“SCHEME.

“Whereas we are satisfied that the right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice is at present exercisable alternately by Martha Bentley of 43, Alexandra Road, Peterborough, in the County of Huntingdon, Widow, and by the Bishop of Ely for the time being:

“And whereas the said Martha Bentley desires to transfer her interest in the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Ely for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

“And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said interest in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice, shall be transferred to the said Edward, Bishop of Ely, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Ely for the time being.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ely.

“We, the Church Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Westminster Abbey Measure, 1929, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme relating to the Dean and Chapter of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster, of which Corporation Your Majesty is Visitor:

“Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Sixth in Council bearing date the twenty-fourth day of May, 1950, and relating to the Dean and Chapter of the said Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster, which Order was published in the London Gazette on the thirtieth day of May, 1950, it was provided that for the period of five years from the twenty-ninth day of September, 1949, there should continue to be paid out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter, firstly, to the Fabric Fund the annual sum of £3,250; secondly, for the yearly stipends of the Dean and the five Canons, the annual sum of £9,600, being £3,000 for the Dean, £1,200 for each of the two Canons to whose canonries Rectories are annexed and £1,400 for each of the other three Canons and that these payments should be taken to include and cover any compensation allowance or expense incurred by reason of the suspension of a Canonry and the reduction of the number of Canons from six to five; and thirdly, that the residue of the said annual income should be applied to the maintenance of the services of Westminster Abbey and other expenses of the Dean and Chapter:

“And whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Sixth in Council bearing date the thirtieth day of April, 1942, which Order was published in the London Gazette on the first day of May, 1942, it was further provided that from and after the twenty-fifth day of December, 1941, in respect of any period during which the deanery or any canonry might be vacant for over three months the sums otherwise applicable out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter for the stipend of the Dean or of that Canon should be added to the Fabric Fund:

“And whereas by virtue of an Order made by us, the said Church Commissioners, under the Reorganisation Areas Measure, 1944, notice of the making of which Order was published in the London Gazette on the twenty-fourth day of November, 1950, the Rectory of Saint John the Evangelist, Westminster, being one of the two Rectories to which Canonries were annexed, has ceased to exist:

“And whereas it appears to us, the said Church Commissioners, to be expedient that the provisions

of the said Orders in Council should, save as herein-after varied, continue in force for a further period:

"Now we, the said Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the said Westminster Abbey Measure, 1929, and after consultation as thereby prescribed with the Dean and Chapter of Westminster and with the approval of the Right Honourable David Patrick Maxwell Viscount Kilmuir, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, exercising the authority of Your Majesty as Visitor as aforesaid, such approval being testified by his signature and seal being subscribed and affixed to this Scheme, do humbly recommend and propose that from and after the twenty-ninth day of September, 1954, first, there shall continue to be paid to the Fabric Fund out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter an annual sum of £3,250; secondly, there shall be applied out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter (next after the provision of the lastly-mentioned annual sum of £3,250) the annual sum of £9,800 for the yearly stipends of the Dean and the five Canons, being £3,000 for the Dean, £1,200 for the Canon to whose Canonry is annexed the Rectory of Saint Margaret, Westminster, and £1,400 for each of the other four Canons, and that these payments shall be taken to include and cover any compensation allowance or expense incurred by reason of the suspension of a Canonry and the reduction of the number of Canons from six to five; and thirdly, that the residue of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter after the specific appropriations hereinbefore directed shall be appropriated and applied to the maintenance of the services of Westminster Abbey and other expenses of the Dean and Chapter; and that each of the foregoing provisions shall continue in force only for a further period of three years from the twenty-ninth day of September, 1954:

"Provided that where the deanery or any canonry has been vacant for a period of three consecutive months, then as respects any period thereafter during which the vacancy continues, the sums hereinbefore directed to be applied out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter for the stipend of the Dean or of that Canon, as the case may be, shall not be so applied; and as respects that period the annual sums hereinbefore directed to be paid out of the said income to the Fabric Fund shall be increased by an amount equal to the sums which would, but for this proviso, be applicable as respects that period for the said stipend:

"And we, the said Church Commissioners, further recommend and propose that the Dean and Chapter of Westminster may defray out of the Fabric Fund the whole or any part of the rates in respect of the official residences of the Dean and Canons of Westminster:

"And we further recommend and propose that the Dean and Chapter of Westminster shall annually within three months after the close of the year to which they relate send to us, the said Church Commissioners, the Capitular accounts in full."

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of London.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Stretton, Bishop of Lichfield, (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), have prepared and now

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions of (1) the benefice and parish of Wolverhampton and a part of the benefice and parish of Saint James, Wolverhampton, and (2) the benefice and parish of Saint Stephen, Wolverhampton, and the remaining part of the benefice and parish of Saint James, Wolverhampton, all situate in the diocese of Lichfield.

"SCHEME.

"1. The said benefice and parish of Wolverhampton and the part (containing the parish church and shown by the pink colour on the map annexed hereto) of the said benefice and parish of Saint James, Wolverhampton, which lies to the south-west of the middle of the Stour Valley Branch Line of the British Railways (London Midland Region) shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wolverhampton' and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. The said benefice and parish of Saint Stephen, Wolverhampton, and the remaining part (shown by the green colour on the map annexed hereto) of the said benefice and parish of Saint James, Wolverhampton, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint Stephen, Wolverhampton', and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"3. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Canon John Brierley if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Wolverhampton shall, with his consent, (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice of Wolverhampton and the Reverend Percy Bourne if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Stephen, Wolverhampton, shall, with his consent, (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice of Saint Stephen, Wolverhampton.

"4. Upon the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect the parish church of the parish of Wolverhampton shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"5. Upon the union referred to in Clause 1 of the Scheme taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the church of Saint James, Wolverhampton, shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of Wolverhampton.

"6. Upon the union referred to in Clause 1 of the Scheme taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Wolverhampton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"7. Upon the said unions taking effect and with the consents of the Right Reverend Stretton, Bishop of Lichfield, the Reverend Canon John Brierley, Rector of Wolverhampton, and of the Venerable William Alonzo Parker, Archdeacon of Stafford, being the patrons of the benefice of Saint James, Wolverhampton, and of the said Right Reverend Stretton, Bishop of Lichfield, as patron of the benefice of Wolverhampton, and of the benefice of Saint Stephen, Wolverhampton, (in testimony whereof the respective patrons have signed this Scheme), the patronage of the said benefice of Saint James, Wolverhampton, shall be surrendered in favour of the said Stretton, Bishop of Lichfield, and his successors, Bishops of Lichfield, and the patronage of the united benefices shall belong wholly to the Bishop for the time being of the diocese of Lichfield.

"8. (a) As soon as conveniently may be after the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme has taken effect the church of Saint James, Wolverhampton, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

"(b) The net proceeds arising from such sale or sales after payment of all expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the church and all other expenses incidental to these matters shall be

added to the Expenses Fund of the said diocese established pursuant to the 32nd section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"(c) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of Holy Communion in the said church of Saint James, Wolverhampton, shall not be sold but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the bishop of the diocese shall direct be transferred to some other church or churches within the said diocese and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint James, Wolverhampton, or such of them as the said bishop shall select, shall also be removed to some other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the bishop may direct or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said church of Saint James, Wolverhampton, as aforesaid.

"9. Upon the said unions taking effect, the endowments and property at present belonging to the said benefice of Saint James, Wolverhampton, shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, the endowments and property specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Wolverhampton, and the endowments and property specified in Part II of the said schedule shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Saint Stephen, Wolverhampton.

"10. Upon the said unions taking effect

"(a) provision shall be made by the incumbent of the united benefice of Wolverhampton for obtaining the services of a second assistant curate to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice or other clerical or lay assistance in lieu of the services of a second assistant curate as aforesaid and a part of the endowment of the said united benefice, namely an annual sum of £150 being part of a larger annual sum payable by us shall be appropriated by us as a fund towards meeting the cost of providing such curate or assistance, and

"(b) provision shall be made by the incumbent of the united benefice of Saint Stephen, Wolverhampton, for obtaining the services of an assistant curate to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice or other clerical or lay assistance in lieu of the services of an assistant curate as aforesaid and a part of the endowment of the said united benefice, namely an annual sum of £100 being part of a larger annual sum payable by us shall be appropriated by us as a fund towards meeting the cost of providing such curate or assistance,

and the said two funds shall be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the said diocese as trustees to apply each fund accordingly.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"Part I.

"(Endowments and property at present belonging to the benefice of Saint James, Wolverhampton, to be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Wolverhampton upon the unions taking effect.)

"(1) Permanent charge of £200 per annum on the Church Commissioners' General Fund.

"(2) The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Saint James, Wolverhampton.

"Part II.

"(Endowments at present belonging to the benefice of Saint James, Wolverhampton, to be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Saint Stephen, Wolverhampton, upon the unions taking effect.)

"(1) Permanent charge of £152 per annum on the Church Commissioners' General Fund.

"(2) A capital sum of £2,344 7s. 8d. held by the Church Commissioners.

"(3) All other the endowments and property at present belonging to the benefice of Saint James, Wolverhampton."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Saint John, Blackford, and the benefice of Scaleby shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Blackford with Scaleby', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.*

"(a) If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the benefice of Blackford shall be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect.

"(b) If upon that day the said benefice of Blackford shall be full the union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacation thereof.

"(c) In either of the said events the first incumbent of the united benefice shall, with his consent (testified by his signature to this Scheme), be the Reverend John Thomlinson Donaldson, now incumbent of the benefice of Scaleby if he is at the relevant date incumbent of that benefice, or, if he is not then incumbent of that benefice, shall be his successor (if any) at that date therein.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Without prejudice to the exercise, before the date when the union shall take effect, of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Scaleby shall, if at that date it so belongs, be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Saint John, Blackford, if at that date it so belongs, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be appropriated and held by us for the augmentation of the endowment of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Scaleby having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.* The united benefice shall be in the Archdeaconry of Carlisle and the Rural Deanery of Brampton."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Exeter (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Lower Brixham and the benefice of Brixham, both situate in the diocese of Exeter.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Lower Brixham and the benefice of Brixham shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Brixham, All Saints and St. Mary', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Herbert Thomas Yeomans, if he is then the incumbent of both of the said benefices of Lower Brixham and

Brixham shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice, and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an admission solely to the benefice of Lower Brixham.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Brixham shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Clerical or lay assistance.* Upon the union taking effect the incumbent of the united benefice shall, in order to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, employ a curate or such other clerical or lay assistance as the bishop of the diocese shall from time to time direct.

"5. *Diversion of Endowment Income.*

"(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £550 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the said diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Exeter.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £550 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

"SCHEDULE.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income of the united benefice shall without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:—

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us and any other person or body,

"and (2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof,

"and by deducting therefrom:—

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent,

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

"(b) that the said capital sum of £1,500 together with all interest thereon shall be appropriated and held by us as a fund for or towards the cost of providing a house of residence for the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Luke the Evangelist with Saint Simon and Saint Jude, West Kilburn, in the said diocese of London.

"2. The provisions of Clause 9 of the original Order shall be amended to provide that the residue of the proceeds of the sale of the site and materials of the Church of Kilburn, Saint Paul, together with all interest thereon shall be appropriated and held by us as a fund for and towards the cost of rebuilding the church of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Kilburn in the said diocese of London, which church has been severely damaged by enemy action."

"1. *Union of Benefices and Parishes.* The benefice of Woodhouse, Saint Mark, and the benefice of Buslingthorpe shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Woodhouse, Saint Mark', and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.
