"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Geoffrey, Archbishop of Canterbury, and of the Reverend Charles Magraw, the incumbent of the said united benefice of Canterbury, Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that as from the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme clause 7 of the said Order shall be rescinded and the following new clause shall be substituted therefor, that is to say:—

"7 (a) That so soon as conveniently may be the church of Saint Andrew, Canterbury, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof, shall be sold and disposed of by us, the Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the said church and all other expenses incidental to these matters shall be applied by us, the said Church Commissioners, as follows, that is to say, such proportion of the said proceeds as we, after consultation with the Archbishop of Canterbury, shall determine shall be applied towards the cost of the erection of a church hall in connection with the said united benefice of Canterbury, Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, and any residue shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Canterbury established pursuant to the 32nd section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923."

"(a) All that part of the parish of Williton (coloured red on the map annexed hereto) which is bounded upon the east by the parish of Sampford Brett and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Sampford Brett from the parish of Williton at the northeastern end of the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of the house and premises named Furzey, Tower Hill, and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and thence first southwards and then southeastwards along the walls or fences forming the western and south-western boundaries of the last mentioned house and premises.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Quarndon, the benefice of Mugginton and the benefice of Kedleston shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Quarndon with Mugginton and Kedleston' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of Union.* The union shall take effect upon the first avoidance of that one of the said benefices last to be avoided after the day when

any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette.

"3. Parsonage House.

"(a) Without prejudice to the exercise, before the date when the union takes effect of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Quarndon shall, if at that date it belongs to the said benefice, be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Mugginton and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient.

Upon the union taking effect the incumbent shall, in order to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, employ an assistant curate or, in the event of the services of a wholtime curate being unobtainable, such other clerical assistance as the bishop of the diocese may from time to time direct, and there shall be appropriated as a fund towards the cost of providing such assistance as aforesaid a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely an annual sum of £100, being part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us to the incumbent for the time being of the benefice of Saint Paul's Cray, and the said fund shall be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the said diocese of Rochester as trustees to apply the same accordingly."

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR RECRUITMENT TO THE NATIONAL AGRICULTURAL ADVISORY SERVICE UNDER THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

1. Age.

Candidates must on 1st August, 1954, be at least 18 years of age for appointment to Grade B, at least 20½ years of age for appointment to Grade IV (a) or Grade IV (b), at least 25 years of age for appointment to Grade III, at least 26 years of age for appointment to Grade A, and at least 31 years of age for appointment to Grade I or Grade II. Provided that a candidate under 25 years of age on 1st August, 1954, may be accepted for appointment to Grade III if he is exceptionally well qualified.

There is no upper age limit specified for this Competition, but in general, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service, and accordingly weight may be given to this factor in considering candidates for these posts who are over 50 years of age.

2. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women, including married women, may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible for appointment under these Regulations to situations which render them eligible for pension and other benefits under the Superannuation Acts, unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Qualification.

(a) Candidates for Grades I to IV must normally possess a University degree in agriculture, dairying, horticulture, or the appropriate natural sciences, or engineering, or a National Diploma in appropriate subjects, or a qualification accepted by the Commissioners as of equivalent academic standard. For Grade IV (a), candidates must have obtained a University degree with first or second class honours in the appropriate scientific subject or an equivalent qualification. In addition candidates for general agriculture (Section III 1), horticulture (Section III 2) or husbandry (Section III 3) posts should normally have had appropriate practical experience, and for posts at Experimental Husbandry Farms and Horticulture Stations experience in experimental technique is an advantage.

Applications will be entertained, exceptionally, from persons without formal qualifications, provided that they possess sufficient experience of practical farming or horticulture and, preferably, experience of advisory work. Where subjects are not covered by degree courses preference will be given to candidates with the best available academic or professional qualifications.

(b) Candidates for Grades A and B must normally possess either (1) a University degree in science or (2) the Higher School Certificate with mathematics or a science subject as a principal subject or (3) a General Certificate of Education with passes in five subjects at the levels shown in brackets:

(i) English Language (Ordinary),

(ii) Two mathematical or scientific subjects (Advanced),

(iii) Mathematics (Ordinary) if no mathematical subject is offered in (ii) except in the case of candidates who offer two biological subjects (Advanced) in (ii),

(iv) A scientific subject (Ordinary) if no scientific subject is offered in (ii),

(v) Balance of one or two subjects (Ordinary) at candidate's choice;

or (4) the Scottish Leaving Certificate with passes in five subjects one of which must be English. Three of the passes must be on the Higher Grade and two of these must be in mathematical or scientific subjects. (Passes at the Scottish Universities Preliminary Examination will be accepted as equivalent to passes in the Scottish Leaving Certificate.)
