WHEREAS Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts, 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 20th day of November, 1953, to delegate to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother, Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal and the Earl of Harewood, or any two or more of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval of anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required: required:

And whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 29th day of April, 1954, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Spencer, Bishop of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Walgrave with Hannington and the benefice of Old (or Wold) both situate in the diocese of Peterborough.

" SCHEME.

- "1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Walgrave with Hannington and the benefice of Old (or Wold) shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Walgrave with Hannington and Wold', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.
- "2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Frank Lionel Craig-Kelly if he is then incumbent of the said benefices of Walgrave with Hannington and Old (or Wold) shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution,

licence or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an admission to the benefice of Old (or Wold).

- "3. Parsonage House. Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Walgrave with Hannington shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.
- "4. Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Old (or Wold) having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.
- "5. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery. The united benefice shall be in the Archdeaconry of Northampton and the Rural Deanery of Brixworth.

6. Diversion of Endowment Income

"(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with endowment income (calculated in accordance with the schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £700 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Peterborough.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £700 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be accordingly.

when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or docusequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

"SCHEDULE.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income of the united benefice shall without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation

"SCHEME.

"1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Crudwell and the benefice of Ashley shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Crudwell with Ashley' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"(a) If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the said benefice of Ashley shall be vacant the union shall forthwith take effect.

"(b) If upon that day the said benefice of Ashley shall be full the union shall take effect

Ashley shall be full the union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacation thereof.

"(c) In either of the said events the first incumbent of the united benefice shall, with his consent (testified by his signature to this Scheme), be the Reverend Douglas Frost Gentry, now incumbent of the benefice of Crudwell if he is at the relevant date incumbent of that benefice, or, if he is not then incumbent of that benefice, shall be his successor (if any) at that date therein. be his successor (if any) at that date therein.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a statutory district and eventual new

parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any conse-

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

. Constitution.

(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister, the area defined in the sub-joined Schedule

Minister, the area defined in the sub-joined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The district (or parish) of Saint Luke, Leagrave'.

"2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery:
"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Bedford and in the rural deanery of Luton.

"(a) All that part (coloured pink on the map) of the parish of Biscot which lies to the south west of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Biscot from the parish of All Saints, Luton at the point in the middle of the main line of the British Railways between London and Wellingborough where the last-mentioned boundary turns south westwards and continuing thence north westwards along the middle of the last-mentioned main line to the point at which it meets the boundary which divides the parish of Biscot from the parish of Sundon.

"(b) All that part (coloured green on the map) of the parish of Caddington which lies to the north of an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the Luton and Dunstable Branch of the British Railways where the boundary which divides the parish of Caddington from the parish of All Saints, Luton turns north and continuing thence westwards along the middle of the said Branch of the British Railways to a point opposite the middle of Skimpot Road and continuing thence northwards to and along the middle of the last-mentioned road to the boundary which divides the parish of Caddington from the parish of Houghton Regis.

"(c) All that part (coloured yellow on the map) of the parish of Toddington which is enclosed within an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the parish of Toddington from the parishes of Sundon and Biscot crosses the boundary when divides the parish of Luton and continuing thence along the last-mentioned boundary first northwestwards and then generally southwest-

continuing thence along the last-mentioned boundary continuing thence along the last-mentioned boundary first northwestwards and then generally southwestwards to the point in the middle of the un-named stream which forms the northern boundary of close No. 708 and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the last-mentioned stream and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the wall or fence which forms the northern boundary of close No. 702 and continuing thence southwestwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence to its end and in

continuation thereof along the wall or fence which forms the northwestern boundary of close No. 707 to the eastern boundary of close No. 704 and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the western boundary of the last-named close and continuing thence generally southwestwards for a distance of 10½ chains along the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of close No. 707 and thence in a straight line southeastwards crossing close No. 707 and 706 to a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Toddington and the parish of Biscot at the northern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between closes Nos. 89 and 90." in a straight line southeastwards crossing closes Nos.

Council the following Scheme which we have pre-pared with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Derby (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Ashbourne with Mapleton and the benefice of Clifton both situate in the diocese of Derby.

"SCHEME

"1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Ashbourne with Mapleton and the benefice of Clifton shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ashbourne with Mapleton and Clifton', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct. im all respects distinct.

"2. Taking effect of union. "(c) So much of the net proceeds of such sale as we, after consultation with the bishop for the time being of the diocese shall deem necessary shall be applied by us towards the cost of dividing the parsonage house as aforesaid and any balance of the said net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Derby established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"4. Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised wholly by the patrons of the benefice of Ashbourne with Mapleton.

"5. Clerical and lay assistance. After the union has taken effect the incumbent of the united benefice shall, in order to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, employ a curate or such other clerical or lay assistance as the bishop of the diocese shall from time to time direct.

"(6) Diversion of Endowment Income.

(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £591 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Derby.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £591 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when the deem that circumstances so require he apport

we deem that circumstances so require be appor-tionable accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt

due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in

"(4) the rates payable on the glebe,
"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,

"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,

(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe,

"(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,

"(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,

"(11) any pension paid to a retired incumbent out of the benefice income,

ROYAL WARRANT. THE POLAR MEDIAL.

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and of Her other Realms and Territories, Queen, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, to all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting!

WHEREAS a Medal for Arctic Discoveries was instituted by Our Royal predecessor, Her Majesty Queen Victoria, in 1857, and granted for service in specified expeditions in the period 1818 to 1855; and whereas Her Majesty subsequently instituted in 1876 a further Medal for Arctic exploration in the years 1875 and 1876; and whereas Polar Medals in silver and bronze were instituted by Our Royal Great-Grandfather, His Majesty King Edward VII, in 1904, and have been granted on various occasions since.

And Whereas We deem it expedient that the conditions for the award of the Polar Medal should be regularised and amended, in the light of present day circumstances and incorporated in a Warrant:

day circumstances and inconporated in a Warrant; Now Therefore We are pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances, which shall henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:—

Firstly: Style.—It is ordained that the Medal shall be styled and designated "The Polar Medal."

Secondly: Description.—The Medal shall be in silver and octagonal in shape, bearing on the obverse the Effigy of The Sovereign and on the reverse a representation of the ship Discovery in winter quarters with, in the foreground, a sledging party on skis.

Thirdly: Riband.—The Medal shall be worn on the left breast suspended from a white riband one inch and a quarter in width.

Fourthly: Eligibility.—The Medal shall be conferred on those who take an active part in an expedition which makes notable advances in the exploration of the Polar Regions and who, in so doing, undergo the hazards and rigours set by the climatic conditions to life and movement, whether by land, sea or air. Only those who have participated in an expedition which has been either the responsibility of one or more Governments of Member countries of the Commonwealth, or has been recognised by one or more of such Governments, shall be eligible. In the selection of those on whom it is proposed that the award shall be conferred due regard shall be granted as far as possible to all members of a team, not only in acknowledgement of individual service but also in recognition of the service of the team. The term "exploration" shall ordinarily be understood as including travel, but the notable acquisition of knowledge by means which do not depend upon travelling will also merit consideration. Exceptionally, an award may be made for a Polar achievement which did not require exploration or result in the advancement of knowledge; eligibility would then be restricted to those who took an active part in the furtherance of such an achievement and who also fulfilled the other qualifying conditions set out in this Our Warrant.

Fifthly: Service required.—The period of service, within the geographical limits shown below, requisite to qualify for the Medal shall be twelve months, exception being made to this rule in special circumstances only, when a shorter period, or periods of broken service, may be held to qualify.

Antarctic: South of Latitude 60° S.

Arctic: North of Latitude 67° N. (exclusive of land inhabited by Europeans) with, in addition, the East Coast of Greenland and the Baffin Island Area.

Sixthly: Clasps.—Every Polar (Medal to be awarded shall be accompanied by a Clasp to be worn on the riband of the Medal and bearing the appropriate description of the expedition and the date. When further service has been rendered by a holder of the Polar Medal, which under the terms of this Our Warrant would otherwise merit recognition by the award of the Medal, a second Clasp shall be awarded, and a further Clasp shall be granted in respect of each such additional period of service.

Seventhly: Posthumous awards.—Awards of the Medal with Clasp or, as appropriate, of the Clasp alone, may be made posthumously.

Eighthly: Withholding of award.—The iMedal or Clasp shall not be awarded when service which would otherwise be qualifying service has been marred by misconduct or neglect of duty.

Ninthly: Recommendations.—Awards shall be made only on a recommendation to Us by Our First Lord of the Admiralty or, in the case of any oversea Member country of the Commonwealth the Government whereof shall so desire, on a recommendation by the appropriate Minister of State for the said country, in respect of nationals of such country.

Tenthly: Foreign nationals.—Awards of the Medal with Clasp or, as appropriate, of the Clasp alone, may be made irrespective of nationality to members of a Commonwealth expedition, or to members of the Commonwealth part of a larger expedition organised jointly by two or more nations. A recommendation of a foreign person under this provision shall be made to Us, by Our First Lord of the Admiralty, or in the case of any oversea Member country of the Commonwealth the Government whereof shall desire to recommend a foreign person, on a recommendation by the appropriate Minister of State for the said country.

Eleventhly: Registration.—The names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer the Medal and Clasp, or the Clasp, on the recommendation of Our First Lord of the Admiralty, not being foreign subjects, shall be published in the London Gazette and a register thereof kept in Our Admiralty. The publication and registration of awards to citizens of other Member countries of the Commonwealth

shall be carried out by the Government concerned but the Admiralty shall be informed.

Twelfthly: Names of recipients.—The name of a recipient shall be engraved or stamped on the rim of the Medal.

Thirteenthly: Order of Wear.—In the official list showing the order in which Orders, Decorations and Medals shall be worn, the Polar Medal shall be placed after War Medals and before the Royal Victorian Medal.

Fourteenthly: Miniatures.—Reproductions ourteenthly: Miniatures.—Reproductions of the Medal and Clasp in miniature, which may be worn on certain occasions by those upon whom the Medal and Clasp have been conferred, shall be half the size of the Polar Medal and Clasp respectively, and a sealed pattern of the said miniature Medal and Clasp shall be deposited and kept in the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood.

Fifteenthly: Date of application.—The terms of this Our Warrant shall apply to all qualifying service rendered since 1st Uanuary, 1943, exception being made in relation to any awards already granted.

Sixteenthly: Forfeiture and Restoration.—It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on a recommendation to that effect by Our First Lord of the Admiralty, or in the case of any oversea Member country of Our Commonwealth, the Government whereof shall desire to submit such a recommendation, by the appropriate Minister of State for the said country, to cancel and annul the award to any person of the Medal and Clasp or Clasps, and that thereupon the name of such person in the Register shall be erased: provided that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors to restore petent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors to restore the Medal so forfeited when such recommendation has been withdrawn.

Seventeenthly: Regulations.—It is ordained that the Medal and Clasp or Clasps shall be conferred under such regulations as to grant, forfeiture, restoration, and other matters, in amplification of this Our Warrant as may, with Our approval signified through Our First Lord of the Admiralty, be issued from time to time by Our Board of Admiralty, or as may with Our approval be issued by the appropriate Minister of State in any oversea Member country of the Commonwealth Our Government whereof shall so desire.

Lastly:—We reserve to Ourself, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these rules and ordinances, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual.

THE POLAR MEDAL.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH THE AWARD OF THE POLAR MEDAL MAY BE MADE.

Made under the terms of the Royal Warrant by the First Lord of the Admiralty, with the concurrence of the Governments of other Member countries of the Commonwealth, which desire to be in a position to make recommendations, and approved by The Queen.

In amplification of the basic principles set out in the Fourth Clause of the Royal Warrant, the following examples are furnished for guidance:

(a) On land.

The members of parties which explore or acquire notable knowledge would be eligible. When a well-established site is manned for routine observations eligibility will be restricted to those based there who extend exploratory work in the field, although they may not travel extensively.

(b) At sea.

Crews of ships which carry out extensive cruises of exploration in severe conditions which may or may not have required wintering in the ice would be eligible.

(c) Aircraft.

Air crews, when they are based in the area and make flights of exploration, would be

as would also the ground crews similarly based in the area) concerned in these flights. Exception may be made in favour of aircrews carrying out extensive exploratory flights which include landings within the qualifying area, although the base is outside it. A ground crew working from a well-established city would not be clicible. site would not be eligible.

(ii) Recommendations.

In amplification of the Fourth and Ninth Clauses In amplification of the Fourth and Ninth Clauses of the Royal Warrant it may be stated that when an expedition has not been the responsibility of one or more Governments of Member countries of the Commonwealth, it would be appropriate for recommendations to the appropriate Commonwealth Government to be made by learned Societies or distinguished individuals who have examined the results, or have first-hand knowledge of the expedition's or have first-hand knowledge of the expedition's labours. A description of the expedition's achievements should be given together with the list of those persons who are recommended for award.

In relation to expeditions for which the United Kingdom Government are responsible, recommenda-tions should be put before the Admiralty, that is to say, the Department making submissions to the Sovereign, by and only by, the United Kingdom Government Department responsible for the

expedition.

When recommendations are made the names of persons otherwise qualified who, on account of misconduct or neglect of duty, are considered to merit disqualification, should be listed separately and the reasons given.
