*Eton Rural District Council Parish of Denham (No. 1)
Diversion Order, 1955.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 8th day of February, 1955, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Denham.

The effect of the Order will be to divert that part of the public footpath from Oxford Road Denham at Redhill to Broken Gate Lane which commences approximately 739 feet from the "Public Footpath" notice in the grass verge adjoining the footpath on the north side of Oxford Road and runs in a straight line in a north westerly direction to the south west corner of a wood and thence in a straight line in a northerly direction towards Broken Gate Lane for a combined distance of 700 feet to a line commencing from the same point and running in a straight line in a westerly direction between two fences for a distance of approximately 217 feet to a stile and thence in a straight line in a northerly direction along the west side of a fence for a distance of approximately 556 feet.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at Oxford Road Post Office, Denham, Bucks and will be open for inspection between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. on Wednesdays.
