Monimeillan, July 15. On the first Instant divers Reapers were sent from hence to cut down the Corn that grew under the Command of our Cannon towards Formarin and Francain, with a Guard of 50 Men, where of 20 were Swifs Granadiers, to protest them from the French Forces which are posted on that side; They had not been long at work before a Detachment of 300 of the Enemy came out from Formarin to attack them; whereupon 100 Men were sent from our Garison to their French Forces which are posted on that state; They had not been long at work before a Detachment of 300 of the Enemy came out from Formarin to attack them; whereupon 100 Men were sent from our Garison to their Assistance, who repulsed the Enemy, and pursued them to their very Intrencements, killing; and wounding 70, and taking 12 Prisoners, with the Loss only of 3 Soldiers killed, and a Lieutenant and 6 Soldiers wounded, on our side. The 2d our Reapers were sent ont again to continue their Work, and had for their Guard a Company of Swifs Granadiers; The French sent out 200 Men against them, who attacked them on 3 several sides; but our Granadiers, after they had bestowed two of shee Nollies of small Shot upon them, put their Bayonets in the Mazzles of their Pieces, and made so resolute a Detence, that the Enemy were forced to retire with the Loss of three Captains, two Lieutenants, and 45 Soldiers, killed; and 2 Colonel, with 60 private Men, wounded: On our side a Lieutenant and 6 Granadiers were killed; and their Captain, two Serjeants, and 8 private Men, were wounded. This ill Success so discouraged the Enemy, that they suffered us to go on with our Harvest without any interruption: And now we thought it our turn to attack them. This was performed with so good Suces, that we beat their front, another to march round their Works, took their two Pieces of Cannon, which we brought home with us, and plundered their Camp, burning and destroying what we could not carry away. They had 3 Captains, 4 Lieutenants, and 100 Men, killed, 100 wounded, and to taken Prisoners. Our Loss did not exceed 40 private Men killed, and wounded, besides two Captains and two Lieutenants what were wounded. Our Men cannot be denied the Praise of saying in these several Occasions shewn all the Courage and Resolution imagicable, especially in the Jath, where 300 Men without any Artillery attacked above 700, who were very well intrenched, and had two Pieces of Cannon.

Turin, Magust 1. The Regiment of Schylemberg, which lay at Velliano, is marched to Ivrea, the Garison of which Place, consists at present of 10 Battalions.
