The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under section 9 of the Finance Act, 1932, section 7 of the Finance Act, 1934, and section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz.:—

The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 6) Order, 1954, which introduces revised schemes under which drawback is allowed on exports of potassium ethyl xanthate and potassium amyl xanthate, if manufactured from imported solid potassium hydroxide of a purity of 88-92 per cent.

The Order comes into operation on the 17th September, 1954, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1954, No. 1190.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, exempting the following articles from Key Industry Duty for a period ending with the 18th February, 1955.

Optical instruments, the following:—

Photographic process screens of the contact type, not exceeding 25 inches in overall length or breadth, and consisting of a magenta-dyed base of cellulose acetate on which is a regularly spaced pattern of dots with 60 or 300 "lines" to the inch.

Synthetic organic chemicals, analytical reagents, other fine chemicals and chemicals manufactured by fermentation processes, the following:—

- 2: 5-Dihydroxybenzoic acid
- Furfuryl alcohol
- 3-Pyridylmercury acetate (a mercury compound)
- 2: 4-Xylenol.

The Order which comes into operation on the 15th September, 1954, is entitled the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) (No. 9) Order, 1954, and is published as Statutory Instruments, 1954, No. 1191.
