"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Chislehurst; The Annunciation, Chislehurst; Christ Church, Longlands, Sidcup; the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey; All Saints, New Eltham; and Holy Trinity, Eltham; shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of All Saints, New Eltham, being:—

"All those contiguous parts of the parish of The Annunciation, Chislehurst, and of the parish of Christ Church, Longlands, Sidcup, (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which taken together are bounded upon the northwest and upon the northeast by the parish of All Saints, New Eltham, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of All Saints, New Eltham, from the parish of Christ Church, Longlands, Sidcup, at the point in the centre of the bridge which carries Sidcup Road across Kemnal Road and continuing thence southwards along the middle of the last named road to a point opposite the middle of the eastern end of Belmont Lane (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the parish of The Annunciation, Chislehurst, from the parish of Chislehurst) and continuing thence generally northwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned lane to a point opposite the middle of the southeastern end of Edgebury Road

and continuing thence in the same direction to and along the middle of the last named road to the boundary which divides the parish of The Annunciation, Chislehurst, from the parish of All Saints, New Eltham.

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Holy Trinity, Eltham, being:—

"All that part of the parish of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) which is bounded upon the west and the northwest by the parish of Holy Trinity, Eltham, upon the northeast by the parish of Saint John, Welling, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Welling, from the parish of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, in the middle of Rochester Way at the point where it is crossed by the Urban District boundary of Bexley and continuing thence generally southwards along the last mentioned boundary to its junction with the Urban District boundary of Sidcup and continuing thence generally southwards along the last mentioned boundary to its junction with the middle of an unnamed brook at the rear of the houses and premises which lie to the south of the southern arc of Restons Crescent and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned brook to a point opposite the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as number 213 Restons Crescent and continuing thence northwestwards to and along the last mentioned boundary and in the same straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Restons Crescent and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of Restons Crescent and in the same straight line in continuation thereof to the middle of Avery Hill Road upon the boundary which divides the parish of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, from the parish of Holy Trinity, Eltham.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Grundisburgh shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* In every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice after the union has taken effect, the patron of the benefice of Grundisburgh shall have the first and second turns and the patron of the benefice of Burgh shall have the third turn."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Guildford (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Ockham and the benefice of Hatchford (the church or chapel whereof is situate within the parish of

Cobham) and for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Cobham and Ockham, all of which benefices and parishes are situate in the diocese of Guildford.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Ockham and the benefice of Hatchford shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ockham with Hatchford', and the parish of the said benefice of Ockham and all that part of the parish of the benefice of Cobham which is described in the First Schedule hereto shall, with the consent of the Reverend Frederick Walter Crooks, being the incumbent of the benefice of Cobham (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Parish Church.* The parish church of the parish of Ockham shall be the parish church of the united parish of Ockham with Hatchford.

"3. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Charles William Wall if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Hatchford shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Hatchford having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. *Diversion of surplus endowment income.*

"(a) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year, of the endowment income (calculated as prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £700 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Guildford.

"(b) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £700 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall, when we deem that circumstances so require, be apportionable accordingly.

"(c) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(d) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

"6. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.* The united benefice shall be in the archdeaconry of Dorking and the Rural deanery of Leatherhead.

"FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Ockham:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Cobham which lies to the south of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Wisley from the parish of Cobham in the middle of the River Mole and continuing thence first south-eastwards and then north-eastwards along the middle of the River Mole to a point opposite the north-western end of the wall or fence which divides close numbered 512 (on the map) from close numbered 478 and continuing thence first south-eastwards and then in various directions along the said wall or fence to its end and continuing thence south-westwards along the wall or fence which forms the south-eastern boundary of close numbered 512 to the

middle of the northwestern end of the lane leading from Plough Lane to close numbered 512 and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the first mentioned lane to its junction with Plough Lane at the point known as Beggar's Corner and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Plough Lane to a point opposite the northwestern end of the wall which divides close numbered 508 from close numbered 509 and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall and in the same straight line along the wall forming the southwestern boundary of Cobham Park Gardens to its end at its junction with the wall or fence which divides close numbered 508 from close numbered 508A and continuing thence first southeastwards then southwestwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence which divides close numbered 508A from closes numbered 509A and 510 and continuing thence first southwestwards then southeastwards along the wall or fence which divides close numbered 522 from closes numbered 510 and 549 to its junction with the wall or fence which divides close numbered 548 from close numbered 549 and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence which divides close numbered 547 from close numbered 549 to its end and in the same straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of the road from Downside to Cobham and continuing thence southwards along the middle of the said road to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence which divides close numbered 573 from close numbered 574 and continuing thence eastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence, thence southeastwards along the wall or fence which divides closes numbered 575, 576 and 591A from closes numbered 574, 592 and 591 to its end and continuing thence in the same direction along the wall or fence which crosses close numbered 590 to a point in the middle of the road leading from Downside Common to Cobham Park Road opposite the southeastern end of the last mentioned wall or fence and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the said road to a point in the middle of Cobham Park Road at its junction with the said road and continuing thence first southeastwards then northeastwards along the middle of Cobham Park Road to a point opposite the southwestern end of the wall or fence which divides close numbered 580 from close numbered 581 and continuing thence first northwards to the last mentioned wall or fence then northeastwards along the said wall or fence for a distance of 111 yards and continuing thence southeastwards in a straight line to the boundary which divides the parish of Cobham from the parish of Stoke D'Abernion at a point in the middle of the mill-race flowing from Downside Saw Mill approximately 108 yards from the point at which the said mill-race emerges from the mill tunnel.

"SECOND SCHEDULE.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income of the united benefice shall, without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:—

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us and any other person or body,
"and (2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof,

"and by deducting therefrom:—

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent,

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

"(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,

"(4) the rate payable on the glebe,

"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,

"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,

"(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe,

"(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,

"(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,

"(11) any pension paid to a retired incumbent out of the benefice income,

"(12) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."
