"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme) of the Right Reverend Wilfred, Bishop of Gloucester, for effecting the unions of (1) the benefice of Chipping Sodbury and the benefice of Old with Little Sodbury) and (2) the benefice of Horton and the benefice of Little Sodbury), all of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Gloucester.

"(i) The benefice of Chipping Sodbury and the benefice of Old Sodbury, being part of the benefice of Old with Little Sodbury, shall be permanent of the benefice of Old with Little Sodbury, shall be permanent of the sodbury of the benefice. nently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of <sup>8</sup> The United Benefice of Chipping Sodbury and Old Sodbury', but the parishes of the said benefices shall remain in all respects distinct.

(ii) (a) If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the said benefice of Old with Little Sodbury shall be vacant the

union shall forthwith take effect.

(b) If upon that day the said benefice of Old with Little Sodbury shall be full the union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacation thereof.

(c) In either of the said events the first incumbent of the united benefice shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the Reverend Sidney Thomas, now incumbent of the benefice-

Sidney Thomas, now incumbent of the benefice of Chipping Sodbury, if he is at the relevant date incumbent of that benefice or if he is not then incumbent of that benefice shall be his successor (if any) at that date therein.

(iii) Without prejudice to the exercise, before the date when the union has taken effect, of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, the parsonage house belonging to the benefice of Chipping Sodbury shall if at that date it so belongs he the house shall, if at that date it so belongs, be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house (situate at Old Sodbury) belonging to the said benefice of Old with Little Sodbury and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Gloucester established pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"(iv) After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised wholly by the alternate patron of the benefice of Old with Little Sodbury who was sole patron of the benefice of Old Sodbury immediately prior to its union with the benefice of Little Sodbury.

"(v) Upon the union taking effect (a) the two rentcharges or stipends of £30 per annum each charged by deeds dated 18th July, 1822, and 19th April. 1860, upon the revenues of the former benefice of Old Sodbury and now charged upon the revenues of the benefice of Old with Little
