to attend the Constable to offer him the sum of 100 thousand Florins for the entertainment of the soldiers of that Province, in which affair he has permitted them to his Secretary.

Paris, Sept. 25 On Saturday last arrived here the *Sieur de St-Leger* a Brigadier of His Majesties Mousquetaires, with an Express from the Duke de *Navailles* in *Candia*, who immediately went hence to find His Majesty at *Chambourg* without any communication of any thing of consequence or importance of the Affairs of that Isle, till he had first delivered his Message to the King; yet it is confidently said, that the Duke de *Navailles* having put all things in readiness for his return from *Candia*, either upon the arrival of fresh Orders from his most Christian Majesty, or several ships with Provisions and Ammunition for the necessary supply of his Men, was returned again with his forces into

the Town, and that a fresh Sally has been since made upon the Enemy with some considerable success, inasmuch as the besieged beat back the Turks with much slaughter, and regained from them some ground without the first Reinforcements to the no small encouragement of the besieged, though with considerable loss to the French of several excellent Officers, amongst whom are named the *Sieurs de St-Valier* and *de Liniere* both of them Masters of the Camp or Colonels.

The King intends not so long a continuance at *Chambourg* as he formerly designed, hastening his return upon the account of the continuance of the Dauphins distemper, whose Feavor has often returns upon him to the great discouragement of his Physicians; His Majesty may be expected at *Vincennes* about the 8th of the next month.

His Majesty was pleased some days since to write to the Venetian Ambassador how much he was surprised at the news of the intended return of the Duke de *Navailles*; to which he the Duke was inclined for several reasons which he had reserved only for the Kings Ear. The King seems much dissatisfied with several sea Officers employed in that expedition, but defers the effects of his anger towards them till their return; in the mean time to shew his zeal for the carrying on of the work in the defense of the besieged City, he has ordered 20 men to be drawn out of each Company of his Regiment of Guards which are to be Commanded by several of the Captains chosen for the employment; which are said to be the *Sieurs de Bisaut*, *de Langburt*, *de Chacard*, and *de Traffi*; besides these are to be sent upon the same service the whole Regiments of *Bellefonds* and *Villeroi*, to whom are to be adjoynd the 1500 men raised by the Marshal de *Bellefonds* for this expedition, so that the whole body will consist of 3500 men, who are ordered to march to their Rendezvous at *Thoulon*, and to embark by the beginning of *November*, and by the way to take in such other forces as shall be in readiness upon the Popes particular account to serve the said Marshal in this expedition as his General.

After many messages and debates, Monsieur de *Louvois* has been at the last induced to permit the free passage to the Holland Post once a week upon the same day and regulation as formerly; the Letters between this and *Holland* are still stopped, but in Reprisal, the Spaniards have ordered a stop to be put to all Ordinaries also between *Spain* and *Flanders*.

From *Rome* we are told that the Pope has lately given fresh Orders for the raising and finishing of a Tomb to the Honour of the Duke of *sauffort*, which gives us reason to suppose the vanity of all those former Reports of his surviving the disastrous Sally out of *Candia*.

London, Sept. 19 Yesterday in the morning returned to the Palace at *Whitehall* His Majesty and his Royal Highness, and in the afternoon Her Majesty and her Royal Highness all of them from *Windsor*; This afternoon his Excellency Monsieur *Coblenz* the French Ambassador was severally introduced and attended by the Master of the Ceremonies to his Audiences from their said Majesties and Royal Highnesses, to whom he made his compliments of Condoleance upon the late death of the Queen Mother of *England*.
