The QUEEN made the following speech at the inauguration by Her Majesty of London Airport on Friday, 16th December:—

The inauguration of this great terminal today marks an important stage in the story of London Airport. In the ten years which have passed since the earliest development of this site, the Airport has grown in size and in international fame until today we may say with pride that it ranks among the foremost in the world.

For centuries London has been a port from which vessels have set out for the farthest corners of the earth. It has been—and is—a great centre of commerce. Indeed, it has been the clearing house of the globe, handling the traffic of many nations. In the new era of flight, which has transformed our world in less than half a century, London has acquired a new importance. This Airport, standing on the edge of the old world and looking towards the new, is now a key-point in the complex network of international air traffic which links us with almost every country on the face of the earth.

No other Airport in the world sees such a volume of international traffic. The airlines of twenty-five nations meet here in friendly and peaceful rivalry. London Airport has become the modern meeting place, where many tongues are spoken in friendship and goodwill. Here is daily proof that air travel has brought all lands close together and made all men neighbours.

I am delighted to see that so much has been done to fit London Airport for its great task. For many travellers this will be their first experience of England. I congratulate all who have taken part in the arduous work of preparing and draining the land and who have planned and built on it the eight miles of runways and the modern and efficient buildings which we see about us. The pattern of the runways is unique and the elaborate system of control with every scientific aid is designed to make air travel as speedy and safe as human ingenuity can contrive.

I am especially glad to have this opportunity of expressing my admiration for all that has been achieved because my husband and I are regular travellers by air, and we look forward to our first departure from these new buildings next month. Whatever form air travel may take in the future—and we may be certain that many striking changes lie ahead—London Airport will, I am sure, continue to grow in importance as one of the world's centres of air traffic.

It gives me great pleasure to inaugurate this terminal and to name this building in which we are now standing Queen's Building.

Edward CHIPMAN, Milk Truck Driver, Montreal, Province of Quebec.

As Mr. Chipman, on his daily run to Huntingdon, entered the Indian reservation of Caughnawaga, he saw a house on fire and an Indian resident waving to attract his attention.

He was told that the mother and father of the family living in the house had managed to escape with two of their children, but that there were other children inside the building.

Mr. Chipman accompanied the father into the burning house, but was soon left alone when the father was overcome by smoke and collapsed outside. Mr. Chipman saved one child, then immediately returned into the house and rescued a second child. The father recovered sufficiently to tell Mr. Chipman that another child was still inside, asleep on a cot upstairs.

Again Mr. Chipman entered the house, only to be forced out by smoke. He made another attempt, reached the child and brought him to safety. Unfortunately, this child died later in hospital.

But for the courageous action of Mr. Chipman the three children would have perished in the fire.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE LIMITED COMPETITION FOR: RECRUITMENT TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE CLASS OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. No candidate may compete in more than two Limited Competitions for the Administrative Class, excluding any candidature in the Reconstruction Limited Competition; but (a) if a candidate competes under both Method I and Method II in the same year this will be treated as a single attempt; (b) a candidate who has had two attempts in the Limited Competition before 1956 and is otherwise eligible may have one attempt in 1956 under Method I only.

2. *Age.*

Candidates must be at least 21 and under 28 years of age on 1st August, 1956.

Provided that the Commissioners may, at their discretion, waive the upper age limit in favour of a candidate who

(a) has been employed by his Department overseas; or

(b) was, although eligible, prevented from attending an earlier examination as a result of his having been recalled from the Reserve for a period of service or training with H.M. Forces;

if they are satisfied in either case that he would otherwise be deprived of one of the two attempts which he might normally have made.

(Note.—It is expected that these concessions will apply in future Limited Competitions.)

3. Service.

Candidates must have had at least two years' service immediately prior to 1st August, 1956, in either

(a) an established situation in the Home Civil Service to which they were admitted with a certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners. Service on established conditions of service except for sick leave and pension may count towards the whole or part of this period in the case of candidates who on medical grounds were not accepted for fully established appointment or were notified by the Commissioners that a decision as to physical eligibility had been deferred; or

(b) a situation in the Office of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, the Office of the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District, the Office of the Crown Agents for Oversea Governments and Administrations, the Forestry Commission, or Trinity House, after having been appointed to a post in one of those Offices as a result of a competition held by the Civil Service Commissioners.

Periods of service in the Armed Forces (other than periods covered by annual leave or by the grant of special leave with pay) may not reckon towards the two-year period. Civil servants who have been established under a scheme in which established conditions of service reckon from a common date earlier than the date of issue of the certificate of qualification may reckon towards the two-year period any service actually rendered in a non-industrial capacity after the common date and before the issue of the certificate of qualification.

4. Sex.

Both men and women are eligible, but women will not ordinarily be appointed to posts in the Ministry of Defence, Admiralty, War Office, or Air Ministry.

5. Method I.

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination in

(a) three compulsory subjects, namely, Essay, English, and Present Day, to each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted;

(b) a selection from the optional subjects set out in the Appendix. Subject to the provisions in the Appendix candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 700 marks (making 1,000 marks in all for the written examination).

(B) Interview, comprising

(a) a preliminary interview by one or more interviewers, who will supply reports for the information of the Final Interview Board;

(b) an interview before the Final Interview Board, which will award a mark out of a maximum of 300 for the candidate's record, intelligence, and personal qualities.

(ii) The final order of merit will be determined by the total marks gained in the whole examination. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful. The Commissioners may require a candidate to attend a second time before the Final Interview Board if they consider it necessary to enable them to reach a decision.

6. Method II.

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination comprising an Essay, English, Present Day, a General Paper, and a test of General Intelligence, to each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted (making 500 marks in all).

(B) A series of tests and interviews at the Civil Service Selection Board.

(C) An interview before the Final Selection Board.

(ii) Candidates who in the written examination under (i) (A) reach a standard determined by the

Commissioners will be invited to the Civil Service Selection Board. Of those who fail narrowly to reach this standard, the Commissioners may select for the Civil Service Selection Board a further number whose records and reports give evidence of strong claims to further consideration.

(iii) The Commissioners will subsequently select in the light of the candidates' performances at the Civil Service Selection Board and of their records those who will be admitted to interview by the Final Selection Board.

(iv) The final order of merit will be determined by the mark awarded by the Final Selection Board. This will take into account the candidate's record as well as his intellectual and personal qualities as shown throughout the Competition. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful. The Commissioners may require a candidate to attend a second time before the Final Selection Board if they consider it necessary to enable them to reach a decision.

(v) The Commissioners may exempt from the written examination a candidate who has previously obtained good marks for it, or for the compulsory papers in the Method I examination, and in the same competition has also been awarded a mark of more than 200 by the Final Board. The previous competition must have been a recent open or limited competition for the Administrative Class or Senior Branch of the Foreign Service.

7. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

8. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned; this will normally be a Department other than that in which the candidate has been serving.

9. Fees.

The total fee payable by all candidates is £4 for either Method separately or £6 for both Methods. Of this, £2 must be paid on application and the balance on admission to the examination. (Candidates exempted from the Method II written examination must pay the balance of the total fee when called upon to do so.) Candidates who are eligible for the Open Competition for the Administrative Class may compete in that competition (by either or both methods) in the same year as they compete in the Limited Competition. But those who do so will be required to pay two separate fees in the manner prescribed for each competition, except that a candidate who competes by Method I in the Open Competition and pays the fee prescribed will not be required to pay any further fee for a concurrent candidature by Method I in the Limited Competition.

2. Candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 700 marks. A candidate who wishes to offer subjects the aggregate value of which exceeds 700 marks must name a subject to be marked on a reduced maximum in order to bring the aggregate to 700. This option cannot be exercised by a candidate who can reduce his aggregate to 700 by omitting one or more of the subjects he proposes to offer.

3. The following restrictions apply to particular optional subjects:—

(a) Industry and Trade (31), Money, Banking, and Exchange (32), Public Finance (33), Social Economics (34), may be taken only by candidates

who offer General Economics (30), or any two of the following:—

History of Political Thought (25), Political Theory (26), Political Organisation (27), Modern British Government (28).

(b) International Relations (29), may not be taken by a candidate who offers European History, Period III (8) or International Law (17).

(c) SUBJECTS 44-54

(i) Natural Science (Essay Paper) (44), may be taken only by candidates who offer one or more of the subjects 45-54.

(ii) Candidates may not offer more than three of the subjects Chemistry, Part I (45), Physics, Part I (47), Botany, Part I (49), Geology, Part I (51), Zoology, Part I (53).

(d) Candidates may not offer more than two of the three periods of English Literature (63-65).

(e) Greek Literature (72) may be taken only by candidates who offer Greek Translation (69), and Latin Literature (76) only by those who offer Latin Translation (73).

(f) Candidates may not offer Language papers (modern languages, Latin, or Greek) totalling more than 400 marks. Similarly Literature or Civilisation papers (including English Literature) may not be offered carrying a maximum of more than 400 marks. Thus no candidate may offer French Language, German Language, and Spanish Language, or French Civilisation, German Civilisation, and English Literature. The papers on the History of the French Language, the History of the German Language, Old English, Middle English, and English Criticism, do not come within the scope of this restriction.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that a Limited Competition will be held under the above Regulations, the written examination under Method I commencing on 2nd July, 1956, and that under Method II on 6th July, 1956.

No person will be admitted to the Competition from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before 29th February, 1956, an application on the prescribed form which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF MALE AND FEMALE POSTAL AND TELEGRAPH OFFICERS IN THE POST OFFICE.

1. Age

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years of age on a governing date, defined as follows:—

For Competitions held in January to April in each year, the date is the 1st May immediately following.

For Competitions held in May to August in each year, the date is the 1st September immediately following.

For Competitions held in September to December in each year, the date is the 1st January immediately following.

2. Nationality

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

3. Health and Character

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. They must be at least 5 feet in height.

4. Examination

The examination consists of seven short tests as follows:—

A. Spelling lasting 10 minutes and carrying 15 marks.

B. Arithmetic lasting 25 minutes and carrying 60 marks.

C. Comprehension lasting 20 minutes and carrying 30 marks.

D. General Knowledge lasting 30 minutes and carrying 50 marks.

E. Problems lasting 20 minutes and carrying 40 marks.

F. Expression lasting 15 minutes and carrying 15 marks.

G. Essay lasting 30 minutes and carrying 40 marks.

Separate competitions will be held for each Head Post Office area, and for the London Postal area, and candidates for each area will be arranged in order of merit on their aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole. No candidate may compete for a vacancy in more than one area at the same time, but if after the results of the examination have been published the number of qualified candidates in any area is insufficient to fill the vacancies in that area appointments may be offered, in order of their total marks, to candidates who have been unsuccessful for appointments in other areas in the same Post Office Region in Competitions held at the same time or within a period of fourteen weeks thereof. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be appointed who does not obtain an aggregate which satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. Candidates Trained as Teachers

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.
