WHEREAS Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts, 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 20th day of November, 1953, to delegate to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother, Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal and the Earl of Harewood, or any two or more of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval of anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 4th day of February, 1954, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint John the Evangelist, Littlewick, and Knowl Hill, both in the diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Kenneth, Bishop of Oxford, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint John the Evangelist, Littlewick, and Knowl Hill shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Littlewick:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Knowl Hill which lies to the east of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Knowl Hill from the parish of Shottesbrooke at the point in the middle of the southeastern end of the road or track which crosses close numbered 467 and leads to

Bartletts Farm and continuing thence first north-westwards and then northwards along the middle of the said road or track to a point on the wall or fence which forms the northern boundary of the close numbered 465, and continuing thence eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the southern end of the wall or fence which divides the close numbered 448 from the closes numbered 447 and 446 and continuing thence generally northwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of the Maidenhead to Reading road and continuing thence generally northeastwards along the middle of the road which leads from the Maidenhead to Reading road to Burchetts Green to the boundary which divides the parish of Knowl Hill from the parish of Hurley."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf ratify the said Scheme and order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Oxford.
