In Order to the Electing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland

WHEREAS We have in Our Council thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, on Tuesday the seventh day of June next ensuing the date hereof: In order, thereof June next ensuing the date hereof: In older, therefore, to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet in the Great Hall of Parliament House, in Edinburgh, on Monday the twenty-third day of May instant at Twelve o'clock Noon to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law); and the Lord Clerk Register or the Principal Clerk of Session or, in the absence of both these Officers from any cause, such person as may be designated for the purpose by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, is hereby required to attend such Meeting and to take the Votes of the said Peers and immediately after such Election made and duly examined to certify the names of the Sixteen Peers so elected and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Lord Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said City, to take especial care to preserve the Peace thereof during the time of the said Election, and to prevent all manner of Riots, Tumults, Disorders and Violence whatsoever: And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Ten Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such Election.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bristol (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme) for effecting the union of the benefice of Saint Paul for effecting the union of the benefice of Saint Paul with Saint Clement, Bristol, and the Benefice of Saint Barnabas, Bristol, both situate in the diocese of Bristol.

"(b) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said church of Saint Barnabas, Bristol, shall not be sold, but shall, in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures and as the Bishop of the diocese may direct, be transferred to the church of Saint Paul, Bristol, being the parish church of the united parish, or to some other church or churches within the said diocese and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint Barnabas, Bristol, or such of them as the Bishop shall select, shall be removed to the parish church of the united parish or to any other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the Bishop may direct or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be placed to the credit of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Bristol as aforesaid.

"7. Diversion of Endowment Income.

"(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the Second Schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £592 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Bristol.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £592 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the

of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof. production thereof.

"FIRST SCHEDULE.

"Purposes for which the church of Saint Barnabas, Purposes for which the church of Saint Barnabas, Bristol, may be used upon its becoming vested in the diocesan board of finance of the diocese of Bristol under the provisions of subsection (1) of section 2 of the Union of Benefices (Disused Churches) Measure, 1952, by reason of its appropriation to other uses, and conditions to which such use is which use is subject.

"1. The diocesan board of finance of the diocese of Bristol (hereinafter called 'the Board', shall allow the church of Saint Barnabas, Bristol, to be used under the management of the local education authority as an assembly hall for pupils attending the Saint Barnabas City Road Primary School or such other Schools within the area under the jurisdiction of the local education authority as the said authority with the consent of the Board may determine.

of the local education authority as the said authority with the consent of the Board may determine.

"2. For the purpose of giving effect to the foregoing provision the Board shall have power to enter into any agreement or agreements with the said local education authority and such agreement or agreements shall embody such terms and conditions regarding the use and maintenance of the said church as the Board shall think fit; provided that the provisions of any such agreement or agreements shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of this Scheme.

"3. No alterations in or additions to the fabric of the said church shall be made except with the consent of the Board and in accordance with and subject to lawful authority.
