

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way crossing the Woodstock Branch Railway Line where a wooden footbridge previously existed to the east of the existing brick bridge, and running in a northerly direction from a point on the north-west corner of O.S. No. 68 (Oxfordshire Sheet XXVII.5) 1939 Edition across the said railway line to a point on the southern boundary of O.S. No. 69 (Oxfordshire Sheet XXVII.5) 1939 Edition; to a line running across the occupation bridge, constructed of brick, and crossing the Woodstock Branch Railway Line, from a point near to Railway Cottages, Shipton-on-Cherwell, and thence in a north-westerly direction across the said railway line, towards Manor Farm, Shipton-on-Cherwell to link up with public footpath No. 9 on the Survey Map of rights of way for the said parish.

A certified copy of the Order and the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the Council Offices, Waverley House, Bicester, Oxon, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

Any objection or representation with reference to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 30th day of September, 1955, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.

ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY OF NORTHAMPTON.

Survey of Public Rights of Way.

Rural District of Brixworth.

NOTICE is hereby given that the County Council of the Administrative County of Northampton have prepared in accordance with section 30 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, a provisional map and statement of footpaths, bridleways and roads used as public paths for every parish in the Rural District of Brixworth.

A copy of every such provisional map and statement has been deposited at the offices of the Brixworth Rural District Council, Council Offices, Brixworth, and is available for inspection free of charge to all persons interested between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and between 2.30 p.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays, other than Saturdays and public holidays, and between 9.30 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

At any time within 28 days after the publication of this notice, the owner, lessee or occupier of any land shown on any such provisional map, being land on which the map shows a public path, or a road used as a public path, may apply to quarter sessions for a declaration—

(a) that at the relevant date mentioned in the provisional statement there was no public right of way over the land;

(b) that the rights conferred on the public at that date by the public right of way over the land were such rights as may be specified in the application, and not such rights as are indicated in the provisional map and statement;

(c) that the position or width of that part of the land over which the public right of way subsisted at the said date was as specified in the application, and not as indicated in the provisional map and statement; or

(d) that the public right of way over the land at the said date was not unconditional but was subject to limitations or conditions specified in the

application, or, if the said right is indicated in the provisional statement as being subject to limitations or conditions, that the said right was subject to other limitations or conditions specified in the application either in addition to or in substitution for those indicated in the provisional statement.

Any such application should be made in accordance with The Public Rights of Way (Applications to Quarter Sessions) Regulations, 1952, and the notice required by Regulation 2 (1) should be addressed to the Clerk of the Peace, County Hall, Northampton.

EASINGTON RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Easington Rural District Council (Shotton Footpath) Extinguishment Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 18th day of August, 1955, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish the public right of way from a point south of Keen's Shop in Carlyle Crescent, Shotton Colliery, in a south-westerly direction to a point in Bridge Road 47 yards west of its junction with Carlyle Crescent, a distance of 100 yards. This right of way will be closed as from the 30th September, 1955.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Easington, Co. Durham, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays and 9 a.m. and 12 noon Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 26th day of August, 1955, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
