

to time be authorised; and the Council shall prepare and publish such regulations for these purposes as they think fit, and shall determine the fees, if any, which shall be paid or deposited by candidates in respect of such examinations or other forms of assessment including the assessment of claims for exemption from any examination or part of any examination; and the Council may from time to time as they think fit rescind, vary or add to any of the said regulations.

"60. (1) All Annual Subscriptions payable under the Charter or these By-laws shall be payable on the First day of January in each year, provided that

(a) a person who is not already a corporate or non-corporate member shall on application for admission to any grade of corporate or non-corporate membership deposit a sum equal to the Annual Subscription that would have been payable by him if he had been a member in that grade on the First day of January in the year in which he makes such application, which sum shall on his admission be taken in discharge of his liability for payment of any Annual Subscription until after the Thirty-first day of December in the year in which he is admitted or, if such admission takes place after the Thirtieth day of September in any year, until after the Thirty-first day of December in the next succeeding year;

(b) if at any time during a year a non-corporate or corporate member be admitted to a higher grade of non-corporate or corporate membership, he shall not be required to pay in respect of that year any Annual Subscription other than that applicable to his grade of membership on the First day of January in that year.

(2) The Council may terminate or suspend the liability of any corporate member to pay further Annual Subscriptions after reaching such age and/or after payment of such number of Annual Subscriptions as the Council may from time to time prescribe.

"62. (1) The Annual Subscription of an Associate shall be such sum, not exceeding Eight Guineas, as shall on the recommendation of the Council be determined from time to time by a General Meeting.

(2) The Council may receive a Life Subscription from any Associate who has reached such age and/or paid such number of Annual Subscriptions as the Council may from time to time prescribe. Provided that such Life Subscription shall be a sum equal to that which would have been payable by him as a Life Subscription if he had been a Fellow at the time of payment, and thereupon the liability to pay an Annual Subscription shall cease irrespective of whether he remains an Associate or subsequently becomes a Fellow.

"63. The Annual Subscription of a Graduate Member shall be such sum not exceeding Six Guineas, and that of a Student Member such sum not exceeding Three Guineas, as shall be determined from time to time by regulation to be made by the Council.

"64. The Council shall prescribe from time to time the Entrance Fee, if any, which (in addition to such other fees and subscriptions as may be due under these By-laws) is to be deposited on application for admission, or paid on admission, to each grade of corporate membership (other than that of an Honorary Fellow). Provided that the amount of such Entrance Fee in respect of each such grade shall not exceed Twenty Guineas.

"91. A non-corporate member shall be deemed to be attached to the Local Section (if any) within the area of which his registered address is situate, and any non-corporate member so attached, and who is not in arrear with the payment of his Annual Subscription, shall be entitled to attend such Meetings of the Section as the Committee of the Section may decide, and shall have such other privileges as that Committee may from time to time grant, but he shall not be entitled to vote at any Meeting thereof."
