"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts mentioned therein, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of *Sporle with Little Palgrave* in the County of *Norfolk* and in the diocese of *Norwich*.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we are satisfied that the Provost of the College Royal of the Blessed Mary of Eton near unto Windsor in the County of Bucks commonly called The King's College of Our Blessed Lady of Eton nigh or by Windsor in the said County of Bucks and The Same College (hereinafter called 'the said Provost and College') are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Provost and College desire to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Board of Patronage of the Diocese of *Norwich* and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Board of Patronage of the Diocese of *Norwich* and the Right Reverend Percy, Bishop of *Norwich*, as the Bishop of the diocese within which the said benefice is situate (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Board of Patronage of the Diocese of *Norwich* and their successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Board and by their successors for ever."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in

law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of *Norwich*.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Harold, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of *Dallinghoo* and the benefice of *Lowdham and Pettistree* (now part of the benefice of *Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree*) both of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"SCHEME.

"1. The benefice of *Dallinghoo* and the benefice of *Lowdham and Pettistree*, being part of the benefice of *Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree*, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of *Dallinghoo and Pettistree*' but the parishes of the said benefices shall remain in all respects distinct.

"2. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. Upon the union taking effect the remaining part of the benefice of *Wickham Market* and *Lowdham and Pettistree* shall be known as the benefice of *Wickham Market*.

"4. Upon the union taking effect (a) the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of *Dallinghoo* shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice of *Dallinghoo and Pettistree* and (b) the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of *Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree* shall be assigned to the benefice of *Wickham Market* as the house of residence of the incumbent thereof.

"5. Upon the union taking effect the endowments and property specified in the Schedule hereto and now forming part of the endowments and property

of the said benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree shall be appropriated and annexed to the united benefice of Dallingham and Pettistree and all other the endowments and property of the benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree shall belong to the benefice of Wickham Market.

"6. After the union has taken effect (a) the right of presentation to the united benefice of Dallingham and Pettistree shall be exercised alternately by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being on behalf of Your Majesty as one of the patrons of the benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree, and by the patron of the benefice of Dallingham, the said Lord High Chancellor having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union, and (b) the patronage of the benefice of Wickham Market shall be exercised solely by the other patron of the benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree, being the patron who was formerly sole patron of the benefice of Wickham Market.

" SCHEDULE.

"Endowments and property of the benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree to be appropriated and annexed to the united benefice of Dallingham and Pettistree.

"(1) A capital sum of £2,246 19s. 11d. held by the Church Commissioners and producing an income of £71 13s. 6d. per annum.

"(2) A permanent annuity of £5 3s. 4d. charged upon the general fund of the Church Commissioners.

"(3) The annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £33 6s. 8d. charged upon the endowments of the benefice of Burgh in favour of the incumbent for the time being of the united benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree by Order in Council dated the 15th day of March, 1951 and published in the London Gazette of the 16th day of March, 1951."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Heworth which lies to the south and the west of Whitehouse Lane."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Archdeacons and Rural Deaneries Act, 1874, and of the Acts mentioned therein and of the Archdeacons (Augmentation) Measure, 1953, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new archdeaconry within the diocese of Rochester and for endowing such new archdeaconry.

" SCHEME

"Whereas the said diocese of Rochester now comprises two archdeacons, namely, the archdeaconry of Rochester and the archdeaconry of Tonbridge:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of Rochester, has represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that a new archdeaconry should be constituted within the said diocese of Rochester and should comprise and consist of the rural deaneries of Beckenham, Bromley, Chislehurst, Dartford and Orpington, which are at present in the said archdeaconry of Rochester, and that such new archdeaconry should be endowed in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consent of the said Christopher, Bishop of Rochester (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order one new archdeaconry shall be created within the said diocese of Rochester and that such archdeaconry shall be named 'The Archdeaconry of Bromley' and shall comprise and consist of the said rural deaneries of Beckenham, Bromley, Chislehurst, Dartford and Orpington.

"And we further recommend and propose that the rural deans and other the clergy and the inhabitants generally of the said proposed archdeaconry of Bromley shall be under and subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction, authority and control of the archdeacon of such proposed archdeaconry for the time being, and that such archdeacon shall have and exercise all the rights, powers and duties of an archdeacon within the limits of his archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that we be authorised to pay by equal quarterly instalments on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July and the 1st day of October in every year out of our General Fund to the archdeacon of the said proposed archdeaconry of Bromley and to his successors in the same archdeaconry the yearly sum of £400, the instalment so first becoming due being an apportioned part only of the said sum of £400 in respect of the period between the date of

the collation of the first archdeacon of the said proposed archdeaconry of Bromley and the first quarterly day of payment next ensuing: provided always that every payment in respect of the said yearly sum of £400 shall be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous twelve calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

"And we further recommend and propose that whenever any archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £400 shall resign or otherwise avoid his archdeaconry such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same archdeaconry."

And whereas the provisions of the said Acts, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

"(c) So much of the net proceeds of such sale or sales as we, after consulting with the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese, shall deem necessary shall be applied by us towards the cost of carrying out improvements to the residence house of the united benefice and any balance of the said net proceeds shall be held by us for the augmentation of the endowment of the united benefice."

"SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Noel, Bishop of Newcastle (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution:*

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area, approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Francis, High Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne.'

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery:*

"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Northumberland and in the rural deanery of Newcastle.

"THE SCHEDULE

"The area comprising:—

"1. All that part of the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which lies generally to the northwest of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, from the parish of Long Benton in the middle of Etherstone Avenue and continuing thence south-westwards along the middle of Etherstone Avenue to its end, and continuing thence in a straight line to the middle of Benton Road and continuing thence first to and then along the middle of Craster Terrace to its end and continuing in a straight line to a point opposite the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 57, Weldon Crescent and continuing thence westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing in a straight line to the middle of the northeastern end of Newton Place and continuing south-westwards along the last mentioned Place to its end and continuing thence in a straight line to the middle of Newton Road and continuing thence north-westwards along the middle of the

last mentioned road to a point opposite the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the Heaton Secondary Schools' Playing Fields and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence in a straight line to a point opposite the northeastern end of the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 63, Jesmond Park West and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence in a straight line to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne from the parish of Saint George, Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

"2. All that part of the parish of Long Benton (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) which lies generally to the northeast of the territory described in Part I of this Schedule and which is bounded on the west by the parish of Saint Nicholas, Gosforth, on the southeast by the part of the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, not hereinbefore described in Part I of this Schedule and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Long Benton from the parish of Saint Nicholas, Gosforth, in the middle of Benton Park Road and continuing thence northeastwards along the last mentioned road to a point where it meets the boundary of the County Borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne and continuing thence first generally southeastwards and then northeastwards, northwestwards, northeastwards and southeastwards, along the last mentioned County Borough boundary to the point where it reaches the middle of Coach Lane and continuing thence generally southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to a point opposite the middle of Coxlodge Wagonway and continuing thence southeastwards first to and then along the middle of the Wagonway to a point where it meets the boundary which divides the parish of Long Benton from the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Measure.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury, and of the Reverend Gwyn Aubrey Thomas, being the incumbent of the united benefice of Hilton with Cheselbourne and Melcombe Horsey (in witness whereof they have signed this Scheme), we do humbly recommend and propose that upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the *London Gazette* the provisions of Clause 4 of the said Order shall be wholly rescinded."

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF MUSEUM ASSISTANTS IN THE BRITISH MUSEUM (BLOOMSBURY).

1. (i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible for appointment to the Home Civil Service unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 16 years of age on 1st November, 1954. The Commissioners have not specified an upper age limit for this competition. In general, however, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service and the Commissioners will give weight to this factor in considering candidates for these posts who are over 50 years of age.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Qualifications.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education as in the Commissioners' opinion fits them for appointment.

They must:—

(a) have obtained a School Certificate, preferably with a credit in an Arts subject; or

(b) have obtained the General Certificate of Education with a pass at the Ordinary level in English language (or English, or English Literature) and in not fewer than three other subjects, at least one of which should preferably be an Arts subject; or

(c) have obtained the Scottish Leaving Certificate with passes on the lower grade in English and three other subjects at least one of which should preferably be an Arts subject, or produce a statement from the Scottish Education Department showing that they have attained an equivalent standard; or

(d) have obtained passes in the Senior Certificate Examination of the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland in 1952 or after in the subjects prescribed under (b) above, or produce a statement from the Ministry that they have attained an equivalent standard; or

(e) have passed

(i) the Forces Preliminary Examination, or

(ii) the Royal Air Force Higher Education Test, Part I, or

(iii) the Admiralty Higher Educational Test, Second Class, preferably with a pass in all cases in an arts subject; or

(f) have passed an examination accepted by the Commissioners as of an academic standard equivalent to or higher than those named above.

Exceptionally, the above requirements may be waived for candidates with experience of special value to the Museum.

5. Experience.

Candidates for appointment direct to the established grade must have had at least two years' comparable experience before the 1st November, 1954.

6. Competition.

Those candidates who appear from their application forms to have the best qualifications will be summoned to appear before a Selection Board in London which will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment, in an established or an unestablished capacity, the candidates who appear to be most suitable. The Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of education and experience, any recommendation that they may receive from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview, and on their estimation of the above evidence they will frame their recommendations. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

7. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

8. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

9. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their application through Members of Parliament or other influential persons (except as referees to be named by them in their application form) will disqualify them for appointment.

10. Appointment.

Successful candidates aged 18 or over on the 1st November, 1954, who possess the necessary experience (see Regulation 5 above) will enter the grade in an established capacity.

Other successful candidates will enter in an unestablished capacity in the first instance, and will be considered for established appointment after such period of training as may be necessary in each case subject to the minimum age-limit of 18. When the training period exceeds two years, the Commissioners may require the officer to satisfy a second Interview Board set up by them at the end of his training.

Appointment to the established staff will be conditional upon the issue of the Commissioners' certificate of qualification.

11. Fee.

A successful candidate for established appointment will be required to pay a fee of £1 before the issue of a certificate of qualification.
