The Scheme affects lands in the Parishes of Amptill, Maulden, Flitwick, Millbrook, Steppingley, Lidlington, and Ridgmont.

Mersey River Board Area.

In pursuance of sub-section (3) of Section 6 of the River Boards Act, 1948, the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food hereby gives notice that the

Mersey River Board have made application under the said sub-section that the map approved under sub-section (2) of the said Section showing the extent of the main river for the purposes of Part II of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, be varied by the addition to the said main river of:—

(1) Fine Jane's Brook, from a point south-east of Ainsdale to its confluence with Downholland Brook.

(1A) An un-named watercourse from Heathy Lane through Barton Moss to its confluence with Fine Jane's Brook.

(1B) An un-named watercourse from Headbolt Lane to its confluence with Fine Jane's Brook near Gettern Farm.

(2) A watercourse named Worsley Brook and Saltey Brook, from the railway culvert west of Eccles to its outfall into the Manchester Ship Canal.

And by the deletion from the said main river of:—

(3) The un-named watercourse from Berrys Lane, St. Helens, to its confluence with Sutton Brook.

A plan on which the proposed variations are shown has been deposited at the office of the Town Clerk, Municipal Buildings, Liverpool, 2, and at the offices of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, Someries House, St. Andrew's Place, Regent's Park, London, N.W.1, for public inspection, for a period of thirty-five days from the date of this notice and may be inspected during normal office hours. A copy of the statutory map of the River Board Area on which is shown the existing main river may also be inspected at the above mentioned addresses.

Catchment Area.*
