*Horncastle Rural District Council (Coningsby) Diversion Order, 1955.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 18th day of January, 1955, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situated in the Parish of Coningsby.
