"And whereas we are of opinion that these rates of half pay require revision:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council to sanction, with effect from the 1st day of April, 1954, the payment of half pay at rates based on half the rates of full pay, marriage allowance and flying pay in issue to the officer on the day before commencement of half pay subject to the provision that where the officer is holding acting higher or temporary rank the half pay rate is to be based on the rates appropriate to his substantive rank:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*,

that all pay, pensions and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by the Pensions (Increase) Acts, 1920, 1924, 1944, 1947 and 1952, provision is made subject to certain conditions and restrictions, for the increase of certain civil pensions payable in respect of public service:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 13th August, 1920, 8th December, 1924, 28th September, 1944, 24th January, 1945, 20th March, 1946, 2nd April, 1947, and 4th September, 1952, provision is made for the increase of certain Naval pensions and other awards, including awards administered by the Ministry of Pensions, to correspond as nearly as may be, with the benefits provided by the aforementioned Pensions (Increase) Acts:

"And whereas we now deem it expedient to make further provision for the increase of such awards to correspond, as nearly as may be, with the benefits provided, in the case of certain civil pensions, by the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1954:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the provision set out in the Schedule annexed hereto with effect from the 1st April, 1954.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

"1. The following amendment shall be made to the Second Schedule to Order in Council of 28th September, 1944, as amended by Order in Council of 2nd April, 1947:—

"For Paragraph 2 substitute:—

'Such awards, excluding any increase admissible under the First Schedule hereto, may be increased by 10 per cent.

This increase shall be given without regard to the income or other circumstances of the pensioner, but where an increase of the award is admissible under the provisions of the First Schedule, the amount of the latter increase shall be limited to the excess, if any, over the increase authorised by this paragraph.'

"2. Any pension increased or further increased under the provisions of this Order shall, as so increased, be regarded, for the purposes of Order in Council of 4th September, 1952, as if assessed under the regulations in force before the 1st September, 1950.

"3. In relation to an award which is, or would but for paragraph 1 of this Order be, increased by virtue of the foregoing provisions, paragraph 3 of Schedule III of the said Order in Council of 28th September, 1944 (under which an increase under that Order is reduced or excluded where the amount

of a pension has been increased by reason of an addition by way of war bonus or similar allowance to the emoluments of any office or employment in respect of which or on retirement from which the pension is payable) shall have effect as if the references therein to such an addition included any excess of the said emoluments over what they were on the third day of September, nineteen hundred and thirty-nine, or what in the opinion of the Admiralty they would have been on that day had the office or employment then existed: so, however, that no pension shall by virtue of this paragraph be less than it would have been if this Order had not been introduced."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Winchester (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Awbridge and the benefice of Mottisfont, both situate in the diocese of Winchester.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Awbridge and the benefice of Mottisfont shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Awbridge with Mottisfont', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Leslie Roose Francis, if he is then the incumbent of the said benefice of Awbridge, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Awbridge shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Mottisfont and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith (but excepting the tithe barn) shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Winchester established pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Mottisfont having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. *Clerical or lay assistance.* Upon the union taking effect the incumbent shall employ such clerical or lay assistance to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice as the bishop of the said diocese of Winchester may from time to time direct, and there shall be appropriated as a fund towards the cost of providing such assistance as aforesaid a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £40, being part of a larger capital sum at present held by us for the endowment of the benefice of Mottisfont, and the said annual income shall be paid by us to the diocesan

board of finance of the said diocese of Winchester as trustees to apply the same accordingly."

And Whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"3. *Parish Church.* The parish church of the parish of Saint Gabriel, Bristol, shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"4. *Registers.* The marriage registers current at the church of Saint Lawrence, Bristol, shall be dealt with in accordance with section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of Saint Gabriel, Bristol.

"5. *Parsonage House.* The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Bristol, Saint Gabriel, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Bristol, Saint Lawrence, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, so soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied in accordance with the provisions of clause 7 (b) hereof.

"6. *Patronage.* The right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patrons of the benefice of Bristol, Saint Lawrence, having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"7. *Church of Saint Lawrence, Bristol.*

"(a) So soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the church of Saint Lawrence, Bristol, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof, shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restriction, imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"(b) The net proceeds to arise from such sale together with the net proceeds to arise from the sale of the parsonage house referred to in clause 5 hereof shall be applied by us, the said Church Commissioners, as follows, that is to say:—

so much thereof as after consultation with the Bishop of Bristol we shall deem sufficient shall be applied to the repair and improvement of the parsonage house of the united benefice and the balance shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Bristol established pursuant to the 32nd section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"(c) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said church of Saint Lawrence, Bristol, shall not be sold, but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures and as the Bishop of the diocese may direct be transferred to the church of Saint Gabriel, Bristol, being the parish church of the united benefice or to some other church or churches within the said diocese and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint Lawrence, Bristol, or such of them as the Bishop shall select, shall be removed to the parish church of the united benefice or to

any other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the Bishop may direct or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said church of Saint Lawrence, Bristol, as aforesaid.

"8. *Alteration of Boundaries.* With the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Reverend Frederick John Barff being the incumbent of the benefice of Bristol, Holy Trinity, in the said diocese of Bristol all that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Lawrence, Bristol, which lies to the south of the middle of Lawrence Hill shall, upon the union taking effect, be severed from that parish and from the parish of the united benefice and be annexed to the parish of Holy Trinity, Bristol.

"9. *Diversion of Endowments.* With the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the said Frederick John Barff being the patron of the benefice of Bristol, Saint Gabriel, a part of the endowments of the united benefice namely an annual sum of £86 being part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us, the said Church Commissioners, to the benefice of Bristol, Saint Gabriel shall, upon the union taking effect, be severed or diverted from the said benefice and from the united benefice and shall be appropriated to the augmentation of the benefice of Bristol, Holy Trinity."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

"(b) The net proceeds to arise from such sale together with the net proceeds to arise from the sale of the parsonage house referred to in clause 5 hereof shall be applied by us, the said Church Commissioners, as follows, that is to say:—

a capital sum sufficient to produce £51 per annum shall be appropriated and held by us, the said Church Commissioners, for the augmentation of the benefice of Bristol, Holy Trinity, in the said diocese of Bristol, and the balance shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Bristol established pursuant to the 32nd section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"(c) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in Christ Church, Barton Hill, shall not be sold, but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures and as the Bishop of the diocese may direct be transferred to the church of Saint Luke, Barton Hill, being the parish church of the united parish or to some other church or churches within the said diocese and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of Christ Church, Barton Hill, or such of them as the Bishop shall select, shall be removed to the parish church of the united parish or to any other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the Bishop may direct or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of Christ Church, Barton Hill, as aforesaid.

conduct by some mark of His Royal Favour did by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual dated the 7th July, 1909, institute a new Medal to be awarded for such services as aforesaid :

AND WHEREAS We are desirous of having separate Medals for members of police forces and for members of fire services We are graciously pleased to make, ordain, and establish the following Statutes for the governance of the Decoration to be awarded to members of police forces :

“Firstly—It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated and styled ‘The Queen’s Police Medal’.

Secondly—It is ordained that the Medal shall consist of a circular Medal of Silver with the effigy of the Sovereign on the obverse, and shall bear on the reverse a design emblematic of protection from danger and the words ‘For Gallantry’ or ‘For Distinguished Police Service’ as the case may be, and on the rim the name of the person to whom the Medal has been awarded.

Thirdly—It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded only to those of Our Faithful Subjects and Others who have either performed acts of exceptional courage and skill at the cost of their lives, or exhibited conspicuous devotion to duty, as members of a recognised police force within Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Our Channel Islands, Our Island of Man, any of Our Colonies or any territory under Our protection or jurisdiction not being administered by Us in Our Government in any other part of Our Commonwealth, or within any other part of Our Commonwealth Our Government whereof has signified its desire that the Medal should be awarded under the provisions of this Our Warrant to members of any such force within such part, or within any territory under Our protection or jurisdiction being administered by Us in such Government, or as members of a British civil police force established outside the United Kingdom under the authority of the Police (Overseas Service) Act, 1945; and that such award shall be made only on a recommendation to Us by Our Secretary of State for the Home Department, or, in the case of a Member country of Our Commonwealth other than Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the Government whereof shall so desire, by the appropriate Minister of State for that country.

Fourthly—It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer this Decoration shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register thereof shall be kept in the Office of Our Secretary of State for the Home Department, or, in the case of a Member country of Our Commonwealth other than Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the Government whereof shall so desire, of the appropriate Minister of State for that country. Such Register shall show the name and rank of the person holding the Medal, the police force of which

that person is or was a member and the circumstances in which the Medal has been awarded.

Fifthly—It is ordained that the Medal shall be suspended from the left breast, and the riband, of an inch and three eighths in width, shall be dark blue with a narrow silver stripe on either side and a similar silver stripe in the middle ; and in the case of awards for acts of exceptional courage each silver stripe of the riband shall contain a thin red line down the middle.

Sixthly—It is ordained that any act of gallantry worthy of recognition by the award of The Queen’s Police Medal which is performed by one upon whom the Decoration or either of its predecessors (namely The King’s Police Medal and The King’s Police and Fire Services Medal) has already been conferred may, on a recommendation to Us by Our Secretary of State for the Home Department, or, in the case of a Member country of Our Commonwealth other than Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the Government whereof shall so desire, the appropriate Minister of State for that country, be recorded by a Bar attached to the riband by which the Medal is suspended.

Seventhly—It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors by an Order under Our Sign Manual, and on a recommendation to that effect by Our Secretary of State for the Home Department, or, in the case of a Member country of Our Commonwealth other than Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the Government whereof shall so desire, the appropriate Minister of State for that country, to cancel and annul the award to any person of the above Decoration or either of its predecessors and that thereupon the name of that person in the Register shall be erased. AND WHEREAS We are desirous of having separate Medals for members of fire services and for members of police forces We are graciously pleased to make, ordain, and establish the following Statutes for the governance of the Decoration to be awarded to members of fire services :

*“Firstly—*It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated and styled ‘The Queen's Fire Service Medal’.

*Secondly—*It is ordained that the Medal shall consist of a circular Medal of Silver with the effigy of the Sovereign on the obverse, and shall bear on the reverse a design emblematic of protection from danger and the words ‘For Gallantry’ or ‘For Distinguished Fire Service’ as the case may be, and on the rim the name of the person to whom the Medal has been awarded.

*Thirdly—*It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded only to those of Our Faithful Subjects and Others who have either performed acts of exceptional courage and skill at the cost of their lives, or exhibited conspicuous devotion to duty, as members of a recognised fire brigade or service within Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Our Channel Islands, Our Island of Man, any of Our Colonies or any territory under Our protection or jurisdiction not being administered by Us in Our Government in any other part of Our Commonwealth, or within any other part of Our Commonwealth Our Government whereof has signified its desire that the Medal should be awarded under the provisions of this Our Warrant to members of any such brigade or service within such part, or within any territory under Our protection or jurisdiction being administered by Us in such Government ; and that such award shall be made only on a recommendation to Us by Our Secretary of State for the Home Department, or, in the case of a Member country

of Our Commonwealth other than Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the Government whereof shall so desire, by the appropriate Minister of State for that country.

*Fourthly—*It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer this Decoration shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register thereof shall be kept in the Office of Our Secretary of State for the Home Department, or, in the case of a Member country of Our Commonwealth other than Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the Government whereof shall so desire, of the appropriate Minister of State for that country. Such Register shall show the name and rank of the person holding the Medal, the brigade or service of which that person is or was a member and the circumstances in which the Medal has been awarded.

*Fifthly—*It is ordained that the Medal shall be suspended from the left breast, and the riband, of an inch and three eighths in width, shall be red with a narrow yellow stripe on either side and a similar yellow stripe in the middle ; and in the case of awards for acts of exceptional courage each yellow stripe of the riband shall contain a thin dark blue line down the middle.

*Sixthly—*It is ordained that any act of gallantry worthy of recognition by the award of The Queen's Fire Service Medal which is performed by one upon whom the Decoration or either of its predecessors (namely The King's Police Medal and The King's Police and Fire Services Medal) has already been conferred may, on a recommendation to Us by Our Secretary of State for the Home Department, or, in the case of a Member country of Our Commonwealth other than Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the Government whereof shall so desire, the appropriate Minister of State for that country, be recorded by a Bar attached to the riband by which the Medal is suspended.

*Seventhly—*It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors by an Order under Our Sign Manual, and on a recommendation to that effect by Our Secretary of State for the Home Department, or, in the case of a Member country of Our Commonwealth other than Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the Government whereof shall so desire, the appropriate Minister of State for that country, to cancel and annul the award to any person of the above Decoration or either of its predecessors and that thereupon the name of that person in the Register shall be erased. Provided that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors to restore any Decoration which may have been so forfeited when such recommendation has been withdrawn. And every person to whom the Decoration is awarded for distinguished service shall, before receiving the same, enter into an agreement to return the Medal if his or her name shall be erased as aforesaid.

*Eighthly—*It is ordained that Our Secretary of State for the Home Department, or,

in the case of a Member country of Our Commonwealth other than Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the Government whereof shall so desire, the appropriate Minister of State for that country, may make Regulations for the carrying into effect of this Our Royal Warrant."

All previous Warrants issued in this behalf are hereby revoked except in so far as they are already revoked.

VISITING FORCES ACT, 1952.

STATEMENT ISSUED BY THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 9 (2) OF THE ACT.

The nature and operation of the arrangements made by the Minister of Defence under section 9 of the Visiting Forces Act, 1952, with regard to the settlement of claims against members of a Visiting Force to which the Act applies or is made to apply, are as follows:—

2. The claims to which the arrangements relate are:—

(a) Claims arising out of tortious acts committed on land in the United Kingdom by any member of a Visiting Force or its civilian component including claims arising out of accidents caused in the United Kingdom by aircraft owned or controlled by a Visiting Force;

(b) Claims (hereinafter called maritime claims) in respect of death or personal injury caused by tortious acts arising out of or in connection with the navigation or operation within the United Kingdom or the territorial waters thereof of a ship engaged for the purposes of a Visiting Force present in this Country and owned by or at the risk of a Country to which that Visiting Force belongs including claims in connection with the loading, carriage or discharge of the cargo from any such ship in the United Kingdom.

3. The arrangements will apply to claims arising out of acts committed on or after the 12th day of June, 1954.

4. Claimants must address their claims as follows:—

(a) Maritime claims should be addressed to:

The Secretary of the Admiralty, Naval Law Branch, Queen Anne's Mansions, London, S.W.1.

(b) Claims arising out of accidents involving aircraft owned or controlled by a Visiting Force should be addressed to:

The Under Secretary of State, Air Ministry F7(d), Metropole Buildings, Northumberland Avenue, London, W.C.2.

(c) All other claims arising out of tortious acts of any member of a Visiting Force or its civilian component should be addressed to:

The Secretary, Claims Commission, War Office, Nuffield House, Piccadilly, London, W.1.

5. If the alleged tortious act complained of was committed during the performance of an official duty, the claim will be dealt with in the same manner as it would have been if such tortious act had been committed by a member of the British Armed Forces. If a settlement of the claim is

reached by negotiation any sum due under that settlement will be paid. If, however, a settlement of the claim cannot be reached by negotiation it is open to the claimant to bring proceedings in the British Courts in respect of his claim against the individual wrongdoer concerned and any sum due under any judgment of the Court obtained by the claimant will be paid to him (provided notice of the intention to start proceedings against the wrongdoer has been given to authorities referred to in paragraph 4) except that in the case of maritime claims there will be paid only so much of the amount of the judgment as the Crown would be liable to pay if it were able to limit its liability under the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1940 as applied by section 5 of the Crown Proceedings Act, 1947.

6. If on investigation of a claim it is ascertained that the act complained of was not committed during the performance of an official duty, no responsibility for settlement will be accepted by the Minister of Defence. The claim will, however, be investigated by the appropriate United Kingdom authority and a report prepared and submitted to the appropriate authority of the Visiting Force concerned so that the latter may consider whether or not an ex gratia payment might be made to the claimant direct by the particular Force concerned. A claimant, if he so desires, may institute proceedings against the individual concerned in respect of any act outside the scope of an official duty, but responsibility for satisfying a judgment obtained in these circumstances will not be accepted by the Minister of Defence.

7. If a dispute arises whether a tortious act of a member of a Visiting Force or civilian component was done in the performance of official duty the question may be submitted to a legal Arbitrator whose decision will be binding and conclusive upon all the parties concerned. The same course will be followed where a claimant is unable to identify the wrongdoer.
