The Humber and Trent Rules (Revocation) Order, 1956.

Made - - - 25th January, 1956 Laid before Parliament 30th January, 1956 Coming into Operation 1st March, 1956

#### PRESENT.

WHEREAS the Humber Conservancy Board, who

WHEREAS the Humber Conservancy Board, who are interested in the navigation of the waters of the Rivers Humber and Trent, have made application for the revocation of the Humber Rules, 1910, S.R. & O. 1910/832, the Trent Rules, 1910, S.R. & O. 1910/833, and the Humber (Amendment) Rules, 1924, S.R. & O. 1924/971:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by sections 421 and 738 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, 57 & 58 Vict. c. 60, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows: as follows:

1. The Humber Rules, 1910, the Trent Rules, 1910, and the Humber (Amendment) Rules, 1924,

are hereby revoked.

2.—(1) This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of March, 1956, and may be cited as the Humber and Trent Rules (Revocation)

order, 1956.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, 52 & 53 Vict.

c. 63, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order, as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order revokes the Humber Rules, 1910, the Trent Rules, 1910, and the Humber (Amendment) Rules, 1924, which contained provisions dealing with the lights and signals to be carried, and the steps for avoiding collisions to be taken, by vessels navigating the Rivers Humber and Trent. The matters dealt with in the revoked Rules will now be dealt with in Byelaws made under the Humber Conservancy Acts, 1852 to 1951.

These provisions may be waived only exceptionally for individual candidates whose training in the trade, craft or subject and gractical experience are comparable to the qualiand practical experience are comparable to the qualiand practical experience are comparable to the qualifications normally required. It is desirable for candidates for posts in Grade IIII to be in possession of an Ordinary National Certificate or City and Guilds Certificate or equivalent qualifications in the appropriate subject where such qualifications exist.

7. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed in an unestablished capacity subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible for appointment in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and to the payment of a fee of 5s.

8. After a minimum qualifying period of two years' unestablished service in the grade Civilian Instructional Officers appointed under these Regulations may be considered for appointment to the established staff as and when vacancies occur thereon, if they are recommended by their Department as if they are recommended by their Department as qualified in other respects. Those so considered will appear before a final Selection Board set up by the Civil Service Commissioners, which will recommend to the Commissioners the candidates who appear to be qualified.

4. Educational Qualifications.

Every candidate must, on the date he sends in his application, be in possession of one of the under-

(e) A statement from the Scottish Education Department or the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland showing that the candidate has attained a standard equivalent to that represented by the award of the School Certificate of the Oxford and Cambridge Schools Examination Board, including the special qualification in mathematics or a science subject or by the General matics or a science subject, or by the General Certificate of Education in four subjects at Ordinary level including English Language and a scientific or mathematical subject, or

(k) The Commissioners may also accept as eligible candidates who are unable to comply with the requirements above but who

(i) have been employed on Assistant (Scientific)

(i) have been employed on Assistant (Scientific) duties for a considerable time, have demonstrated their aptitude for this kind of work and are certified by their Department as being worthy of special consideration, or

(ii) have served for at least 10 years, on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement, in the technical branch of H.M. Forces. Such candidates must have served an artificer apprenticeship (where appropriate) or have reached the rank of Petty Officer or Sergeant, or (iii) are employed full-time as glass-blowers in Government Departments, provided they are

Government Departments, provided they are nominated by their Department and satisfy the Commissioners of their skill in their craft. Such candidates must be wholly employed in the construction of glassware for use in scientific laboratories.

5. Experience

9. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland), has been notified to the Commissioners.

10. Assignment.

It will rest with the Commissioners to determine the Department to which each successful candidate shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service but the wishes of candidates will be met as far as possible.

11. Canvassing.

12. Fee.
