HAILSHAM RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

*Hailsham Rural District (Hellingly Right of Way
No. 59) Diversion Order, 1955.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 4th day of October, 1955, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the part of public right of way No. 59 at Swansbrook in the Parish of Hellingly. The existing public right of way runs from Swansbrook Lane at the north-east corner of O.S. 136 through the garden of Swansbrook for a distance of approximately 80 feet. The diverted path will leave Swansbrook Lane at a point opposite the Smithy, Swansbrook, approximately 170 feet to the south-west from the point of junction of the existing path, and pass through O.S. 136 to a stile at the barway into O.S. 135 and thence along inside the northern boundary until it meets the continuation of the existing path. The part of the old footpath will be closed from the 5th November, 1955.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Cortlandt, Hailsham, and will be open for inspection free of charge during the usual office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 14th day of October, 1955, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

*Right of Way No. 202 (Parish of Capel) Diversion
Order, 1955.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 6th day of October, 1955, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the following Parish:—

Capel.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way running from Coles Lane (Point B on Map) for a distance of approximately 580 feet along the edge of Bennetts Wood to Point A on the map to a line running from Coles Lane (Point C on map) for a distance of approximately 790 feet by way of the footpaths and carriageways of the Bennetts Wood Housing Estate to Point A on the map.

A certified copy of the order and of the map contained in the order has been deposited at the Council Offices, Brookmead, Station Road, Dorking, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (excluding 1 p.m. to 2 p.m.) from Mondays to Fridays, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

Any objection or representation with reference to the order may be sent in writing to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 14th November, 1955, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.
