WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855 (18 & 19 Vict. c. 128), it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have

discontinuance of our also thereunder, of other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And Whereas an Order in Council was made on the 31st day of May, 1923 (S.R. & O. 1923/655) (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order"), directing the discontinuance of burials in the Church and Churchyard of Saint Thomas, Radcliffe, in the County of Lancester:

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of

Parliament.

4. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Radcliffe) (Variation) Order, 1955.
