Lisbonne, Sept. 10. Many thanges have been lately made here among the great Officers, the Marquis de Nizza where three Years emploiment as lutimendant of the Treafury, is rettloved from that Charge and fucceeded by the Conde de Torrei The Viz Conite de Ponte Lima temoved from his emploiment neer the King, which by his ablence is judged uklefs, and from his Otharge of Prefident of the Council of Trede, and Don Francisco Baretto placed in his room; the Conde de Averas is made Prefident of the Meza da Confoientia; and the Conde de Villar Mayor Rigidor 3 the two Marqueffes, de Marialva and de Gonea with the Conde de San Lovenzo difcharged from the Council of dispatches, by vertue of a Decree that now having Charge in any inferior Tribufal shall have a Vote in that Council, but the Marquis de Marialva is fucceded by his Brether Don Rodrigo.

The French Ambaffador has at last obrained leave at the Court for setting up a Magazine of stores for the French men of War, but with some restrictions wherewith he is not yet satisfied \$ he has much pressed for a Grant of free Commerce to the Indies, but has obtained only a Letter to the Viceroff of those parts to afford their ships furcor in tale of mecessity.

The Sally men of war continue as yet their interrupida of Trade, but tis believed will in little time be reftrained from their courfes; one of them a fmall Pink of four Guns was forced on fhoar by Captain Holmes, and afterwards brought off and carried into Cadis, but the men made their escape.

Legorn, Septemb 23. On Wednelday laft the Great Dutchels returned to Florence from the Baths of Lucca, and was at her arrival faluted by all the Guns from the two Forts.

A thip lately arriving from Maltha tells us that the City of Candia full defends its felf with much courage, and that the Defendants are plying their Works at their Retrenchments whereon they have planted many Guns, and were endeavouring to fill the great Arfenal with Barth, whereon to raife a great Battery to defend their Port, sgainft which the Enemy began to apply their forces ; farther faying, that shough the French Auxiliaries were returned home, they had to much firength and coursge left them, as to believe they might preferve the place this winter from the Eneqmy.

From Matthe they write, that on the toth pathtie Counfel there affembled, inside choice of the Count Adam Wrasiflaus. Grend Prior of Bohemia, and one of the Frarerhity of the Order to be fem to Rome with the Character of Ambaffador of obsilience from the Grear Mitters, and may begin his voyage before the end of Septembers, being also inftructed from Venice for a Conference with the Pope about the farther defence of the Kingdom of Gandia. They fatther fay, that about 10 of the men of war of Algiers that bave been employ'd in the Grand Segniors fervice, and were returning homewards, have on their way made lomb'flay about the Channel of Maltha, and had feiled on two Tartans, but the men belonging to them, eftaped to Land in their Boars, but that two Briganines armed out from Satdinia were arrived at Maltha, bringing in with them a Prize laden with Provisions, and about 42 Moors priloners.

Genora, Sept. 28. The Gallies of this Republick being abroad, have taken a Bark of Algiers, having on board 45 Turks and Moors, who made about an hours flour refiftance.

Two Regiments of German Foot which were lately difmilied the Spanish lervice by the Governour, of Milan, are said to have fallen into the Principality of Garetto, (which being a Fief of the Empire lately put it self under the French Protection) and have burnt and plunder'd many Villages, and wholly destroyed the Castle.

A Courier lately artiving here from Spain in his way for Rome informs us, that the Dutch Ambaffador, the Baron de Rede after fome weeks diffemper is lately decealed a but before bir death made open profession of the Roman Catholick Religion, to which he was long before fuppoled to have had an inclination.

He farther informs, that a Cabinet of Papers of private and great concernment, was lately taken out of the Catholick Kings Chamber, for which, diligent fearch and enquiry has been made but in vain.

Vienna, Sept. 29. The Court continues yet at Eherfderf, where the principal Lords and great perfons have of late exercised chemfelves in shooting for Prizes.

On Thuriday last after a great Feast, the Prizes being agreed on, the First was won by the Gount de Kevenhiller, the Second by the Emperour, and the Third by Charles Prince of Lorrain, who has propoled other Prizes which are to be contended for the next Tuelday.
