SCHEDULE.

Variations in the By-laws of the Royal Institute OF CHEMISTRY REFERRED TO IN THE FOREGOING ORDER.

Delete existing By-laws 2, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 60, 62, 63, 64 and 91, and the headings to Chapters VI and VII of the By-laws, and substitute the following new By-laws and headings therefor:—

"2. In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise

(a) Expressions referring to the Institute, corporate members, Fellows, Associates, the Council and Meetings of the Institute are to be construed as having reference to The Royal Institute of Chemistry, corporate members, Fellows, Associates, the Council and Meetings of the Royal Institute of Chemistry; provided that the expressions "corporate member" or "corporate members" used in these By-laws shall not relate to any Honorary Fellow unless specifically provided.

(b) Expressions referring to non-corporate members are to be construed as having reference to the persons affiliated to the Institute of the grades mentioned in By-law 49.

(c) Words defined in the Charter have the meanings there defined.

"CHAPTER VI.—Admission and Privileges of Non-Corporate Members.

"49. (1) There shall be two classes of persons affiliated to the Institute but not corporate members thereof, namely, Graduate Members constituting the grade of Graduate Membership, and Student Members constituting the grade of Student Membership.

(2) No person shall be eligible for admission as a non-corporate member unless he is a British subject or a Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of the Republic of Ireland. Provided that citizens of a country, the subjects of which were formerly British subjects or Commonwealth citizens, which has been approved for that purpose by the Institute in General Meeting, may also be eligible for admission.

(3) Subject to such conditions and regulations as the Council may from time to time prescribe with regard to training and examinations and other matters, the Council may admit to either grade of non-

regard to training and examinations and other matters, the Council may admit to either grade of non-corporate membership any person who is eligible under section (2) of this By-law.

(4) Every Student of the Institute under the By-laws in force immediately before the making of this By-law shall, until a day which shall be appointed by the Council, continue as a Student of the Institute and retain such privileges but be subject to such obligations, conditions and provisions in all respects as he would have had or would have been subject to if such By-laws had continued in force until the day so appointed, and every power of making regulations under such By-laws shall continue to exist until that day.

"50. (1) Every non-corporate member who is not in arrear with the payment of his annual subscription shall be entitled to attend the Meetings of the Institute other than Annual and Special General Meetings and

other than Annual and Special General Meetings and to such other privileges as the Council may from time to time grant to members in each grade, of non-

corporate membership.

(2) A non-corporate member shall not be entitled to

vote at any Meeting.

"51. (1) The Registrar (or other specified Administrative Officer) shall keep a Register of non-corporate members containing separate lists of the names of Graduate Members and Student Members, with their dates of admission and addresses and such other par-ticulars as may from time to time be prescribed by

the Council.

(2) The Registrar (or other specified Administrative Officer) shall cause to be entered in the Register any change of address of any non-corporate member of

change of address of any non-corporate member of which notice has been given to him by such member. "52. (1) In as much as membership of a non-corporate grade is intended only for those preparing for admission to corporate membership the membership of any Student Member who has not qualified for and applied for admission to Graduate Membership or of any Graduate Member who has not qualified for and applied for admission to Associateship within such respective periods of time as the Council may prescribe may be terminated by the Council with effect from the Thirty-first day of December in any year.

December in any year.

(2) The Council in their discretion may at any time, and without assigning any reason therefor, terminate the membership of any non-corporate member if in their opinion it is inadvisable that he should continue to be a non-corporate member of

(3) When any non-corporate member is notified by letter, sent to his registered address, of the removal of his name from the Register he shall, as at the date specified in such letter, cease to be a non-corporate member and to be entitled to any of the privileges thereof.

"CHAPTER VII.—Examinations and other Forms of Assessment.

"53.
