"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure,

1949, and of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme) of the Right Reverend Walter, Bishop of Blackburn, for effecting the unions of (1) the benefice of Melling and the benefice of Tatham (being part of the benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells) and (2) the benefice of Wray and the benefice of Tatham Fells (being the remaining part of the benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells), and for altering the boundaries of the parish of Tatham and of the parish of Wray, all of which benefices and parishes are situate in the diocese of Blackburn.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas the benefices of Tatham and Tatham Fells were permanently united into one benefice with cure of souls under the provisions of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Sixth in Council dated the 4th day of November, 1938, and published in the London Gazette on the 8th day of that month, but the parishes of the said benefices continued distinct in all respects:

"Now therefore we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Union of the benefices of Melling and Tatham.*

"(1) The benefice of Melling and the benefice of Tatham, being part of the benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Melling with Tatham', but the parishes of the said benefices shall remain in all respects distinct.

"(2) Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Thomas Wilkinson Grange, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Melling shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"(3) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Melling shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(4) After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised alternately by the patron of the benefice of Melling and the patrons of the benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells, the patrons of the benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"2. *Union of the benefices of Wray and Tatham Fells.*

"(1) The benefice of Wray and the benefice of Tatham Fells, being the remaining part of the benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wray with Tatham (Fells)', but the parishes of the said benefices shall remain in all respects distinct.

"(2) Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"(3) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Wray shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(4) After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised alternately by the patron of the benefice of Wray and the patrons of the benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells, the patron of the benefice of Wray having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"(5) After the union has taken effect the fund which under the provisions of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Sixth in Council dated the 25th day of July, 1939, and published in the London Gazette on the 1st day of August, 1939, is held by the Diocesan Board of Finance of the diocese of Blackburn primarily for the repair and upkeep of the Church of the Parish of Tatham Fells and subject thereto for the benefit of the united benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells shall be held by the said Board primarily for the repair and upkeep of the said Church of the Parish of Tatham Fells and subject thereto for the benefit of the united benefice of Wray with Tatham Fells.

3. Distribution of the endowments and property of the benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells.

"Upon the taking effect of the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed, (a) a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £272 8s. 2d. and being part of a larger capital sum held by us for the endowment of the benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells, and (b) all that part of the glebe land at present belonging to the benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells which is situated in the parish of Tatham Fells shall be annexed to the benefice of Tatham Fells and shall become part of the endowments and property of the united benefice of Wray with Tatham Fells, and all other the endowments and property of the benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells shall be annexed to the benefice of Tatham and shall become part of the endowments and property of the united benefice of Melting with Tatham.

4. Alteration of parochial boundaries.

"Upon the union taking effect all that part of the parish of Tatham which is described in the Schedule hereto shall be severed from that parish and annexed to the parish of Wray.

"SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Wray:—

"All that part (coloured pink upon the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Tatham which lies generally to the south of an imaginary line along the middle of Clear Beck from its confluence with the River Hindburn upstream to the eastern boundary of closes numbered 394 and 467, thence along the footpath which crosses closes numbered 476, 475 and 480 to the road running from Millhouses to Lower Bentham, thence along the northern boundaries of closes numbered 516 and 520 and the south-eastern boundaries of closes numbered 520, 521 and 523 and thence almost due south over the River Hindburn to the point where the boundary between the parishes of Wray and Tatham joins the river bank at the south-east corner of close numbered 549."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Andover with Foxcote and Abbots Ann in the diocese of Winchester.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

1. Constitution.

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area, approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Andover'.

2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.

"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Basingstoke and in the rural deanery of Andover.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"(a) All that part (coloured pink on the map) of the parish of Andover with Foxcote which is bounded on the west by the parish of Penton Mewsey, on the south west by the parish of Abbots Ann, on the south by the parish of Upper Clatford and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Penton Mewsey from the parish of Andover with Foxcote in the middle of Harrow Way and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Harrow Way to a point opposite the middle of the northeastern end of The Drove and continuing thence southwestwards to and along the middle of The Drove to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence forming the rear boundary of the house and premises known as No. 63 Harrow Way and continuing thence eastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Nos. 61 to 1 Harrow Way to their junction with the wall or fence forming the rear boundary of No. 101 Charlton Road and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Nos. 99 to 79 Charlton Road and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Tollgate Road and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Tollgate Road to a point opposite its eastern end in the middle of Charlton Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of Charlton Road to a point opposite the middle of the northeastern end of Mylen Road and continuing thence southwestwards to and along the middle of Mylen Road to a point opposite the northwestern end of the wall or fence forming the northeastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 1 Mylen Road, and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Nos. 1 to 27, Hanson Road, and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Hanson Road and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Hanson Road to a point opposite its northeastern end in the middle of Charlton Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of Charlton Road to a point in the middle of the bridge by which the London to Exeter main railway line of British Railways (Southern Region) through Andover Junction crosses Charlton Road and continuing thence southeastwards to, then first southwards then southwestwards along, the middle of the approach road leading to the main entrance to Andover Junction Station to a point in the station yard opposite the middle of the northwestern end of the junction of The Avenue, Bishop's Way and Cross Lane and continuing thence southeastwards across the middle of the said junction to a point opposite the northeastern end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as No. 1, The Avenue from the house and premises known as No. 49 Bishop's Way and continuing thence southwestwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence which forms the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Nos. 49 to 45 Bishop's Way and continuing thence generally in a southerly direction along the last mentioned wall or

fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 45 Bishop's Way and continuing thence in a straight line southwards across the driveway leading to the house and premises known as Croye to the northeastern end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 11A, The Avenue and continuing thence generally first in a southeasterly direction then in a southwesterly direction along the walls or fences forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Nos. 11B to 41, The Avenue to the junction of the wall or fence forming the rear boundary of the house and premises known as No. 41, The Avenue with the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the last mentioned house and premises and continuing thence westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as No. 38, Weyhill Road and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Weyhill Road and continuing thence westwards along the middle of Weyhill Road to a point opposite the northern end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as No. 45, Weyhill Road from the house and premises known as No. 41 Weyhill Road and continuing thence southwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the western boundaries of the closes numbered 243, 244, 233 and 232 (on the map) and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Salisbury Road and continuing thence southwards along the middle of Salisbury Road to a point opposite the wall or fence forming the rear boundary of the house and premises known as No. 1, Lansdowne Avenue and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Nos. 3 to 35, Lansdowne Avenue and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Mead Hedges and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Mead Hedges to a point opposite the northwestern end of the wall or fence which divides close numbered 177 from close numbered 180 and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of the Andover and Redbridge Branch railway line of British Railways (Southern Region) and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the said railway line to the boundary which divides the parish of Andover with Foxcott from the parish of Upper Clatford.

"(b) All that adjacent part (coloured green on the map) of the parish of Abbots Ann which lies to the north of an imaginary line commencing at a point where the boundaries of the parishes of Abbots Ann, Weyhill and Monxton meet in the middle of the Andover Junction to Swindon Branch railway line of British Railways (Southern Region) and continuing thence first southeastwards then eastwards along the middle of the said railway line to its junction with the London to Exeter main railway line of British Railways (Southern Region) at Red Post Junction and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the joint railway line to the boundary which divides the parish of Abbots Ann from the parish of Andover with Foxcott."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 16th day of September, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Neville, Bishop of Coventry (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the disunion of the united benefice of Oxhill with Whatcote and the union of the several parts thereof to the benefice of Tysoe with Compton Wynyates and the benefice of Honington with Idlicote respectively, all of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Coventry.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Disunion of the united benefice of Oxhill with Whatcote.*

"(1) The union of the benefice of Oxhill and the benefice of Whatcote in the united benefice of Oxhill with Whatcote shall be dissolved and the said benefices of Oxhill and Whatcote shall thereupon, subject as hereinafter provided, each become a separate benefice with cure of souls within the limits of its separate parish.

"(2) If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the united benefice of Oxhill with Whatcote shall be vacant the disunion shall forthwith take effect, but if it shall then be full the disunion shall take effect immediately upon the next vacation thereof.

"(3) Upon the disunion taking effect, and without prejudice to the exercise before that date of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, the parsonage house of the said united benefice and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Coventry established pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"(4) Upon the disunion taking effect the patron of the united benefice shall become and be patron of each of the separate benefices of Oxhill and Whatcote.

"(5) The endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, a portion of the endowments of the said united benefice held by us, namely a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £56 1s. 7d., shall be annexed to the benefice of Whatcote and all other the endowments and property of the said united benefice of Oxhill with Whatcote shall be annexed to the benefice of Oxhill.

"2. *Union of the benefices of Tysoe with Compton Wynyates and Oxhill.*

"(1) The benefice of Tysoe with Compton Wynyates and the benefice of Oxhill separated as hereinbefore provided shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Tysoe with Compton Wynyates and Oxhill', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"(2) Upon the taking effect of the disunion referred to in clause 1 of this Scheme, the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Thomas Elias Jones, if at the relevant date he is the incumbent of the benefice of Tysoe with Compton Wynyates shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"(3) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Tysoe with Compton Wynyates shall, if at that date it so belongs, be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(4) After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised

by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Oxhill having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"3. *Union of the benefices of Honington with Idlicote and Whatcote.*

"(4) After the union has taken effect, in every series of five successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice, that one of the alternate patrons of the benefice of Honington with Idlicote who did not make the last presentation to that benefice shall have the first turn, the patron of the benefice of Whatcote shall have the second and fifth turns and the other alternate patron of the benefice of Honington with Idlicote shall have the third and fourth turns."

"2. *The union of the benefice and parish of Worsborough Dale, Saint Thomas, and the remaining part of the benefice and parish of Worsborough Bridge, Saint James.*

"(1) Subject to the alteration of boundaries recommended and proposed in clause 5 of this Scheme, the benefice and parish of Worsborough Dale, Saint Thomas, and the remaining part (containing the parish church) of the benefice and parish of Worsborough Bridge, Saint James, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Worsborough Saint Thomas and Saint James' and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"(2) Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"(3) Upon the union taking effect the church of Saint Thomas, Worsborough Dale, shall become the parish church of the united parish.

"(4) The marriage registers current at the church of Saint James, Worsborough, shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of Saint Thomas, Worsborough Dale.

"(5) After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised

by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Worsborough Dale, Saint Thomas, having the first turn of presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. *Alterations of Boundaries.* Upon the day upon which the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed shall take effect (a) all those parts of the parish of Worsborough Dale, Saint Thomas, which are described in Part I of the Second Schedule hereto, shall be severed from that parish and from the parish of the united benefice of Worsborough, Saint Thomas and Saint James and with the consent of the said Reverend Fred Herrington (testified as aforesaid) be annexed to the parish of the united benefice of Worsborough Common, Saint Luke and (b) all that part of the parish of Worsborough Dale, Saint Thomas, which is described in Part II of the said Second Schedule shall be severed from that parish and from the parish of the united benefice of Worsborough, Saint Thomas and Saint James and, with the consent of the Reverend Clifford Wentworth Scott (testified by his signature hereto), be annexed to the parish of Ardsley.

"FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The part of the benefice and parish of Worsborough Bridge, Saint James, which is to be united to the benefice and parish of Worsborough Common, Saint Luke:—

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons previously buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has previously taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF GEOLOGISTS OR SENIOR GEOLOGISTS IN THE GEOLOGICAL SURVEY OF GREAT BRITAIN UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF SCIENTIFIC AND INDUSTRIAL RESEARCH.

1. Age.

(a) For appointment as Geologist.

Candidates must be at least 21 and under 30 years of age on 1st January, 1956.

BUT

(1) The maximum age limit of 30 is extended to 31 for candidates who hold a permanent appointment in the Experimental Officer Class.

(2) A candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st January, 1956.

(b) For appointment as Senior Geologist.

Candidates must be at least 26 and under 31 years of age on 1st January, 1956. But a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Act, 1866, and of section 2 of the Church Commissioners Measure, 1947, do hereby grant out of our general fund to each of the benefices specified in the schedule hereto one yearly sum or stipend of the amount stated opposite to the name of each benefice in the third column of the schedule, such yearly sum or stipend to be calculated as from the date stated in the fifth column of the schedule: Provided that the yearly sum or stipend so granted to a benefice shall, as from the said date, be in full substitution as regards that benefice for any temporary grant payable out of our general fund to the incumbent of that benefice and appearing in the fourth column of the said schedule opposite to the name of that benefice: Provided also that this Instrument which has been executed in several parts, one part for each diocese concerned, shall operate only as a single grant in favour of each of the benefices specified in the schedule.
