MIDHURST RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Midhurst Rural District Council (South Pond Midhurst) Footpath Diversion Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 18th day of January, 1955, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Parishes of Midhurst and West Lavington.

The effect of the Order will be to extinguish that part of the public footpath running from South Pond to the Post Office in Grange Road from a point 80 yards south-west of its junction with the Chichester—Midhurst Road (A.286) at South Pond proceeding in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 40 yards, thence in a north-westerly direction for 60 yards, thence in a north-easterly direction for 100 yards, and substituting therefor a new length of public footpath commencing at a point on the before-mentioned public footpath 80 yards south-west of its junction with the Chichester—Midhurst Road (A.286) at South Pond and proceeding in a north-westerly and northerly direction for a distance of 100 yards to join the existing footpath at the point of termination of the length of public footpath proposed to be extinguished.

A certified copy of the Order and of the Map contained in the Order has been deposited at the offices of the Midhurst Rural District Council, North Street, Midhurst, Sussex, and will be open for inspection, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays (9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays).

Any objection or representation with reference to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, S.W.1, before the 28th day of February, 1955, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.
