"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consents of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), of the Pastoral Committee of the diocese of Salisbury appointed pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949 (signified by a Resolution of the said Pastoral Committee dated the 29th day of July, 1954), and of the Reverend James Ramsbotham Davies, incumbent of the benefice of Bramshaw, and the Reverend John Evelyn Theodore Phillips, incumbent of the benefice of Saint Mary, Red Lynch (in witness whereof they have signed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Bramshaw and Saint Mary, Red Lynch, shall be altered so that (first) the whole of the extra-parochial place known as No Mary's Land Lynch, shall be altered so that (first) the whole of the extra-parochial place known as No Man's Land, which is delineated and coloured pink on the map annexed hereto, shall be annexed to and form part of the said parish of Bramshaw, and (secondly) all that part of the said parish of Saint Mary, Red Lynch, which is described in the Schedule hereto and is delineated and coloured green on the said map annexed hereto, shall be annexed to and form part of the said parish of Bramshaw.

- (1) An assistant curate or such other clerical or lay assistance as the bishop of the diocese shall from time to time direct shall be employed by the incumbent to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice to the intent that Divine Service shall be the benefic to the intent that Divine Service shall be the shared Service s be held in the chapel of Saint John the Evangelist at least once on each Sunday in the year and also on the days of the Feasts of the Nativity of Our Lord, the Epiphany, the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ and All Saints and also on Ash Wednesday and Good Eriday.
