On 19th June, 1955, at about 21.30 hours, a hand-grenade was thrown through the window into the "Palms Bar," Famagusta. At that time, about ten British Service personnel were seated at the bar, among them being Corporal O'Connor. The grenade struck the corporal on the left shoulder. Turning, he saw the grenade lying on the floor near the bar, a short length of ignited safety fuse protruding from it. Corporal O'Connor shouted to everyone to take cover, picked up the grenade and attempted to throw it out of the window. Unfortunately, it hit the window sill, fell to the floor and exploded. After the incident, evidence showed the missile to have been a No. 36 M.H.E. Mills hand-grenade. The walls of the room in the vicinity of the explosion were badly pitted by splinters from the grenade but everyone had been able to take cover and no one was injured. In endeavouring to dispose of the grenade whilst the fuse was burning, Corporal O'Connor acted with commendable courage and great presence of mind. His prompt action undoubtedly averted grave injury, or possibly foss of life, among those who were near the point where the grenade first fell. first fell.
