"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Fyfield with Tubney, Besselsleigh, and Appleton all in the diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Kenneth, Bishop of Oxford, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Fyfield with Tubney, Besselsleigh, and Appleton shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"(a) The territory to be annexed to the parish of Besselsleigh:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Fyfield with Tubney which is bounded upon the north east by the

parish of Besselsleigh, upon the north west by the parish of Appleton and upon the south west by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Fyfield with Tubney from the parish of Appleton at a point in the middle of the footpath crossing an unnamed stream which forms the northwestern boundary of close number 3 on the map and continuing thence south eastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned footpath (thereby crossing closes numbered 3, 7, 8 and 23B on the map) to the point where it meets the road or track leading from Bessels Leigh Manor to the Farringdon to Oxford Road and continuing thence in the same direction and in a straight line across the last mentioned road or track to the boundary which divides the parish of Fyfield with Tubney from the parish of Besselsleigh.

"(b) The territory to be annexed to the parish of Appleton:—

"All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Fyfield with Tubney which is bounded upon the east by the parish of Marcham, upon part of the north east by the parish of Besselsleigh, upon the remaining part of the north east by that part of the parish of Fyfield with Tubney hereinbefore annexed to the parish of Besselsleigh, upon the north west by the parish of Appleton and upon the south by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Fyfield with Tubney from the parish of Appleton at a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence which divides close number 29 from close number 34 on the map and continuing thence generally south eastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences which divide close number 30 from closes numbered 34 and 37 on the map to the Farringdon to Oxford Road and continuing thence first south eastwards to and then north eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 39 chains and continuing thence due south eastwards in a straight line for a distance of 12 chains to the boundary which divides the parish of Fyfield with Tubney from the parish of Marcham (thereby crossing close number 40 on the map)."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Spencer, Bishop of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Great Casterton with Pickworth and the benefice of Tickencote both situate in the diocese of Peterborough.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Great Casterton with Pickworth and the benefice of Tickencote shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Great Casterton with Pickworth and Tickencote,' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Great Casterton with Pickworth shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice the patrons of the benefice of Tickencote shall have the first turn and the patron of the benefice of Great Casterton with Pickworth shall have the second and third turns."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Archdeacons and Rural Deaneries Act, 1874, and of the Acts mentioned therein, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of Rochester (in witness whereof he has signed and sealed the same) with respect to the Archdeacons of Rochester and Tonbridge, both in the diocese of Rochester, and to some of the rural deaneries within such archdeacons.

"SCHEME.

"As from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any

assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order:—

"1. There shall be constituted and established within the Archdeaconry of Rochester two new rural deaneries which shall be called respectively 'The Rural Deanery of Gillingham' and 'The Rural Deanery of Orpington' and shall respectively comprise the parishes specified in the first and second parts of the Schedule hereto.

"2. The rural deanery of Cliffe at Hoo within the Archdeaconry of Rochester shall be renamed 'The Rural Deanery of Strood' and the parishes of Cuxton, Frindsbury, Strood, and Strood Saint Mary, now in the Rural Deanery of Rochester within the same Archdeaconry shall be transferred to the said Rural Deanery of Strood.

"3. There shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Chislehurst in the Archdeaconry of Rochester the parish of Saint Mary, Cray, now in the Rural Deanery of Bromley within the same Archdeaconry.

"4. There shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Cobham in the Archdeaconry of Rochester the parishes of Ash and Ridley, now in the Rural Deanery of Shoreham and the Archdeaconry of Tonbridge.

"5. There shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Dartford in the Archdeaconry of Rochester the parish of Greenhithe, now in the Rural Deanery of Gravesend within the same Archdeaconry.

"6. There shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Rochester in the Archdeaconry of Rochester the parishes of Burham and Wouldham, now in the Rural Deanery of Cobham within the same Archdeaconry.

"7. There shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Malling in the Archdeaconry of Tonbridge the parish of Aylesford, now in the Rural Deanery of Cobham and the Archdeaconry of Rochester.

"8. There shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Tonbridge in the Archdeaconry of Tonbridge the parishes of East Peckham, and Hadlow, now in the Rural Deanery of Malling within the same Archdeaconry.

"9. There shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Tunbridge Wells in the Archdeaconry of Tonbridge the parish of Fordcombe Saint Peter, now in the Rural Deanery of Tonbridge within the same Archdeaconry.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Chingford:—

"All that part of the parish of Waltham Holy Cross, otherwise Waltham Abbey (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which is bounded upon the south by the parish of Chingford and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Waltham Holy Cross from the parish of Chingford in the middle of the aqueduct belonging to the Metropolitan Water Board (numbered 1375 on the map) and continuing thence northwards along the middle of the said aqueduct to a point opposite the southwestern end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary

of close numbered 1381 and continuing thence first eastwards to the said wall or fence (thereby crossing close numbered 1380) and then first north-eastwards and then south-eastwards along the said wall or fence and in continuation thereof in the same straight line across Sewardstone Road to the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close numbered 1383 and continuing thence north-eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the last mentioned close and continuing thence first eastwards and then south-eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the last mentioned close and continuing thence generally in a southerly direction along the last mentioned wall or fence and the wall or fence which forms the eastern boundary of the close numbered 1382 to its junction with the southern boundary of the last mentioned close and continuing thence first north-eastwards and then southwards along the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close numbered 1390 to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the last mentioned close and continuing thence first south-eastwards and then north-eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence which forms the southeastern boundary of close numbered 1389 to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of close numbered 1386 and continuing thence south-eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and in the same straight line in continuation thereof across Yardley Lane to the boundary which divides the parish of Waltham Holy Cross from the parish of Chingford."

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF EXPERIMENTAL OFFICERS AND ASSISTANT EXPERIMENTAL OFFICERS IN VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

1. Age.

For the Experimental Officer grade candidates must be at least 26 years and under 31 years of age on 31st December, 1954, i.e., they must have been born on or after 1st January, 1924, and on or before 31st December, 1928.

Candidates for the Assistant Experimental Officer grade must be at least 18 years and under 28 years of age on 31st December, 1954, i.e., they must have been born on or after 1st January, 1927, and on or before 31st December, 1936.

But for each grade a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may for this purpose deduct his period of such service from his actual age. Service in H.M. Forces on a Duration of Emergency engagement or under the National Service Acts cannot be reckoned for this purpose.

2. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service

of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment under the Admiralty, War Office, Air Ministry or Ministry of Supply, unless he or she is a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty, Secretary of State for War, Secretary of State for Air, or Minister of Supply, as the case may be.

4. Qualification.

Normally every candidate must be in possession of one of the undermentioned qualifications:—

(a) The Higher School Certificate with Mathematics or a science subject as a principal subject, or an equivalent qualification.

or

(b) A General Certificate of Education in five subjects at the levels shown in brackets:—

(i) English language (Ordinary)

(ii) Two mathematical or scientific subjects (Advanced)

(iii) Mathematics (Ordinary), if no mathematical subject is offered in (ii)—except in the case of candidates who offer two biological subjects (Advanced) in (ii)

(iv) A scientific subject (Ordinary) if no scientific subject is offered in (ii)

(v) Balance of one or two subjects (Ordinary) at candidates' choice.

To assist candidates during the change-over period they will be admitted to this competition if they already possess a School Certificate and in addition obtain passes at the General Certificate of Education examination in two mathematical or scientific subjects at Advanced level.

(c) The Scottish Leaving Certificate with passes in five subjects, of which one must be English. Three of the passes must be on the higher grade, and two of these must be in mathematical or scientific subjects. (Passes at the Scottish Universities Preliminary Examination will be accepted as equivalent to passes in the Scottish Leaving Certificate.)

or

(d) The Senior Certificate of the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland showing passes in English Language and in two Science subjects at Advanced level, in Mathematics at Ordinary level and in one other subject; or one Science and two Mathematical subjects at Advanced level and in two other subjects; or three Mathematical subjects at Advanced level, in one Science subject and one other subject.

or

(e) A statement from the Scottish Education Department or the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland showing that they have attained a standard equivalent to that required by (a) or (b) above.

or

(f) a university degree in a scientific or engineering subject or in Mathematics.

or

(g) Associateship of the Royal Institute of Chemistry, or graduate membership of any other professional institution accepted by the Commissioners as appropriate (e.g., Institution of Civil Engineers, Institution of Mechanical Engineers, Institution of Electrical Engineers).

or

(h) The Higher National Certificate.

or

(j) The final certificate of a grouped course in a relevant subject at the City and Guilds of London Institute.

BUT

(k) Candidates who are not in possession of such certificate or equivalent qualifications may be admitted exceptionally by the Commissioners, at their discretion, if evidence of suitable experience on scientific research and development work can be produced; such candidates at present serving in a Government Department must be certified by that Department as being worthy of consideration.

Candidates over 22 (other than established members of the Assistant (Scientific) Class) will generally be expected to have a Pass Degree in an appropriate subject, or a technical qualification, e.g., a Higher National Certificate either in appropriate subjects or with appropriate endorsements.

5. Application.

A candidate may submit an application if he is not yet qualified under Regulation 4 but is sitting for a qualifying examination during 1954. If he is selected for interview and found acceptable he will not be declared successful until it is known from the result of his examination that he satisfies Regulation 4.

A candidate admitted under this concession will be expected to furnish documentary evidence of the result of the examination to the Commissioners as soon as possible.

A candidate may make one, and only one, application under these Regulations.

6. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

7. Candidates trained as Teachers.

(f) The Ordinary National Certificate.

(The Commissioners may admit as eligible under this paragraph candidates who have satisfactorily completed the second year (s 2) of the Senior course.)

or

(g) The Intermediate Examination of the Institute of Medical Laboratory Technology.

or

(h) An Intermediate Grouped Course Certificate of the City and Guilds of London Institute in relevant subjects.

or

(j) A pass in either the Forces Preliminary Examination with a pass in either mathematics or natural science, or the Royal Air Force Higher Education Test, Part I, with a pass in mathematics, mechanics or the properties of matter, or the Admiralty Higher Educational Test, Second Class, with a pass in mathematics or mechanics or magnetism and electricity.

but (k) The Commissioners may also accept as eligible candidates who are unable to comply with the requirements above but who

(i) produce evidence satisfactory to the Commissioners that they have reached School Certificate Credit standard in Mathematics or a Science subject, or the equivalent in the General Certificate of Education,

or

(ii) have served for at least 10 years, on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement, in the technical branch of H.M. Forces. Such candidates must have served an artificer apprenticeship (where appropriate) or have reached the rank of Petty Officer or Sergeant,
