ABERGAVENNY RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Abergavenny Rural District Council Pandy Footpath Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 30th day of January, 1956, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to create a public right of way in Fields Nos. 330 and 328 on the O.S. Map. No. Monmouthshire IV. 13 entering Field No. 330 at a point near the junction of the road to Grosmont, proceeding to the rear of Yew Tree Cottage and through Field No. 328 to a point near the Police Station at Pandy.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF STOCKPORT.

The County Borough of Stockport Gorse Bank Footpath Diversion Order, 1955.
