WAGES COUNCILS ACTS, 1945 TO 1948.

PIN, HOOK AND EYE, AND SNAP FASTENER WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Pin, Hook and Eye, and Snap Fastener Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Pin, Hook and Eye, and Snap Fastener Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1952 (Order O.(47)), as amended by the Pin, Hook and Eye, and Snap Fastener Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1954 (Order O.(52)) and (2) the revocation of Order O.(52).

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within fourteen days from 3rd May, 1955. PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT 1934.

In pursuance of section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act 1934, the Minister of Fuel and Power hereby gives notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations 1935 he has granted D'Arcy Exploration Company Limited, Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, E.C.2, two prospecting licences in respect of:—

(I) an area of one hundred and seventy-nine square miles in the counties of Chester, Flint and Lancaster and

(II) an area of one hundred and fifty-two square miles in the counties of Nottingham, Leicester and Rutland.

Descriptions of the boundaries of these areas were published in the London Gazette of 7th May, 1940 and 5th June, 1945 respectively.
