"Nash End, Bisley," Diversion Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 2nd day of February, 1956, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of this Order is to divert the public right of way running south to north across field Ordnance No. 1485. and joining the Eastcombe—Bisley Road through the Nash End Farm buildings.

To a line following the south west boundary of the said field Ordnance No. 1485. and joining the said Eastcombe—Bisley Road at a point approximately 120 yards south west of Nash End Farm buildings.

The existing public right of way will be closed as from 23rd February, 1956.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the offices of the Stroud Rural District Council, and will be open for inspection free of charge during the usual office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 10th day of February, 1956, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

(Footpaths Nos. 3 and 4) Diversion Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 1st day of February, 1956, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land in the Parish of Graveley.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public rights of way running from North-West to South-East and from West to East in Field No. 162 on the 25" Ordnance Survey Sheet Herts. XII.7. 1924 Edition, to lines running generally from North to South and from West to East and following the boundary of Fields Nos. 162, 164, and 165, and the public highway, and more particularly shown on the map contained in the Order.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the Rural District Council Offices, 21, Bancroft, Hitchin, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays (Saturdays 9 a.m. and 12 noon).
