WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of May, 1954, in the words and figures following, that is to say:— "We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme (1) for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Paul, South Harrow, Christ Church, Roxeth, Saint Andrew, Sudbury, Greenford, and Northolt and (2) for con-stituting a separate district and eventual parish to be taken out of the parishes of Saint Andrew, Sudbury, Greenford, and Northolt, all of which parishes are in the diocese of London.

" SCHEME.

"Whereas (we, the Khurch Commissioners, are satisfied (1) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Paul, South Harrow, Christ Church, Roxeth, Saint Andrew, Sudbury, Greenford and Northolt should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and as delivered on the man bareto anney of the delivered on the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and as delineated on the map hereto annexed; and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map would be best served by constituting it a separate district and eventual parish and that a suitable endow-ment therefor will be provided: "And whereas we have not approved any con-secrated church within the area described in Part II of the said Schedule as guitable to be the parish

of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish: "Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right

Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recom-mend and propose as follows, that is to say:— "1. As from the day of the date of the publica-tion in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Paul, South Harrow, Christ Church, Roxeth, Saint Andrew, Sudbury, Greenford, and Northolt shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the said Schedule and as delineated on the said map.

map. "2. (a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map shall

(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or, if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish. "(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Parachae, Northelt Park'.

(d) The district (or parish) shall be in the

"(a) Territory to be annexed to the parish of Northolt:

Northoli:— "All that part (coloured blue on the map) of the parish of Saint Paul, South Harrow, which lies to the south of the middle of the railway line of British Railways which passes through the railway stations known as Sudbury (Hill Harrow and South Ruislip (hereinafter called 'the said railway line of British Pailways ') Railways').

"(b) Territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Paul, South Harrow :---

"All that part (coloured green on the map) of the parish of Northolt which lies to the north of the middle of the said railway line of British Railways and to the west of the middle of the Piccadilly railway line of the London Transport Executive.
