The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under sections 1 and 19 of the Import Duties Act 1932, section 10 of the Finance Act, 1934, and section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz. :—

The Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 9) Order, 1955.

Siloxanes, whether polymerised or not, and certain mixtures containing 50 per cent. or more by weight of siloxanes are exempt from duty chargeable under the Import Duties Act, 1932.

This Order extends the exemption to cover all such mixtures, and comes into operation on the 29th September, 1955. It has been published as Statutory Instruments 1955, No. 1473.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1951.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATION.

(Conrad Spencer Whitehouse.)

Whereas Conrad Spencer Whitehouse, M.B., M.R.C.S., whose registered address is 11, Handsworth New Road, Birmingham, 18, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1951:

And whereas the said Conrad Spencer Whitehouse cannot in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any drug or preparation to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, apply:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 29 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, I hereby withdraw from the said Conrad Spencer Whitehouse the authorisation conferred by the said Regulations upon him to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, apply:

And I hereby direct that it shall not be lawful for the said Conrad Spencer Whitehouse to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953.

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

In pursuance of section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, the Minister of Fuel and Power gives notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, he has granted to D'Arcy Exploration Co. Ltd., Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, E.C.2, nine prospecting licences, details of which are as follows:—

- (1) an area of about 195 square miles in the county of Gloucester.
- (2) an area of about 193 square miles in the counties of Gloucester and Somerset.
- (3) an area of about 196 square miles in the counties of Gloucester, Somerset and Wiltshire.
- (4) an area of about 181 square miles in the county of Wiltshire.
- (5) an area of about 192 square miles in the counties of Berkshire, Oxford and Buckingham.
- (6) an area of about 183 square miles in the counties of Buckingham and Oxford.
- (7) an area of about 172 square miles in the counties of Wiltshire and Oxford.
- (8) an area of about 179 square miles in the counties of Wiltshire, Southampton and Berkshire.
- (9) an area of about 187 square miles in the counties of Berkshire and Southampton.
