The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT TO BASIC GRADES OF QUANTITY SURVEYORS.

Candidates must be at least 25 and under 35 years of age on 1st January, 1954. But

(1) a candidate who has served or is serving on

(1) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st January, 1954;

(2) candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceed-ing two years which they have spent in such service before 1st January, 1954.

2. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations, except that women will not be eligible for appointments under the Admiralty, War

Office or Air Ministry.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must

either

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at

death, a British subject; or (ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight

years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour. favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment under the Admiralty, War Office or Air Ministry unless he or she is a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted to appointment or competition by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty, Secretary of State for War, or Secretary of State for Air, as the case may be.

4. Qualification.

(b) have passed the examinations necessary for obtaining Corporate Membership in that section.

All candidates will be expected to possess wide professional experience in private or outside practice or in the service of a Local Authority or Government

Only one application may be made under these Regulations. Application must be made on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given by the Commissioners.

7. Competition.

Those candidates who on the evidence of the application forms, and any further information which application forms, and any further information which the Commissioners think necessary to obtain, are found to be prima facie eligible, will be summoned to a Selection Board. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, summon only those candidates who by reason of their experience and qualifications appear to be most suitable for appointment. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and training, any recommendation from person named by the candidates as having tion from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimate of all the above facts they will frame their recommendations. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

8. Candidates trained as Teachers.

8. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners. to the Commissioners.

9. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. Assignment will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

10. Canvassing,

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their application through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £4 before the issue of a Certificate of Qualification for appointment.

(ii) In addition candidates must produce evidence that both the examination subjects included in their qualifications (see Regulation 4A (i) (a) and (b)) and their practical experience are appropriate to the particular requirements specified below.

Candidates for mechanical posts must have completed a recognised course of theoretical training in mechanical and automobile engineering and have had experience of road vehicle design and construction. For electrical posts they must be experienced in the recognised construction of executions and in investigating the preparation of specifications and in investigating the performance of electrical equipment and must have a knowledge of testing in relation to electrical

War Department.

War Department.
Candidates must possess at least the minimum qualifications prescribed in Regulation 4A (i) in either mechanical or electrical engineering.

They must have served an apprenticeship of two years or have engaged in work acceptable as the equivalent with recognised engineering bodies. In addition to having specialised and practical knowledge of a particular branch of engineering, candidates must have a basic all nound knowledge of both mechanical and electrical engineering.

Ministry of Works.

Candidates will be required to furnish evidence of their apprenticeship and subsequent experience which should have afforded a good general training in mechanical or electrical engineering, capable of subsequent development to cover a wide field of responsibility.

Some experience in, or training relating to at least one, of the following branches will be essential:—

Design and execution of engineering installations for office buildings, factories or hospitals, including heating, ventilation, air conditioning, electric wiring, illumination and lifts.

Design and installation of mechanical plant such

as steam boilers, pressure vessels, pumps, water treatment, refrigeration, chemical processes, air compressors and air, hydraulic or steam pipelines, I.C. engines.

Design and installation of electrical plant such as transformers, switchgear, H.T. and L.T. overhead and undenground distribution, D.C. and A.C. motors and generators and rectifiers.

Management of operation and maintenance of engineering plant in large office buildings, factories or institutions.

(B) The Departmental Variants.

(a) Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation (Civil Aviation Organisation).

Candidates must:

(i) be Corporate Members of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, or be Associate Fellows of the Royal Aeronautical Society; or

(ii) have passed Sections A and B of the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, or hold an educational qualification recognised by that Institution as giving exemption from examination in those Sections; but candidates admitted under this sub-section cannot be confirmed in their appointment unless they obtain the qualification in sub-section (i) above within their probation period. (Exception may be made in special circumstances provided for in

Regulation 4A (i)); or

(iii) hold a first or second class Honours degree
in Physics or Engineering
provided that the Commissioners may at their discretion admit, exceptionally, candidates who furnish evidence of high professional attainment.

In addition all candidates must produce evidence that both the examination subjects included in their qualifications and their practical experience justify their employment on civil aviation telecommunications duties.

(b) Post Office.

Candidates must normally possess an Honours degree in Mechanical or Electrical Engineering or Physics, but exceptionally the Commissioners may accept any other candidate qualified under Regulation

(c) Ministry of Supply.

The paper qualifications required are the same as for the General Service competition (see Regulation 4A (i) (a), (b) and (c)), except that Associate Fellowship of the Royal Aeronautical Society will be accepted as an alternative to Comporate Membership of one of the Institutions named in Regulation 4A (i) (a), and, similarly, equivalent qualification to Sections A and B of the Society's examination for Associate Fellowship will be accepted as an alternative to the qualifications in Regulation 4A (i) (b).
