HAILSHAM RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Hailsham Rural District (Hellingly Right of Way No. 59) Diversion Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Orders were made on the 25th day of July, 1955, and are about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation. The Orders relate to land adjoining Court Lane and Manor Road in the Parish of Wick and Abson.
