PRESENT,

The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865 (28 & 29 Vict. c. 73), it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Her Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas Her Majesty deems it expedient to amend certain Orders in Council concerning retired pay, pensions and other grants for officers, nurses and ratings disabled, and for the widows and children of officers and ratings deceased, in consequence of service during the 1914 World War:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:—

(1) "the 1920 Order" means the Order in Council of the 11th June, 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920/1021 (II, p. 295)), relating to seamen and marines, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council:

(2) "the 1921 (Officers) Order" means the Order in Council of the 9th March, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921/360 (p. 770)), relating to commissioned and subordinate officers and nurses, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council:

(3) "the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order" means the Order in Council of the 9th March, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921/361 (p. 794)), relating to Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank and Warrant Officers, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council:

(4) "the 1949 Order" means the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1949, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council.

2. In Article 6a of the 1920 Order, as amended (Orders of 29th September, 1949, and 18th July, 1952), (which provides for the award of allowances for constant attendance on disabled ratings) for the figures 25s. and 50s. there shall be substituted the figures 30s. and 60s. respectively, and in Article 7 of the 1921 (Officers) Order and of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, as amended in both cases (Orders of 29th September, 1949, and 18th July, 1952), (which make similar provisions for disabled officers) and in Article 27 of the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Orders of 29th September, 1949, and 18th July, 1952), which makes similar provisions for disabled nurses) for the figures 50s. there shall be substituted the figures 60s.

3. In column 2 of the Table in Article 11 of the 1920 Order, as amended (S.R. & O. 1925/1034 and Order of 29th April, 1952), (which sets out the rates of pension which may be awarded to widows of ratings) for the figures 47s., 46s., 45s., 44s., 43s. and 42s. there shall be substituted the figures 57s. 6d., 56s. 6d., 55s. 6d., 54s. 6d., 53s. 6d. and 52s. 6d. respectively.

4. In Article 12 of the 1920 Order, as amended (Order of 29th September, 1949), (which provides for the award of allowances for the children of ratings' widows) for the figures 11s., wherever the same appear, there shall be substituted the figures 16s. 6d.

5. In Article 18 (1) of the 1920 Order, as amended (Order of 29th September, 1949), (which provides for the award of pensions for motherless children of ratings) for the figures 26s. there shall be substituted the figures 40s.

6. For the First Schedule to the 1920 Order, as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952), (which sets out the assessments of disablement caused by specified injuries and of certain other disablements and the pensions which may be granted to ratings for such injuries and disablements) there shall be substituted the First Schedule to this Order.

7. In Article 12 (1) of the 1921 (Officers) Order (which provides for the award of allowances to widows of officers in respect of children) for the figures £36 there shall be substituted the figures £50 10s.

8. In Article 17 of the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 29th September, 1949), (which provides for the award of pensions for motherless children of officers) for the figures £68 there shall be substituted the figures £104.

9. For Part I of the First Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952), (which sets out the rates of retired pay for disabled officers) there shall be substituted the Second Schedule to this Order.

10. For the figures in columns (2) to (5) in the Second Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952), (which sets out the rates of pensions for officers' widows) there shall be substituted the figures in the following columns:

11. For the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952), (which sets out the rates of pensions for disabled

nurses) there shall be substituted the Third Schedule to this Order.

12. In Article 12 (1) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order (which provides for the award of allowances to widows of officers in respect of children) for the figures £30 there shall be substituted the figures £44 10s.

13. In Article 17 of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 29th September, 1949), (which provides for the award of pensions for motherless children of officers) for the figures £68 there shall be substituted the figures £104.

14. For the First Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952), (which sets out the rates of retired pay for disabled officers) there shall be substituted the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

15. In column (2) of the Table in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952), (which sets out the rates of pensions for widows of officers) for the figures £168 and £143 there shall be substituted the figures £196 and £171 respectively.

16. In Article 5 (2) of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 31st May, 1951), (which provides for the supplementation of retired pay or pension for unemployable pensioners) for the figures £91 and 35s. there shall be substituted the figures £117 and 45s. respectively.

17. In Article 5 (3) of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952), (which provides for the award of additional allowances for dependants of unemployable pensioners) for the figures £20, 11s. 6d., £56, 21s. 6d., £86 and 10s. 6d., there shall be substituted the figures £29, 15s., £65, 25s., £95 and 11s. 6d. respectively.

18. In Article 6 of the 1949 Order (which provides for the award of allowances for lowered standard of occupation) for the figures 20s. there shall be substituted the figures 27s. 6d.

19. In Article 7 of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952), (which provides for the award of allowances for disabled officers and nurses receiving approved treatment) for the figures 32s. 6d., wherever the same appear, £20, £56 and £86 there shall be substituted the figures 40s., £29, £65 and £95 respectively.

20. In Article 8 (2) of the 1949 Order (which sets out the rate of personal allowances which may be awarded for disabled ratings receiving approved treatment) for the figures 45s. there shall be substituted the figures 67s. 6d.

21. In paragraphs (3) and (4) of Article 8 of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952), (which provide for the award of increased or additional allowances for disabled ratings receiving approved treatment) for the figures 32s. 6d., wherever the same appear, 11s. 6d., 10s. 6d., and 21s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures 40s., 15s., 11s. 6d. and 25s. respectively.

22. In the Table in Article 8 (7) of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952), (which sets out the rates of personal allowances which may be awarded for disabled ratings receiving approved treatment where they are entitled to awards in respect of service) for the figures 71s. 8d., 65s., 61s. 8d., 58s. 4d. and 55s. there shall be substituted the figures 84s. 2d., 77s. 6d., 74s. 2d., 70s. 10d. and 67s. 6d. respectively.

23. In Article 12 of the 1949 Order (which provides for the award of allowances for wear and tear of clothing) for the figure £5 there shall be substituted the figure £6 and for the figure £8, wherever the same appears, the figures £10.

24. In the Table in Article 13 (1) of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952), (which sets out the rates of pension for 100 per cent. disablement which may be awarded to ratings entitled to awards in respect of service) for the figures 71s. 8d., 65s., 61s. 8d., 58s. 4d., and 55s. there shall be substituted the figures 84s. 2d., 77s. 6d., 74s. 2d., 70s. 10d. and 67s. 6d. respectively.

25. In Article 14 of the 1949 Order (which provides for awards to widows and children on the death of officers or ratings on or after the 3rd September, 1939)—

(a) Proviso (b) to paragraph (2) shall be deleted and there shall be substituted the following proviso:

"(b) a widow who is not over 40 years of age and is without children eligible for an allowance under this Article, but—

(i) is incapable of self-support by reason of infirmity; or

(ii) was in receipt of an allowance in respect of a child of the officer or rating awarded under this Article, of whom she is the mother, until the date upon which the child attained the age of 16 years, or is a widow who, in the opinion of the Minister in any other case, should be treated as if she had been in receipt of such an allowance until that date;

may be awarded a pension under this Article at the rate which would be appropriate to her case if she were over 40 years of age and otherwise eligible under the provisions of this Order and of the 1921 (Officers) Order, the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order or the 1920 Order, as the case may be, for an award at that rate;."

(b) for the figures £60, £45, £52, 13s. 6d., 20s., £68 and 26s. there shall be substituted the figures £86 10s., £62, £78 10s., 20s., 30s., £104 and 40s. respectively.

26. In Article 15 of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952), (which provides for the award of pensions to children of officers and ratings who died before the 3rd September, 1939) for the figures £36, £30, £64, £49, £56, 11s., 15s., 21s. 6d., £84 10s., and 32s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures £50 10s., £44 10s., £86 10s., £62, £78 10s., 16s. 6d., 20s., 30s., £104 and 40s. respectively.

27.—(1) This Order shall be construed as one with the 1920 Order, the 1921 (Officers) Order, the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order and the 1949 Order and subject to the following provisions of this Article, shall come into operation in relation to an officer or nurse on the 1st February, 1955, and in relation to a rating on the 31st January, 1955, so, however, that, in relation to any award payable weekly, the said reference to the 31st January, 1955, where this is not the normal weekly pay day for that award, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following the 31st January, 1955.

(2) Articles 17, 19 and 21 of this Order shall come into operation in relation to an officer or nurse on the 1st June, 1955, and in relation to a rating on the 18th May, 1955.

(3) The provisions of this Order specified in the first column of the following Table, in so far as they relate to the figures specified in relation to them respectively in the second column, shall be deemed to have come into operation on the dates so specified in the third column, so, however, that until the dates from which the said provisions are brought into full operation by paragraph (1) of this Article there shall be substituted for the said figures, the figures specified in the fourth column.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

1. This Order amends the Order of the 11th June, 1920, the Orders of the 9th March, 1921, and the Order of the 29th September, 1949, as amended by subsequent Orders.

2. The normal maximum rate of the allowances for constant attendance is increased from 25s. a week to 30s. a week in the case of ratings and the maximum, for exceptional cases of very severe disablement, from 50s. a week to 60s. a week in the case of officers, nurses and ratings. (Article 2.)

3. The pension rates for certain widows of officers and ratings are increased by £28 a year and by 10s. 6d. a week respectively. (Articles 3, 10 and 15.)

4. The allowances payable to widows in respect of children are increased from £36 a year or £30 a year in the case of children of officers and 11s. a week in the case of children of ratings to £50 10s. a year, £44 10s. a year and 16s. 6d. a week respectively. (Articles 4, 7, 12 and 26.)

5.—(1) The rates of pensions or allowances payable to or in respect of children of deceased members of the naval forces (such children having become motherless or having ceased to be under the control of their mother) are increased to £86 10s., £62 and £78 10s. in the case of children of officers and to 20s. a week or 30s. a week (according to the ages of the children) in the case of children of ratings. (Articles 25 (b) and 26.)

(2) The pensions payable to such children who, having attained the age of 18 years, are incapable of self-support by reason of an infirmity which arose before they attained the normal age limit for pension purposes are increased to £104 a year in the case of children of officers and to 40s. a week in the case of children of ratings. (Articles 5, 8, 13, 25 (b) and 26.)

6.—(1) The rates of pensions for 100 per cent. disablement are increased by £34 a year in the case of officers and nurses and by 12s. 6d. a week in the

case of ratings with proportionate increases for lower degrees of disablement. (Articles 6, 9, 11, 14 and 24.)

(2) The maximum rates of the "Addition to Service Retired Pay" payable to certain disabled officers and nurses are increased from £176 a year in the case of officers and £151 a year in the case of nurses to £210 a year and £185 a year respectively. (Articles 9, 11 and 14.)

7. The allowance for unemployable pensioners is increased from £91 a year in the case of officers and 35s. a week in the case of ratings to £117 a year and 45s. a week respectively. (Article 16.)

8.—(1) The additional allowance payable in respect of the wife or adult dependant of an unemployable pensioner and of a pensioner receiving approved treatment is increased from a total of £56 a year in the case of officers and a total of 21s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings to totals of £65 a year and 25s. a week respectively. (Articles 17, 19 and 21.)

(2) The allowance for the first or only child of a rating who has been awarded a special allowance either on the grounds of unemployability or because, during a course of approved treatment, he is not entitled to sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions, is increased from 10s. 6d. a week to 11s. 6d. a week. (Articles 17 and 21.)

9. The maximum allowance for lowered standard of occupation is increased from 20s. a week to 27s. 6d. a week. (Article 18.)

10. The maximum of the additional personal treatment allowance payable to the pensioner who is not entitled to sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions is increased from 32s. 6d. a week to 40s. a week. (Articles 19 and 21.)

11. The allowances for wear and tear of clothing are increased from £5 and £8 a year to £6 and £10 a year respectively. (Article 23.)

12. Provision is made to enable officers' and ratings' widows who are under 40 years of age and not incapacitated—and who, hitherto, have ceased to be entitled to higher scale pensions because their only or youngest child has attained the age limit for the payment of allowances—to retain their higher scale pensions. (Article 25.)

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949, relating to members of the naval forces as therein defined, as amended by the Orders in Council of the 28th October, 1949, of the 31st May, 1951, of the 29th April, 1952, of the 18th July, 1952, and of the 28th May, 1953, shall be further amended in the respects set out in the following Articles of this Order, which shall be construed as one with the said Order of the 29th September, 1949, as so amended.

1. In Article 15, as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952), (which provides for the award of allowances for constant attendance on a disabled member of the naval forces) for the figures 25s., £130 and 50s. there shall be substituted the figures 30s., £156 and 60s. respectively.

2. In Article 16 (which provides for the award of allowances for wear and tear of clothing) for the figure £5 there shall be substituted the figure £6 and for the figure £8, wherever the same appears, the figures £10.

3. In Article 17 (2), as amended (Order of 31st May, 1951), (which provides for the supplementation of retired pay or pension for unemployable pensioners) for the figures £91 and 35s. there shall be substituted the figures £117 and 45s. respectively.

4. In Article 17 (3) (c), as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952), (which provides for the award of an additional allowance for a wife, husband or unmarried dependant living as a wife of an unemployable pensioner) for the figures £20 and 11s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures £29 and 15s. respectively.

5. In Article 17 (3) (d), as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952), (which provides for the award of an additional allowance for an adult dependant of an unemployable pensioner) for the figures £56, 21s. 6d. and £86 there shall be substituted the figures £65, 25s. and £95 respectively.

6. In Article 17 (3) (f), as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952), (which provides for the award of an additional allowance for the first child of an unemployable pensioner who is not an officer) for the figures 10s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures 11s. 6d.

7. In Article 18 (which provides for the award of allowances for lowered standard of occupation) for the figures 20s. there shall be substituted the figures 27s. 6d.

8. In Article 20 (3), as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952), (which provides for the award of an additional allowance to a member of the naval forces who is receiving approved treatment) for the figures 32s. 6d., wherever the same appear, there shall be substituted the figures 40s.

9. In Article 20 (4), as amended (Orders of 31st May, 1951, and 18th July, 1952), (which provides for the award of an additional allowance in respect of an eligible dependant of a member of the naval forces receiving approved treatment) for the figures £56, 21s. 6d. and 10s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures £65, 25s. and 11s. 6d. respectively.

10. In Article 20 (5), as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952), (which provides for the award of an additional allowance for an adult dependant of a member of the naval forces receiving approved treatment) for the figures £56, 21s. 6d. and £86 there shall be substituted the figures £65, 25s. and £95 respectively.

11. Paragraph (2) (a) of Article 26 (which provides for the award of a pension to a widow of an officer or rating) shall be deleted and there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"(a) at whichever of the rates specified in column (2) in Table 1 or column (2) in Table 2 in the Fourth Schedule is appropriate in her case—

(i) where she has attained the age of 40 years ; or

(ii) where she is in receipt of an allowance awarded in respect of a child of the officer or rating under Article 32, 34 or 36 ; or

(iii) where she was in receipt of an allowance awarded in respect of a child of the officer or rating under Article 32 of whom she is the mother—or was being treated under Article 2 (5) (b) as if she were in receipt of such an allowance for such a child—until the date, in either case, upon which the child attained the age of 16 years, or where in the opinion of the Minister in any other case, she should be so treated ; or

(iv) where the child in respect of whom she was awarded an allowance under Article 32 or 36 dies before attaining the age of 16 years, for a period of thirteen weeks beginning with the date of the child's death ; or

(v) where she is incapable of self-support ;".

12. In Article 29 (3), as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952), (which provides for the award of pensions for unmarried dependants living as wives) for the figures £113 and 34s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures £141 and 45s. respectively.

13. In Article 31 (2), as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952), (which provides for the award of pensions to widowers) for the figures £113 and 42s. there shall be substituted the figures £141 and 52s. 6d. respectively.

14. In Article 32 (which provides for the award of allowances in respect of children under the age limit)—

(a) in paragraphs (2) and (3) for the figures £36, £30 and 11s. there shall be substituted the figures £50 10s., £44 10s. and 16s. 6d. respectively ;

(b) in paragraph (5), as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952), for the figures £64, £49, £56, 15s. and 21s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures £86 10s., £62, £78 10s., 20s. and 30s. respectively.

15. In Article 33, as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952) (which provides for the award of pensions to motherless or fatherless children under the age limit) for the figures £64, £49, £56, 15s. and 21s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures £86 10s., £62, £78 10s., 20s. and 30s. respectively.

16. In Article 34 (3), as amended (Order of 18th July, 1952) (which provides for awards to or in respect of certain children who have attained the age of 18 years and are incapable of self-support) for the figures £84 10s. and 32s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures £104 and 40s. respectively.

17. In subparagraph (a) of Article 40 (3), as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952) (which prescribes the amounts of "disablement addition on a pension basis") for the figures £176 and £151 there shall be substituted the figures £210 and £185 respectively.

18. For the Tables in the Second Schedule, as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952) (which set out the amounts of the yearly rates of retired pay for disabled officers and the weekly rates of pensions for disabled ratings) there shall be substituted the Tables set out in the First Schedule to this Order.

19. For the Tables in the Third Schedule, as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952) (which set out the amounts of the gratuities or weekly allowances with or without terminal gratuities payable for disablement assessed at less than 20 per cent.) there shall be substituted the Tables set out in the Second Schedule to this Order.

20. For the Tables in the Fourth Schedule, as amended (Order of 29th April, 1952) (which set out the amounts of the yearly rates of pensions for widows of officers and the amounts of the weekly rates of pensions for widows of ratings) there shall be substituted the Tables set out in the Third Schedule to this Order.

21.—(1) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, this Order shall come into operation in relation to an officer on the 1st February, 1955, and in relation to a rating on the 31st January, 1955, so, however, that, in relation to any award payable

weekly, the said reference to the 31st January, 1955, where this is not the normal weekly pay day for that award, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following the 31st January, 1955.

(2) Articles 4, 5, 6, 8, 9 and 10 of this Order shall come into operation in relation to an officer on the 1st June, 1955, and in relation to a rating on the 18th May, 1955.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

1. This Order amends the Order of the 29th September, 1949, as amended by subsequent Orders.
2. The normal maximum rate of the allowances payable for constant attendance is increased from 25s. a week to 30s. a week in the case of ratings and the maxima, for exceptional cases of very severe disablement, from £130 a year to £156 a year in the case of officers and from 50s. a week to 60s. a week in the case of ratings. (Article 1.)
3. The allowances for wear and tear of clothing are increased from £5 and £8 a year to £6 and £10 a year respectively. (Article 2.)

4. The allowance for unemployable pensioners is increased from £91 a year in the case of officers and 35s. a week in the case of ratings to £117 a year and 45s. a week respectively. (Article 3.)
- 5.—(1) The additional allowance payable in respect of the wife or adult dependant of an unemployable pensioner and of a pensioner receiving approved treatment is increased from totals of £56 a year in the case of officers and 21s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings to totals of £65 a year and 25s. a week respectively. (Articles 4, 5, 9 and 10.)
- (2) The allowance for the first or only child of a rating pensioner who has been awarded a special allowance either on the grounds of unemployability or because, during a course of approved treatment, he is not entitled to sickness benefit under National

Insurance provisions is increased from 10s. 6d. a week to 11s. 6d. a week. (Articles 6 and 9.)

6. The maximum allowance for lowered standard of occupation is increased from 20s. a week to 27s. 6d. a week. (Article 7.)

7. The maximum of the additional personal treatment allowance payable to a pensioner who is not entitled to full sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions is increased from 32s. 6d. a week to 40s. a week. (Article 8.)

8. Provision is made to enable officers' and ratings' widows who are under 40 years of age and not incapacitated—and who, hitherto, have ceased to be entitled to higher scale pensions because their only or youngest child has attained the age limit for the payment of allowances—to retain their higher scale pensions. (Article 11.)

9. The pensions payable to unmarried dependants who have lived as wives of deceased members of the naval forces are increased from £113 a year in officer cases and 34s. 6d. a week in rating cases to £141 a year and 45s. a week respectively. (Article 12.)

10. The allowances payable to widows in respect of children are increased from £36 a year to £50 10s. a year in the case of officers (other than Commissioned Officers (Branch List)), from £30 a year to £44 10s. a year in the case of Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and from 11s. a week to 16s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings. (Article 14 (a).)

11. The rates of pensions or allowances payable to or in respect of the children of deceased members of the naval forces (such children having become motherless or having ceased to be under the control of their mother) are increased from £64 a year to £86 10s. a year in the case of children of officers (other than Commissioned Officers (Branch List)), from £49 or £56 a year to £62 or £78 10s. a year (according to the age of the child) in the case of children of Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and from 15s. or 21s. 6d. a week to 20s. or 30s. a week (according to the age of the child) in the case of children of ratings. (Articles 14 (b) and 15.)

12. The rates of pensions payable to motherless children who, having attained the age of 18 years, are incapable of self-support by reason of an infirmity which arose before they attained the normal age limit for pension purposes, are increased from £84 10s. a year to £104 a year in the case of children of officers and from 32s. 6d. a week to 40s. a week in the case of children of ratings. (Article 16.)

13. The maximum rates of "disablement addition on a pension basis" payable to certain officers in receipt of service retired pay are increased from £176 a year in the case of male officers and £151 a year in the case of women officers to £210 a year and £185 a year respectively. (Article 17.)

14. Articles 18, 19 and 20 substitute new Tables for those contained in the Second, Third and Fourth Schedules to the Order and have the general effect of providing—

(a) for increasing the rates of pensions in respect of 100 per cent. disablement by £34 a year in the case of officers and by 12s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings and for the rates of pensions for lower degrees of disablement to be increased proportionately;

(b) for increasing awards for cases of minor injuries and other cases of less than 20 per cent. disablement;

(c) for increasing the rates of pensions for certain widows by £28 a year in the case of officers and by 10s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings.

The Live Poultry (Restrictions) (Amendment) Order, 1954. (Made 31st December, 1954.)

This Order, which comes into operation on 17th January, 1955, amends the Live Poultry (Restrictions) Order, 1954. The principal changes are:—

(1) The expression "store poultry" is now so defined as to exclude only those geese that are under the age of nine days (instead of twenty-eight days as formerly).

(2) The movement of poultry to a licensed market, fair or sale of poultry intended for immediate slaughter is prohibited unless and until each bird has been marked in a prescribed manner.

(3) The prohibition on the movement of poultry, day old chicks and hatching eggs into the Isles of Scilly from any other part of Great Britain has been withdrawn but the area comprising Wales and certain West Midland counties of England into which the movement of live poultry from the rest of Great Britain is prohibited has been extended to include the Isles of Scilly and certain south-western and northern counties of England.

Statutory Instruments 1954 No. 1759.

The Live Poultry (Mid Lancashire) (Revocation) Order, 1954. (Made 31st December, 1954.)

This Order, which comes into operation on 1st February, 1955, revokes two Orders which prohibited the movement (except under licence) of poultry into, out of or within a specified area of Lancashire.
