At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 1st day of *December, 1955*.

PRESENT,

The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of November, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and the Acts mentioned therein, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of Saint Luke, Liverpool, in the diocese of Liverpool.

“**SCHEME.**

“Whereas we are satisfied that the right of patronage and presentation to the said benefice is at present exercisable by Barclays Bank Limited whose registered office is at 54 Lombard Street in the City of London:

“And whereas the said Barclays Bank Limited (hereinafter called ‘the transferors’) desire to transfer their interests in the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Liverpool for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common Seal to be hereunto affixed):

“And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Clifford, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the interests of the transferors in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Clifford, Bishop of Liverpool, and his successors in the same Bishopric to the intent that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Liverpool for the time being.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order

in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Liverpool.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 3rd day of November, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the interest hereinafter mentioned in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of Tugby with Skeffington in the County and the diocese of Leicester.

“**SCHEME.**

“Whereas we are satisfied that Alice Evelyn Collington of ‘Stoneleigh’, 508, Syston Road, Thurleston, in the County of Leicester, widow, as the Personal Representative of the late William Collington, Esquire, is entitled to exercise the alternate right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice:

“And whereas the said Alice Evelyn Collington desires to transfer her said interest in the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Leicester for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

“And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ronald Ralph, Bishop of Leicester (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said interest of the said Alice Evelyn Collington in the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Ronald Ralph, Bishop of Leicester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Leicester for the time being.”
