At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 25th day of January, 1956.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 21st day of December, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Spencer, Bishop of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Blatherwycke and the benefice of Laxton (now part of the benefice of Bulwick with Laxton) both of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Peterborough.

“SCHEME.

“1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Blatherwycke and the benefice of Laxton, being part of the benefice of Bulwick with Laxton, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Blatherwycke with Laxton’, but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

“2. With the consents (testified by their signing the Scheme) of the Reverend Arthur Tindal Hart, as incumbent of the benefice of Blatherwycke, and of the Reverend Louis Edward Philip de Casabianca, as incumbent of the benefice of Bulwick with Laxton, the union shall taken effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette and the said Reverend Arthur Tindal Hart shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice of Blatherwycke with Laxton.

“3. Upon the union taking effect the remaining part of the benefice of Bulwick with Laxton shall be known as the benefice of Bulwick and the said Reverend Louis Edward Philip de Casabianca shall be the incumbent thereof.

“4. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Blatherwycke shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

“5. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Bulwick with Laxton having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

“6. *Endowments.* Upon the union taking effect the annual stipend or rentcharge of £20 which is charged upon the Rectorial property at Laxton and which formed the whole or part of the endowments of the benefice of Laxton prior to its union with

the benefice of Bulwick shall be severed or diverted from the benefice of Bulwick with Laxton and shall be appropriated and annexed to the united benefice of Blatherwycke with Laxton and all other the endowments and property of the benefice of Bulwick with Laxton shall belong to the benefice of Bulwick.”

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advise of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 4th day of January, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Havering-atte-Bower and The Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, both in the diocese of Chelmsford.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

“And whereas the Right Reverend Falkner, Bishop of Chelmsford, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

“Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Havering-atte-Bower and The Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.
