## "THE SCHEDULE,

"A. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Studland:-

"All that "All that part of the parish of Swanage (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the north of an imaginary line commencing lies to the north of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Swanage from the parish of Langton 'Matravers at a distance of approximately 14 chains from the north-eastern corner of close num-bered 6 (on the map) in the middle of a footpath or track leading from Nine Barrow Down to Round Down and continuing thence first southeast-wards then northeastwards along the middle of the said footpath or track to the boundary which divides the parish of Swanage from the parish of Studland. of Studland.

"B. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Swanage:-

"(1) All that part of the parish of Langton Matravers (coloured green on the map) which lies to the east of the boundary of the Urban District of Swanage.

"(2) All that part of the parish of Studiand (coloured yellow on the map) which lies to the south of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Stud-land from the parish of Swanage where the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of close numbered 569 (on the map) is intersected by the boundary of the Urban District of Swanage close numbered 569 (on the map) is intersected by the boundary of the Urban District of Swanage and continuing thence generally in a northwesterly direction along the said Urban District boundary (thereby following the northeastern side of the road leading from Swanage to Corfe Castle) to the boundary which divides the parish of Studland from the parish of Swanage."
