And whereas by an Order in Council of the 13th April, 1954, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 31st day of May next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. No new burial ground shall be opened in the said Urban District of Woodhall Spa save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:-

Woodhall Spa.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church and Churchyard of St. Andrew Langton in the said Urban District:

Provided that—

In such spaces as are already reserved the burial may be allowed at their decease of the bodies of Eliza Dixon Street, Isabella L. Goose, Joseph Hudson, Rose Ann Goodyear and Susanna Lunn.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas, Bishop of Carlisle (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Skelsmergh, and the benefice of Selside both situate in the diocese of Carlisle.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Skelsmergh, and the benefice of Selside shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Skelsmergh with Selside', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Basil Cautley Robinson, if he is then incumbent of both of the said benefices, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Steeple Bumpstead and the benefice of Helions Bumpstead shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Steeple Bumpstead and Helions Bumpstead', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Eric Henry Wheeler if he is then incumbent of both of the said benefices of Steeple Bumpstead and Helions Bumpstead shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form of, or fee for, presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Steeple Bumpstead shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* Upon the union taking effect and with the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the Right Reverend Falkner, Bishop of Chelmsford, being the patron of the benefice of Helions Bumpstead and with the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Right Honourable Gavin Turnbull, Baron Simonds, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as patron of the said benefice of Steeple Bumpstead, the patronage of the said benefice of Helions Bumpstead shall be surrendered in favour of Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and the patronage of the united benefice shall belong wholly to Your Majesty and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the said Gavin Turnbull, Baron Simonds, or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Luckington and the benefice of Alderton shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Luckington with Alderton' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Herbert Foulkes Farr, if he is then the incumbent of the said benefice of Luckington shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage house.* Upon the union taking effect (a) the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Luckington shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice (b) the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Alderton and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and (c) so much of the net proceeds of such sale or sales as we, after consultation with the bishop for the time being of the said diocese, shall deem sufficient shall be applied by us either towards the cost of works to be carried out to the parsonage house of the united benefice or towards the provision of a new parsonage house therefor in accordance with plans to be approved by us, and the balance (if any) of the said net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Bristol established pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the said benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Alderton having the first turn of presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Fund Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent (in witness whereof he has signed the scheme) of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Geoffrey, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting in the vacancy of the See of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich, for effecting the union of the benefice of Chedburgh

with Depden and the benefice of Rede both situate in the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Chedburgh with Depden and the benefice of Rede shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Chedburgh with Depden and Rede', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. *Parsonage house.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Chedburgh with Depden shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and as soon as conveniently may be the parsonage house at present belonging to the said benefice of Rede and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich established pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect in every four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice the alternate patron of the benefice of Chedburgh with Depden who is also patron of the benefice of Rede shall have the first, third and fourth turns, and the other patron of the benefice of Chedburgh with Depden shall have the second turn.

"5. *Diversion of Endowment Income.*

"(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £680 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £680 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

"SCHEDULE.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income of the united benefice shall without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:—

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us and any other person or body, and

"(2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof,

"and by deducting therefrom:—

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent,

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

"(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,

"(4) the rates payable on the glebe,

"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,

"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,

"(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe,

"(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,

"(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,

"(11) any pension paid to a retired incumbent out of the benefice income,

"(12) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Saint Marychurch, Kingskerswell, and Tormoham, in the diocese of Exeter.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution.*

"(a) As from the day of the date of the licence thereto of a minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area, approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint John the Baptist, Shiphay Collaton'.

"2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.

"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Totnes and in the rural deanery of Ipplepen.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—
