Barrow upon Soar Rural District (Parish of Thurmaston No. 1) Extinguishment Order, 1954.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 7th day of October, 1954, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

(1) to extinguish the public right of way from Leicester Road opposite the junction with Humblestone Lane to the Thurmaston-Birstall bridleway, and

NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949.**OSWESTRY RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.**

Oswestry Rural District Council (Weston Rhyn) Diversion Order 1954.
