The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz. :—

RECRUITMENT FROM UNIVERSITY GRADUATES FOR APPOINTMENT TO (a) THE EXECUTIVE CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE AND (b) GRADE 5 POSTS IN BRANCH B OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.

1. No candidate may compete more than twice in the annual competitions for recruitment to the Executive Classes from University graduates.

2. *Age.*

Candidates must be at least 20½ and under 24 years of age on the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held. But a candidate who has served or is serving in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held.

3. *Sex*

Both men and women are eligible, but women will not ordinarily be appointed to posts in the Admiralty or War Office or to the Immigration Service of the Home Office.

4. *Marriage*

(a) Married women are not eligible for appointment to Branch B of the Foreign Service; a woman member of Branch B must resign her appointment on marriage.

(b) The approval of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs is required before a successful male candidate who is married takes up a Foreign Service appointment.

5. *Nationality.*

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

For the Foreign Service every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, and have been born within the United Kingdom or one of the self-governing Dominions, of parents both of whom were also born within the United Kingdom or one of the self-governing Dominions.

No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and then only in exceptional cases, and in favour of candidates who satisfy the conditions laid down above for the Home Civil Service.

6. *Education.*

Candidates must either (a) have obtained a degree at a recognised university, or (b) be in the last year of a course for a degree at a recognised university. In the latter case, they will not be appointed (if

declared successful) unless they produce evidence, not later than 1st September of the year in which they compete, that they have obtained their degree.

7. *Health and Character.*

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

8. *Examination.*

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination in

(a) three compulsory subjects, namely Essay, English, and Present Day, for each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted, and

(b) a selection from the optional subjects set out in the Appendix. Subject to the provisions in the Appendix, candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 500 marks. (The marks awarded on these optional subjects will be adjusted to a maximum of 700 marks, making 1,000 marks in all for the written examination.)

(B) An interview before the Final Interview Board, which will award a mark out of a maximum of 300 for the candidate's record, intelligence, and personal qualities.

(ii) The final order of merit will be determined by the total marks gained in the whole examination: In the event of a tie between two or more candidates the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful.

9. *Candidates Trained as Teachers.*

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

10. *Assignment.*

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

In order to be eligible for assignment to Branch B of the Foreign Service candidates will be required to satisfy the Final Interview Board that they have the ability to learn languages.

2. Candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 500 marks. A candidate who wishes to offer subjects the aggregate value of which exceeds 500 marks must name a subject to be marked on a reduced maximum in order to bring the aggregate to 500. This option cannot be exercised by a candidate who can reduce his aggregate to 500 by omitting one or more of the subjects he proposes to offer.

(d) Candidates may not offer more than two of the three periods of English Literature (63-65).

(e) Greek Literature (72) may be taken only by candidates who offer Greek Translation (69), and Latin Literature (76) only by those who offer Latin Translation (73).

(f) Candidates will not be permitted to offer subjects totalling more than 400 marks in *either* language or literature. English Literature, Latin, and Greek come under this rule as well as modern foreign languages. Thus no candidate may offer French Language, German Language, and Spanish Language, or French Civilisation, German Civilisation, and English Literature. The papers on the History of the French Language, the History of the German Language, Old English, Middle English, and English Criticism, do not come within the scope of this restriction.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF YOUNG MEN WHO HAVE COMPLETED A PERIOD OF COMPULSORY SERVICE IN H.M. FORCES TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. *Nationality.*

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

2. *Education.*

No precise educational qualifications are prescribed, but candidates will be expected to have attained the standard of education of persons who have had whole-time systematic education up to the age of at least 16 years.

3. *Service.*

For candidates admitted under the proviso to sub-paragraph (i) of this Regulation the date of completion of the further period of whole-time service will be regarded as the date of completion of compulsory service.

4. *Health and Character.*

(C) PROBATIONARY ASSISTANT POSTAL CONTROLLERS IN THE POST OFFICE;

(D) JOINT INTELLIGENCE BUREAU OFFICERS, GRADE III, MINISTRY OF DEFENCE.

1. There will be two methods of entry: Method I and Method II. Regulation 2 relates to Method I, and Regulations 3 and 4 to Method II; the remaining Regulations relate to both methods. METHOD II.

3. *Examination.*

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(a) A written examination comprising two papers in English, two General Papers and a test of General Intelligence, for each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted (making 500 marks in all).

(b) A series of tests and interviews at the Civil Service Selection Board.

(c) An interview before the Final Selection Board.

(ii) The Commissioners will select in the light of the results of the written examination under (i) (a) and of the candidates' records those who will be summoned to the Civil Service Selection Board under (i) (b).

(iii) The Commissioners will subsequently select in the light of the candidates' performances at the Civil Service Selection Board and of their records those who will be admitted to interview by the Final Selection Board.

(vi) The Commissioners may, at their discretion, exempt from (i) (b) anyone who has appeared at the Civil Service Selection Board before, provided he applies for such exemption on his application form.

4. *Education.*

(i) Candidates must either (a) have obtained a degree at a recognised university, or (b) be in the last year of a course for a degree at a recognised university. (ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

11. Assignment.

Candidates will be considered for all the posts for which they are eligible under these Regulations; they will, however, be asked to state on their application forms their preferences among the four Departments. The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service and the candidates' suitability for particular Departments, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account. Candidates' suitability for Departments will be assessed by the Interview Board.

The names of the successful candidates will be issued in four lists according to the Departments to which they are assigned; a candidate who declines to accept the post for which he is declared successful will have no claim to be assigned to another.

A candidate cannot be considered for appointment as J.I.B. Officer, Grade III, in the Ministry of Defence unless

(a) as a Method I candidate he includes in his optional subjects one or more of the following: (30) General Economics, (31) Industry and Trade, (34) Social Economics, (35, 36) Economic History, (37) Economic Statistics, (51, 52) Geology, (55) Physical Geography, (56) Human Geography, (57) Geography of the British Isles, (93) Russian Language, (94, 95) Russian Civilisation; or

(b) as a Method III candidate his degree course has included the study of one or more of the above as a main subject.

12. Canvassing.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF YOUNG MEN WHO HAVE COMPLETED A PERIOD OF COMPULSORY SERVICE IN H.M. FORCES TO GRADE 6 POSTS IN BRANCH (B) OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.

1. Nationality.

(1) Every candidate must

- (a) be a natural-born British subject; and
- (b) have been born within the United Kingdom or within one of the self-governing Dominions of parents both of whom were also born within

the United Kingdom or within one of the self-governing Dominions.

(2) No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and then only in exceptional cases and in favour of candidates who are British subjects and who also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(ii) Candidates may not make more than two attempts in all and these must be made not later than the third examination held under these Regulations after the completion of National Service, any subsequent period of training as a result of a recall from the Reserve being disregarded. The date officially recorded as the last day of National Service is normally the last day of terminal leave; candidates are not, however, precluded from competing at an examination held during their terminal leave. For candidates admitted under the proviso to sub-paragraph (i) of this Regulation the date of completion of the further period of whole-time service will be regarded as the date of completion of compulsory service.

4. Marriage.

The approval of the Secretary of State is required before a successful candidate who is married takes up appointment.

5. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. Examination.

The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows:—

(1) English (including Handwriting) ...	250
(2) Arithmetic ...	100
(3) General Knowledge ...	100
(4) Current Affairs ...	100
(5) Intelligence Test ...	100

Candidates will be arranged in order of merit according to their aggregate marks in the whole examination. No candidate will be declared successful who does not obtain an aggregate which satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners.

Before any candidate can be appointed, he will be required to establish, in an interview at the Foreign Office, that he has the ability to learn languages and is in other respects suitable for appointment to the Foreign Service.

7. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent,

cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

8. Fee.

An application fee of 7s. 6d. is payable by all candidates. This must be sent with the application form, and is not returnable in any circumstances. A further fee of 12s. 6d., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £1, must be paid by each candidate on admission to the examination.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT TO THE STATISTICIAN CLASS OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. No candidate may compete more than twice.

2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 20½ years and under 24 years of age on the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held.

But (a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held;

(b) a candidate who has served or is serving in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular engagement may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held, up to a maximum of two years;

(c) a candidate who has post-graduate experience approved by the Commissioners may deduct from his actual age the period of such experience gained before the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held, up to a maximum of three years.

3. Sex.

Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

4. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject, or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

5. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. Subjects of Examination.

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination in

(a) certain compulsory subjects as indicated in the Appendix for which a maximum of 700 marks is allotted;

(b) a selection from the optional subjects set out in Appendix. Subject to the provisions in the Appendix, candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 300 marks.

(B) Interview, comprising

(a) a preliminary interview by a single interviewer, who will supply a report for the information of the Final Interview Board;

(b) an interview before the Final Interview Board, which will award a mark out of a maximum of 300 for the candidate's record, intelligence, and personal qualities.

(ii) The final order of merit will be determined by the total marks gained in the whole examination. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful.

7. Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

8. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Government Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

9. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

10. Fee.

The total fee payable by all candidates is £4. Of this £2 must be paid on application.
