DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS, 1953. SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(Thomas Bertram Whitehead.)

Whereas the authorities conferred by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, on Thomas Bertram Whitehead, M.B., Ch.B., by virtue of his being a duly qualified medical practitioner to be in possession of and to supply the drugs and preparations to which

those Regulations apply were, the said Thomas Bertram Whitehead having been convicted of offences serram Whitenead having been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1951, withdrawn in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 29 of the aforesaid Regulations by Notices published in the London Gazette and the Edinburgh Gazette on the 31st day of July, 1953, the registered address of the said Thomas Bertram Whitehead being then 144, Grange Avenue, Oldham: Oldham:

In pursuance of section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, the Minister of Fuel and Power hereby gives notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, he has granted to D'Arcy Exploration Co. SCHEDULE.

1. An area of 194 sq. miles in the County of York.

Northern Boundary.

From Burton Salmon the boundary follows the road through Hillam and Gateforth to the junction road through Hillam and Gateforth to the junction with A.19 near Sandhill Farm. It continues along A.19 as far as Burn Cottage and thence via the road to Pears Bridge at the junction with A.1041 which it follows through Camblesforth and Carlton to Snaith. It leaves Snaith by way of A.645 which it follows to the junction with A.614 and continues along the latter road to Booth Ferry Road Goole Road, Goole.

Eastern Boundary.

This leaves Goole by A.161 which it follows to Warpingdrain Bridge. Thence it runs along Quay Lane to the junction with the railway south of Paddock House and continues along the railway via Reedness Junction, through Crowle till it meets Double Rivers.

Southern Boundary

This follows Double Rivers to Dirtness Bridge and proceeds by way of North Idle Drain to the cross roads at Sandtoft. Thence it follows the road through Hatfield to Stainforth Junction and continues along the railway to South Elmsall station.

Western Boundary

From South Elmsall station the boundary fol-lows the railway via Brackenhill Junction, through Pontefract and on to the junction with A.645 near Longbull Hill. Thence it follows A.1 through Ferrybridge to the junction with A.162 in Brotherton and continues along A.162 to the commencement of the Northern Boundary.

An area 194 sq. miles in the Counties of York, Derby and Nottingham.

Northern Boundary.

From Rotherham the boundary runs by way of A.6021 and A.631 through Tickhill to Bawtry. Thence it follows the road through Misson to Sanderson's Bank and on past Bank House to the junction with the railway at Craiselound.

This follows the railway through Beckingham to the junction with the Flood Road north east of Saundby. It continues along the road through Saundby and Sturton le Steeple to the junction with the railway at Leverton Station.

Southern Boundary.

This follows the railway to the point where A.1 This follows the railway to the point where A.1 crosses the railway in East Retford. It continues along A.1 as far as Ordsall and proceeds by way of Goosemoor Lane to the junction with B.6387 which it follows to the junction with B.6420 south west of Babworth. Thence it runs along A.620 to Ranby and on by Thievesdale Lane to Sandhill Cottages. It enters Worksop by A.57 and leaves by A.60. From West Wood it follows A.619 over Whitwell Common to the junction with A.618 along which it runs to the outskirts of Killamarsh. It continues along the road through Mosbrough It continues along the road through Mosbrough to Gleadless.

Western Boundary.

This follows the road through Intake, Handsworth and Catcliffe to the point where the railway crosses the road at Canklow Bridge. Thence it runs by way of A.631 and B.6066 to the commencement of the Northern Boundary.

3. An area of 194 sq. miles in the County of York.

Northern Boundary.

From the railway junction approximately one-third mile N.N.W. of Moorthorpe station the third mile N.N.W. of Moorthorpe station the boundary follows the railway through Hampole to Stainforth Junction. Thence it runs along the road through Hatfield and on till it meets North Idle Drain which it follows to Dirtness Bridge. Thence it follows Double Rivers to the junction with the railway approximately one-third mile north of North Moor Farm. Eastern Boundary.

This follows the railway from the end of the orthern boundary through Epworth to Northern Craiselound.

Southern Boundary.

This follows the road over North Idle Drain, past Bank House and then turns south along the road to Misson. It continues by way of A.614 to Bawtry and on by A.631 through Tickhill, Maltby and Bramley to Rotherham.

Western Boundary.
From Rotherham the boundary follows A.633 to the point where it crosses the former L.M.S. railway. It continues along the railway through Thurnscoe to the commencement of the northern

 An area of approximately 200 sq. miles in the Counties of Nottingham, Derby, Leicester and Stafford.

Northern Boundary.

From Bridge Gate, Derby, the boundary runs by way of A.61 and A.52 to Borrowash and thence by A.6005 to Long Eaton where it turns in a south westerly direction along A.453 through Sawley to Harrington Bridge. Then it follows the south bank of the River Trent to Thrumpton Ferry where it continues by road through Thrumpton Village and on past Barton Lodge to Ruddington station.

Eastern Boundary.

This follows the railway from Ruddington station to Rushcliffe Halt whence it takes the road to East Leake and West Leake to Kegworth station. From here it follows the railway through Sutton Bonnington and Hathern station to Loughborough.

Southern Boundary.

This leaves Loughborough by way of A.512 which it follows through Thringstone and continues by way of B.585 through Coalville to Hugglescoate station. Hence it follows the Ashby and Nuneaton railway line past Shackerstone junction and Donisthorpe to Moira West Junction, whence it continues along the Leicester and Burton Line to Burton on Trent station.

Western Boundary.

This runs along the Horninglow Branch railway line to the junction with B.5118 which it follows to the junction with A.38 and along which it continues to Derby.

5. An area of approximately 196 sq. miles in the Counties of Derby and Nottingham.

Northern Boundary.
From Church Street, Matlock, the boundary follows B.6024 through Tansley to Wessington and Shirland and continues by A.61 to Alfreton. Thence it runs along A.615 to Sutton in Ashfield.

Eastern Boundary.

From Sutton in Ashfield the boundary follows the railway to the junction with A.611 which it follows till it meets B.6011 south west of Linby. It continues as far as the junction with A.614 and follows this to the junction with A.60 along which it runs as far as Castle Gate, Nottingham. Thence it follows the railway to Ruddington station. station.

Southern Boundary.

From Ruddington station this follows the road past Barton Lodge to the cross roads at New Barns and continues through Thrumpton to Thrumpton Ferry. Thence it follows the north bank of the river Trent as far as Bridge Street, Sawley, and continues along A.453 to Long Eaton. It leaves Long Eaton by way of A.6005 to Borrowash and thence by A.52 to Derby.

Western Boundary

This leaves Derby by way of A.6 which it follows to the point where the railway crosses the road near Ambergate. From then it follows the Ambergate and Rawsley railway line to Cromford station and proceeds thence by road to Matlock.

An area of approximately 187 sq. miles in the Counties of York, Derby and Nottingham.

Outer Boundaries.

Northern Boundary.
From the Police Station, Totley, the boundary follows B.6054 past Totley Rise and Norton to Mosbrough and continues by way of B.6058 to Killamarsh.

Eastern Boundary.
This follows A.618 from Killamarsh through Clowne to Pleasley and continues by way of B.6021 to Sutton in Ashfield.

Southern Boundary

This follows A.615 from Sutton in Ashfield to Alfreton whence it continues along the road through Shirland, Wessington and Tansley to Matlock.

Western Boundary.
This leaves Matlock by way of B.6015 and A.6 to Little Rowsley and continues by way of A.623 to Beeley Lodge. From One Arch Bridge it follows the east bank of the river Derwent to Baslow and from thence it continues along the Sheffield road to the commencement of the northern boundary.

Note.—There is a small enclave of 4 sq. miles in the Heath and Hardstoft area covered by a licence granted under Petroleum (Production) Act, 1918, to His Grace the Duke of Devonshire, the boundaries of which may also be inspected on application to the Ministry of Fuel and Power.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF ASSISTANT EXAMINERS OF PAPER AND OFFICE REQUISITES IN H.M. STATIONERY OFFICE.

Candidates must be at least 22 and under 40 years of age on the 1st April, 1955, but

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st April, 1955.

(b) candidates who have served in any established

(b) candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the Certifi-cate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a Certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any period of such service rendered before 1st April, 1955, up to a maximum of two years.

2. Sex and Marriage

(i) Both men and women may compete under these

Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity lished civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unfirst period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

Nationality

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or
(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appreciations.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight

years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or

residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Qualifications
Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners and the Controller of H.M. Stationery Office sioners and the Controller of H.M. Stationery Office that they have a knowledge of physics and chemistry and practical training that will fit them for the post. Their training in chemistry and physics must be such that it will enable them to investigate faults and troubles inherent or arising in paper of all kinds, cardboard, parchment and vellums, and stationers' sundries, and to carry out tests appropriate to the examination of supplies for the Public Service. A practical knowledge of some or all of these materials is desirable.

5. Health and Character
Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. Competition

The candidates who appear from their application forms to have the best qualifications will be admitted to (a) a preliminary informal interview to test their technical knowledge, and (b) an interview before a Final Selection Board. The Board will take into consideration the reports of the preliminary interviewers, the candidates' education and experience, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the candidates' technical knowledge and personal qualities as dates' technical knowledge and personal qualities as revealed at the interview; and on their estimation of this evidence will recommend to the Commissioners those candidates who are considered best fitted for appointment. The Commissioners' decision will be

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners. to the Commissioners.

8. Canvassine

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.
