"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 8th day of December, 1950, certain rates of pay were laid down for Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces:

"And whereas we are of opinion that certain of these rates of pay require revision:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the rates of pay contained in the Schedules annexed hereto, with effect from the 1st day of April, 1954.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals:

"SCHEDULE I—GENERAL.

"1. The rates of full pay in the following Schedule to apply to Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, and also in accordance with their several ranks and subject to the regulations governing their service, to Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve and the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, while serving or training in H.M. Ships or Establishments or while called out for actual service in war or emergency. The rates of full pay in Schedule II not to apply to National Service Officers or to Officers appointed for time only or otherwise holding naval rank for purposes of status only.

"2. Increments of full pay for Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve Officers to continue to depend on mobilised service on naval rates of full pay in the confirmed rank.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of September, 1954, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Hunston in the County of Suffolk and in the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"Whereas we are satisfied that Isabella Gertrude Heigham of 30, Frenchgate, Richmond, Yorkshire, widow, is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice."

"And whereas the said Isabella Gertrude Heigham desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Harold, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we do humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Harold, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Alfred, Bishop of Bradford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the benefice and parish of Keighley, the benefice and parish of Saint Peter, Keighley, and the benefice and parish of Eastwood and for altering the boundaries of the said parishes and of the parishes of Ingrow with Hainworth and Holy Trinity, Lawkholme, all of which benefices and parishes are situate in the diocese of Bradford.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices and Parishes.*—The benefice of Keighley, the benefice of Saint Peter, Keighley, and the benefice of Eastwood shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Keighley' and the parishes of the said benefices shall, subject as hereinafter provided, also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Taking effect of union.*—Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Edward Clifford Hamer, if he is then incumbent of the benefice of Keighley, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parish Church.*—Upon the union taking effect the parish church of the parish of Keighley shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"(1) As soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect, the church of Saint Peter, Keighley, and the parish church of the parish of Eastwood shall be taken down and the materials and sites thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof, shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"(2) After payment out of the respective proceeds of these sales of the expenses attendant upon such sale or sales and upon the taking down of the churches and all other expenses incidental to these matters—

"(a) the net proceeds of the sale of the site and materials of the church of Saint Peter, Keighley, shall as to such amounts and such proportions as after consultation with the Bishop of Bradford we shall determine, be applied by us towards the cost of such structural alteration and refurnishing of the Sunday School building associated with the church of Saint Peter, Keighley, as are necessary to enable it to be used for the purpose of divine worship and for social purposes and of the provision (including the cost of the purchase of the site) of a building for the purpose of divine worship and for social purposes in the area known as the Calver Grove—Guardhouse Estate in the parish of Keighley and the balance (if any) of the said proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Bradford established pursuant to Section 32 of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923;

"(b) the net proceeds of the sale of the site and materials of the parish church of the parish of Eastwood shall constitute and form part of the aggregate fund hereinafter referred to.

"(3) Upon the union taking effect, the font, Communion table and plate used for the purpose of Holy Communion in the church of Saint Peter, Keighley, and the parish church of the parish of Eastwood shall not be sold but shall, in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures and as the Bishop of Bradford shall direct, be transferred to some other church or churches within the diocese of Bradford and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said churches or such of them as the said bishop shall select, shall also be removed to some other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be applied to the same purposes as the proceeds of the sales of the respective churches.

"7. *Application of Aggregate Fund.*—So much of the aggregate fund hereinafter referred to as, after consultation with the Bishop of Bradford we shall determine, shall be applied by us for and towards the cost of the purchase of the day school adjoining the parish church of the parish of Eastwood for the purpose of its being vested in the Bradford Diocesan Board of Finance upon trust for use as a Sunday school or for other church purposes, and the balance (if any) of the said fund shall be paid to the said Diocesan Board of Finance to be held as a fund towards the cost of the maintenance of the property so purchased.

"8. *Patronage.*—After the union has taken effect, the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised alternately by the patron of the benefice of Keighley and the patron of the benefice of Eastwood, the patron of the benefice of Eastwood having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"9. *Diversion of Endowments.*—Upon the union taking effect certain endowments now held by us for the benefices of Saint Peter, Keighley, and Eastwood shall be severed or diverted from those benefices and from the united benefice and shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say:—

"(a) A permanent annuity of £225, being part of a larger annuity charged on our General Fund in favour of the benefice of Saint Peter, Keighley, shall be held by us for the augmentation of the benefice of Ingrow with Hainworth.

"(b) A permanent annuity of £82, being a further part of the said larger annuity, shall be held by us for the augmentation of the benefice of Holy Trinity, Lawkholme.

"(c) A permanent annuity of £325, being part of a larger annuity charged on our General Fund in favour of the benefice of Eastwood shall be held by us as part of our General Fund and in consideration thereof we shall credit the income account of the diocesan stipends fund of the said diocese with an amount equal in value thereto to be applied as far as the bishop with the concurrence of the Bradford Diocesan Board of Finance may deem necessary to payment of clerical or lay assistance employed to assist the incumbent of the united benefice.

"10. *Alteration of parochial boundaries.*—Upon the union taking effect:—

"(a) The boundaries of the parish of Ingrow with Hainworth shall with the consent (testified by his signing this Scheme) of the Reverend Edward Askew John Miller, incumbent of the benefice of Ingrow with Hainworth, be altered in the manner described in the First and Second Schedules to this Scheme.

"The territory, shown by the brown colour on the map, to be annexed to the parish of Ingrow with Hainworth:—

“1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Withycombe:—

“All that detached part of the parish of Carhampton (coloured pink on Map “A” annexed hereto) which is bounded upon the southwest by the parish of Cutcombe with Luxborough on the south by the parish of Treborough on the east by the parish of Old Cleeve and on the north and west by the parish of Withycombe.

“2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Dunster:—

As from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Andrew and Saint Peter, Drypool, Saint Michael, Sutton in Holderness, and Marfleet shall be altered in the manner described in Part II of the said Schedule and as delineated on the map hereto annexed.

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous parts (shown by the pink colour on the map hereto annexed) of the parishes of Saint Andrew and Saint Peter, Drypool, Saint Michael, Sutton in Holderness, and Marfleet which taken together are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point where the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Andrew and Saint Peter, Drypool, from the parish of Saint John, Drypool, meets the western boundary of the parish of Marfleet in the middle of the Withernsea branch line of British Railways (North Eastern Region) and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned branch line to a point in the middle of the bridge which carries the branch line over Holderness Drain and continuing thence first northwards and then north eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned drain thereby following in part the boundary which divides the parish of Marfleet from the parishes of Saint Andrew and Saint Peter, Drypool, and Saint Michael, Sutton in Holderness, to a point in the middle of the bridge which carries Portobello Street over the said drain and continuing thence first westwards and then north westwards along the middle of the last mentioned bridge and street to a point opposite to the north western end of Portobello Street in the middle of Holderness Road and continuing thence south westwards along the middle of the last mentioned road in part following the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Michael, Sutton in Holderness, from the parish of Saint Andrew and Saint Peter, Drypool, to a point opposite to the north western end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as number 524 Holderness Road from the house and premises known as number 522 Holderness Road and continuing thence south eastwards first to and then along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to and then along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 1 to 53 Brindley Street and continuing thence north eastwards along the north western wall or fence of the house and premises known as number 55 Brindley Street to its end and continuing thence south eastwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 55 to 69 Brindley Street and continuing thence south eastwards thereby crossing Watt Street first to and then along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 71 to 133 Brindley Street and continuing thence south westwards along the south eastern wall or fence of the house and premises known as number 133 Brindley Street and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point opposite to its south western end in the middle of Brindley Street and continuing thence south eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned street to a point opposite to its south eastern end in the middle of Southcoates

Lane and continuing thence westwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to a point opposite to the middle of Sherwood Avenue and continuing thence southwards first to and then along the middle of the last mentioned avenue to a point opposite to its southern end in Farndale Avenue and continuing thence first westwards then southwards and then south westwards along the middle of Farndale Avenue, Wheldale Avenue and Rustenburg Street to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Andrew and Saint Peter, Drypool, from the parish of Saint John, Drypool, and continuing thence generally eastwards along the last mentioned boundary to the western boundary of the parish of Marfleet.

*"Part II"*

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Marfleet:—

"(a) All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Andrew and Saint Peter, Drypool, which lies to the east of the middle of Holderness Drain and

"(b) All those parts (coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Michael Sutton in Holderness, which lie to the south east of the middle of Holderness Drain."

And whereas the provisions of the (New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Saint Nathanael, Kingsdown, and the benefice of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint Nathanael with Saint Katharine, Bristol', and, subject as hereinafter provided, the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Basil Stanley Moss, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Nathanael, Kingsdown, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parish Church.* The parish church of the parish of Saint Nathanael, Kingsdown, shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"4. *Registers.* The marriage registers current at the church of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, shall be dealt with in accordance with section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptism and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of the united parish.

"5. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Saint Nathanael, Kingsdown, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house belonging to the benefice of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be applied by us as follows, that is to say:—

"(a) so much of the net proceeds as after consultation with the Bishop of the diocese and with the Diocesan Dilapidations Board of the diocese of Bristol we shall deem sufficient, shall be applied towards the cost of the repair and improvement of the parsonage house of the united benefice in accordance with plans to be approved by us, and

"(b) the balance shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Bristol established pursuant to the 32nd section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"6. *Patronage.* With the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bristol, being the patron of the benefice of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, and with the consents (testified by their signatures hereto) of John Strickland Wright of Hazelmere, Cotham Park, Bristol, Hugh James Orr-Ewing of 12, Downleaze, Stoke Bishop, Bristol, and the Reverend Robert Henry Makepeace of The Vicarage, Wellington, Salop, being the patrons of the benefice of Saint Nathanael, Kingsdown, the patronage of the benefice of Saint Nathanael, Kingsdown, shall without any conveyance or assurance other than this scheme, be surrendered in favour of the said Arthur, Bishop of Bristol, and to his successors, Bishops of Bristol, and the patronage of the united benefice shall belong wholly to the Bishop for the time being of the diocese of Bristol.

"7. *Appropriation of the church of Saint Katharine, Bishopston.*

"(a) Upon the union taking effect the church of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, shall be appropriated to the uses specified in the First Schedule hereto but subject to the conditions so specified.

"(b) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said church of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, shall not be sold, but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures and as the Bishop of the diocese may direct be transferred to the church of Saint Nathanael, Kingsdown, being the parish church of the united parish, or to some other church or churches within the said diocese and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, or such of them as the Bishop shall select, shall be removed to the parish church of the united parish or to any other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the Bishop may direct or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Bristol as aforesaid.

"8. *Alteration of boundaries.* Upon the union taking effect and with the consents (testified by their signatures hereto) of the Reverend Hugh Jordan, being the incumbent of the benefice of Redland, and of the Reverend Leslie Arthur Williams, being the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bishopston, (a) all that part of the parish of Redland which is described in Part I of the Second Schedule hereto shall be severed from that parish and be annexed to the parish of the united benefice and (b) all that part of the parish of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, which is described in Part II of the said Second Schedule shall be severed from that parish and from the parish of the united benefice and be annexed to the parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bishopston.

#### " FIRST SCHEDULE.

" *Purposes for which the church of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, may be used upon its becoming vested in the diocesan board of finance of the diocese of Bristol under the provisions of subsection (1) of section 2 of the Union of Benefices (Disused Churches) Measure, 1952, by reason of its appropriation to other uses, and conditions to which such use is subject.*

"1. The Diocesan board of finance of the diocese of Bristol (hereinafter called 'the Board') shall allow the church of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, to be used under the management of the parochial church council of the united parish of Saint Nathanael with Saint Katharine, Bristol, as a parish hall for the parishioners of the said united parish.

"2. The said parochial church council shall pay or procure the payment of the whole cost of the repair and maintenance and insurance of the said church and all other outgoings in respect thereof and shall reimburse the Board in respect of any expenditure which the Board as legal owners of the church may incur pursuant to any statutory requirement.

"3. No alterations in or additions to the fabric of the said church shall be made except with the consent of the Board and in accordance with and subject to lawful authority.

#### " SECOND SCHEDULE.

##### " PART I.

"The territory to be severed from the parish of Redland and annexed to the parish of Saint Nathanael with Saint Katharine, Bristol:—

"All that part of the parish of Redland (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which is bounded on the southwest by the parish of Saint Saviour, Woolcott Park, on the southeast by the parish of Saint Nathanael, Kingsdown, on the northeast partly by the parish of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, and partly by the parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bishopston, on the northwest by the parish of Saint Alban, Westbury on Trym, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Alban, Westbury on Trym, from the parish of Redland at the north-western end of the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of the allotment gardens (numbered 1 on the map) lying to the south of the houses and premises numbered 1 to 11 Dugar Walk and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and thence north-eastwards along the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of the last mentioned allotment gardens to the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises numbered 173 to 157 Cranbrook Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned walls or fences to the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the plot of land numbered 2 on the map and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the wall or fence forming the northeastern boundary of the allotment gardens numbered 3 on the map and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to a point opposite the southwestern end of the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of the house and premises numbered 109 Cranbrook Road and continuing thence north-eastwards in a straight line to the southwestern end of the last mentioned wall or fence and continuing thence southeastwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises numbered 107 to 75 Cranbrook Road to the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of the house and premises known as Salisbury View and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and thence south-eastwards along the wall or fence forming the Southwestern boundary of the last mentioned house and premises to the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises numbered 18 to 44 Kersteman Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned walls or fences and thence southeastwards along the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of the house and premises numbered 44 Kersteman Road and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Kersteman Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned road and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a

point in the middle of Redland Court Road and continuing thence generally southwards along the middle of the last mentioned road and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the boundary which divides the parish of Redland from the parish of Saint Saviour, Woolcott Park.

#### " PART II.

"The territory to be severed from the parish of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, and from the parish of the united benefice and annexed to the parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bishopston:—

"All that part (coloured blue on the map) of the parish of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, which lies to the northeast of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, from the parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bishopston, at a point opposite the middle of the northwestern end of Claremont Avenue and continuing thence south-eastwards to and along the middle of Claremont Avenue and in the same line in continuation thereof along the middle of Claremont Road to its junction with Gloucester Road and continuing thence in a straight line to a point in the middle of Overton Road on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Katharine, Bishopston, from the parish of Saint Bartholomew, Bristol."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.
