**DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS, 1953.
CANCELLATION OF SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF
AUTHORITIES.**

(Malcolm Andrew Graham-Yooll.)

Whereas the authorities, respectively conferred by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the Raw Opium etc., Regulations, 1937, on Malcolm Andrew Graham-Yooll, O.B.E., M.B., Ch.B., by virtue of his being a duly qualified medical practitioner to be in possession of and to supply the drugs and preparations to which those Regulations applied were, the said Malcolm Andrew Graham-Yooll having been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts, 1920 to 1932, withdrawn in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 7 of the first mentioned Regulations and Regulation 5 of the last mentioned Regulations by Notice published in the London Gazette and the Edinburgh Gazette on the 2nd September, 1947, the registered address of the said Malcolm Andrew Graham-Yooll being then Elm Tree House, Pembroke:

And whereas at the same time the Secretary of State directed under the said Regulation 7 that it

should not be lawful for the said Malcolm Andrew Graham-Yooll to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937:

And whereas the operation of the said Notice was, by Notice published in the London Gazette and the Edinburgh Gazette on the 9th December, 1949, suspended until further Order:

And whereas the aforesaid Regulations have been revoked by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, and by virtue of Regulation 38 of the said last mentioned Regulations the aforesaid withdrawal, direction and suspension are deemed to have been done and given under the said Regulations of 1953:

And whereas I am of opinion that the said Malcolm Andrew Graham-Yooll cannot properly be allowed to remain a person authorised for the purposes of the said Regulations of 1953 or to give prescriptions for the said purposes:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 29 and 38 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, I hereby cancel the said suspension of which Notice was published in the London Gazette and the Edinburgh Gazette on the 9th December, 1949.
