The Minister of Labour and National Service hereby gives notice that he has made Rules under section 2 (1) of the Anthrax Prevention Act, 1919, increasing the fee payable by importers of infected goods in respect of the disinfection thereof at the Government Wool Disinfecting Station (Ministry of Labour and National Service), Liverpool, from 2½d. to 3d. per lb. of material calculated on the weight of the material before disinfection.

The Rules which come into force on the 1st August, 1955, are entitled the Anthrax Disinfection Fee (Amendment) Rules, 1955, and may be purchased directly from H.M. The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF DISTRICT (ESTATE) OFFICERS IN THE FORESTRY COMMISSION.

1. Age.

Candidates must have been born on or before 1st July, 1934. There is no upper age limit, but in appointing persons in a permanent capacity Departments expect regular and effective service for a reasonable period, and the Commissioners will take this requirement into account.

2. Sex.

Men only may compete under these Regulations.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either:—

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Qualifications.

Candidates must at the time of application either (a) be Corporate Members of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors or of the Chartered Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute or of the Land Agents' Society, or

(b) have passed a degree or other examinations necessary for obtaining Corporate Membership of one of the above Institutions, or

(c) have a university degree in Estate Management.

Candidates admitted under heads (b) or (c) will not have their appointments confirmed unless they obtain Corporate Membership of one of the Institutions listed in (a) above within their probation period. Exceptionally where a candidate is prevented by circumstances outside his control from obtaining Corporate Membership within this period, the appointment may be confirmed, with the concurrence of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners provided that there is satisfactory evidence that the qualification is likely to be obtained within a reasonable time.

Candidates who propose to sit in midsummer 1955 for the final examination for one of the qualifications mentioned above may be provisionally admitted to the competition. Such candidates may be declared successful provisionally but they would not be appointed unless on the result of the examination they obtained the prescribed qualification.

5. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. Competition.

The candidates who appear from their applications to have the best qualifications and experience will be invited to interview in London before a Selection Board, which will recommend to the Civil Service Commissioners those considered most suitable for appointment. The Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of education and experience, recommendations from referees named by the candidates, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

7. Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.
