Whereas by section 65 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932 (22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 9), it is enacted that Her Majesty, if satisfied that the government of any country has acceded to the Load Line Convention, may, by Order in Council, make a declaration to that effect:

prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Wallsend; Saint Luke, Wallsend; and Long Benton, in the diocese of Newcastle.

## "SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Noel, Bishop of Newcastle (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Constitution:

"(a) As from the day of the date of the licence thereto of a Minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual pumposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of Church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint John, Wallsend.'

"2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery:
"The district (or parish) shall be in the Archdeaconry of Northumberland and in the rural deanery of Tynemouth.

"All those contiguous parts (shown by the blue, green and pink colours respectively on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Wallsend; Saint Luke, Wallsend; and Long Benton which taken together are bounded on the east by the parish of Willington, on part of the north by the parish of Killingworth, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point (in the neighbourhood of the Old Coal Shaft) on the boundary which divides the parish of Killingworth from the parish of Long Benton where the present Wallsend Urban District Boundary leaves the said boundary in a southwesterly direction and extending thence first generally southwestwards and then generally westwards and then generally southwards along the wards and then generally southwards along the said Urban District Boundary to the boundary which divides the parish of Long Benton from the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and continuing thence first southeastwards and then southwards along the last-mentioned and then southwards along the last-mentioned boundary to the boundary which divides the parish of Long Benton from the parish of Walker and continuing thence first southeastwards and then generally northeastwards along the last-mentioned boundary and the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Luke, Wallsend, from the parish of Walker to the point where it diverges southwards from the brook or stream known as Wallsend Burn and continuing thence generally northeastwards along the middle of Wallsend Burn wards along the middle of Wallsend Burn (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Luke, Wallsend, from the parish of Wallsend) to its junction with an unnamed brook or stream in the neighbourhood of Wallsend Viaduct and continuing thence generally northeastwards (passing to the west of the ruins of Holy Cross Church) first to and then along the middle of the said unnamed brook or stream to the boundary which divides the parish of Wallsend from the parish of Willington."

### D'ANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1951.

SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATION. (Arthur Crowley.)

Whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulations 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, the Authorisations conferred by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, on duly qualified medical practitioners to

be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which these Regulations apply, was by Notice published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 5th January, 1951, withdrawn from Arthur Crowley, L.A.H. REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF ASSISTANT KEEPERS IN THE PUBLIC RECORD OFFICE.

1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 22 and under 26 years of age on 1st January, 1954. But

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st January, 1954;

(b) a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular engagement may

otherwise than on a regular engagement may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st January, 1954, up to a maximum of two years.

2. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose

husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years

3. Nationality.
Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—
(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must

either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or
(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the

last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight

years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Qualifications.
Candidates must normally have a University degree with First or Second Class Honours in Classics, Law, or History; but candidates otherwise exceptionally well qualified academically may be considered. All candidates must have a good knowledge of Latin and French.

5. Health and Character.
Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

The candidates who appear from their applications and the results of any necessary enquiries to have the best qualifications and experience will be invited to interview in London before a Selection Board, which will recommend to the Civil Service Commissioners the candidate considered most suitable for appointment. The Commissioners' decision will be final.

Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland), has been notified to the Commissioners.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.
