WEST BRIDGFORD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

West Bridgford (Riverside Footpath) Diversion Order, 1954.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 6th day of July, 1954, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Lutterell Ward of the Urban District.

The effect of the Order will be:—

1. To extinguish the public right-of-way in an existing footpath five feet wide commencing from its junction with a public footpath along the south bank of the River Trent at a point 184 yards or thereabouts east of a Railway Bridge (No. 291) and extending in a south-westerly direction across Fields Nos. 31 and 52 on the map of the Ordnance Survey (1914 Edition) Nottinghamshire Sheet XLIII.10 for a distance of 215 yards or thereabouts via a stile which said existing footpath is shown coloured red on the map attached to the Order and which stile is marked X on that map, and

2. To create a new public right-of-way on foot in a footpath six feet wide commencing from a point on the public footpath on the south bank of the River Trent 24 yards or thereabouts east of a Railway Bridge (No. 291) and extending in a southerly direction through Field No. 31 on the map of the Ordnance Survey (1914 Edition) Nottinghamshire Sheet XLIII.10 for a distance of 150 yards or thereabouts via a stile which said new footpath is shown coloured blue on the map attached to the Order and which stile will be erected at the point marked Y on that map.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at The Hall, West Bridgford, Nottingham, and will be open for inspection, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2.15 p.m. and 5.30 p.m. on each weekday, except Saturday, when the hours are between 9 a.m. and 12.30 p.m., and also in the Porch of the Church of St. Wilfred, South Wilford, Nottingham.

Any objection or representation with reference to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 11th day of August, 1954, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.
