WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 21st day of December, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, suance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Spencer, Bishop of Peterborough, (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Morcott and the benefice of South Luffenham both situate in the diocese of Peterborough.

### " Ѕснеме

- "1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Morcott and the benefice of South Luffenham shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Morcott with South Luffenham', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.
- "2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.
- "3. Parsonage House. Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Morcott shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.
- "4. Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of South Luffenham having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.
- "5. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery. The united benefice shall be in the archdeaconry of Oakham and the rural deanery of Uppingham.

"6. Diversion of Endowment Income.
"(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £700 shall, with effect from the date when which the union shall take effect, be paid upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Peter-

borough.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £700 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall

when we deem that circumstances so require be

apportionable accordingly.

(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumas the case may be (nershatter canted the incum-bent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt

due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income of the united benefice shall without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by wirtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:—

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us and any other person or body, and

"(2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof,

"and by deducting therefrom:—

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent.

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

"(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations

incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,

"(4) the rates payable on the glebe,
"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,
"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm
rent charged upon the glebe,
"(7) any other outgoings in respect of the

glebè,

"(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person, "(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income, "(10) the annual payments in respect of capital

(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,

"(11) any pension paid to a retired incumbent out of the benefice income,

"(12) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have pursuance of the New Parisnes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for (1) altering the boundaries of the parishes of Warminster; Christ Church, Warminster; Bishopstrow; and Boyton and (2) altering the name of the parish of Bishopstrow, all of which parishes are in the diocese of Salisbury.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned: "And whereas it has been represented to us, and

it appears to us that the name of the parish of Bishopstrow should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the Right Reverend William, Bishop

"And whereas the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows:—

"From and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme—

"(1) the boundaries of the said parishes of Warminster; Christ Church, Warminster; Bishopstrow; and Boyton, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme,

"(2) with the consent of the parochial church council of the said parish of Bishopstrow (in testimony whereof this Scheme is signed by the Chairman and two other members present at a meeting of the council duly convened for the meeting of the council duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent) the name of the parish of Bishopstrow shall be altered to 'The Parish of Bishopstrow and Boreham'.

"I. The territory to be annexed to the parish of

"(a) All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Warminster which is bounded on the southeast by the parish of Bishopstrow, on the southwest by the parish of Christ Church, Warminster, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Warminster from the parish of Christ Church, Warminster, at the junction of East Street with Boreham Road and opposite the middle of the southwestern end of Imber Road and continuing thence northeastwards to and along the middle of Imber Road to a point opposite the northwestern end of the wall or fence which divides close numbered 81A (on the map) from close numbered 82 and continuing thence southeastwards to and 82 and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence which divides close numbered

81A2 from closes numbered 82 and 81B to its end and in a straight line southeastwards in continuation thereof across close numbered 81 to a point on the wall or fence which divides close numbered 81 from close numbered 90 at a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts northeast of the southeastern corner of close numbered 81 and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of the railway line of the Salisbury Branch of British Railways (Western Region) and continuing thence first eastwards then southeastwards along the middle of the said railway line to a point opposite the northern end of the wall or fence which divides close numbered 106 from close numbered 107 and close numbered 106 from close numbered 107 and close numbered 106 from close numbered 107 and continuing thence southwards to, then first southwards then southeastwards, along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence in a straight line southeastwards to a point at the middle of the northwestern end of the Bourne ditch and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the said ditch to the boundary which divides the parish of Warminster from the parish of Bishopstrow at the southeastern corner of close numbered 101.

"(b) All that detached part (coloured orange on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Warminster which is bounded on all sides by the parish of

Bishopstrow.

"(c) All that detached part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Christ Church, Warminster, which is bounded on the south and part of the east by the parish of Sutton Veny and on the remaining sides by the parish of

Bishopstrow.

"(d) All that part (coloured purple on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Christ Church, Warminster, which is bounded on the north and east by the parish of Warminster and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Christ Church, Warminster, from the parish of Warminster in the middle of Chain Lane opposite the eastern end of the wall or fence which divides close numbered 329 (on the map) from closes numbered 326, 328 and 335 and continuing thence numbered 326, 328 and 335 and continuing thence westwards to and along the last mentioned wall or divides close numbered 337 from closes numbered 335 and 336 and continuing thence northwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of the footpath leading from East Street to Lake Pleasure Grounds and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the said footpath to a point opposite its northeastern end in the middle of East Street on the boundary which divides the parish of Christ Church, Warminster, from the parish of Warminster. "II. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Christ Church, Warminster:—

"(a) All that detached part (coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Bishopstrow which is bounded on the south and part of the east by a detached part of the parish of Norton Bavant, on part of the northwest by a detached part of the parish of Boyton and on the remaining sides by the parish of Christ Church, Warminster.

"(b) All that detached part (coloured values or

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, suance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Tom, Bishop of Hereford (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting (1) the disunion of the united benefice of Monkland with Stretford, (2) the disunion of the united benefice of Leoningter with Isingston of the united benefice of Leominster with Ivington, (3) the union of the benefice of Monkland and the benefice of Ivington, Saint John, and (4) an alteration in the boundaries of the parish of Birley, being one of the parishes of the benefice of King's Pyon with Birley, and of the parish of Stretford, all of which benefices and parishes are situate in the diocese of Hereford Hereford.

"And whereas in pursuance of the said Orders and in the events which have happened the unions of the said benefices and the alteration of the boundaries of the said parishes will take effect upon the avoidance of the said benefices of Monkland and Ivington, Saint John, by the Reverend George Wolter.

"And whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Hereford has forwarded to us, the said Church Commissioners, provisional proposals pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, recommending that the unions of the said benefices should be dissolved, that the said benefices of Monkland and Juington Saint John should be united that the and Ivington, Saint John, should be united, that the said benefice of Stretford should be held in plurality with the benefice of Dilwyn, situate in the said diocese of Hereford, and that the boundaries of the said parishes of Birley and Stretford should be altered in the manner hereinafter proposed:

"And whereas effort can be given to the mid-

"And whereas effect can be given to the said proposals so far as they relate to the dissolution of the said unions, the union of the said benefices of Monkland and Ivington, Saint John, and the alteration of the boundaries of the said parishes of Birley and Stretford, by Scheme prepared by us and confirmed by Order of Your Majesty in Council pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures and in so far as they relate to the said plurality by subin so far as they relate to the said plurality by sub-sequent Order made by the said Bishop pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:

"1. Disunion of the united benefice of Monkland

with Stretford.

"(1) The union of the benefice of Monkland and the benefice of Stretford in the said united benefice of Monkland with Stretford shall be dissolved and the said benefices of Monkland and Stretford shall thereupon each become a separate benefice with cure of souls within the limits of its separate parish.

"(2) Taking effect of disunion.
"The disunion of the said united benefice shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette or upon the day when the union of the said benefices of Monkland and Stretford shall take effect, whichever shall be the later day.

"(3) Parsonage house.
"Upon the disunion taking effect the parsonage house of the said united benefice shall be assigned to the benefice of Monkland as the house of residence of the incumbent thereof.

"(4) Endowments.

"The endowments and property which immediately prior to the taking effect of the union belonging to the respective benefices of Monkland and Stretford shall upon the disunion taking effect be assigned and annexed to those benefices respectively.

"(5) Patronage.
"The patron of the united benefice of Monkland with Stretford shall become and be patron of each of the separate benefices of Monkland and Stretford.

2. Disunion of the united benefice of Leominster

with Ivington.

"(1) The union of the benefice of Ivington, Saint John, and the benefice of Leominster in the said united benefice of Leominster with Ivington shall be dissolved and the said benefice of Ivington, Saint John, and Leominster shall thereupon each become a separate benefice with cure of souls within the limits of its separate

"(2) Taking effect of disunion.
"With the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Reverend Samuel Mostyn Forbes Woodhouse, being the present incumbent of the benefice of Leominster, the disunion of the said united benefice shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette or upon the day when the union of the said benefices of Ivington, Saint John, and Leominster shall take effect, whichever shall be the later day, and the said Samuel Mostyn Forbes Woodhouse, if on that later day he is incumbent of the benefice of Leominster or is incumbent or entitled to become the incumbent of the united benefice of Leominster with Ivington, shall be the incumbent of the separate benefice.

"(3) Parsonage house.
"Upon the disunion taking effect the parsonage house of the said united benefice shall be assigned to the benefice of Leominster as the house of residence of the incumbent thereof.

"(4) Endowments.
"The endowments and property which immediately prior to the taking effect of the union belonged to the respective benefices of Ivington, Saint John, and Leominster shall upon the disunion taking effect be assigned and annexed to those benefices respectively.

"(5) Patronage.
"After the disunion has taken effect the patronage of each of the benefices of Ivington, Saint John, and Leominster shall belong to the patron to whom it belonged immediately before the taking effect of the said union.

"3. Union of the benefices of Ivington, Saint John,

"3. Union of the benefices of Ivington, Saint John, and Monkland.

"(1) The benefice of Ivington, Saint John, and the benefice of Monkland shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ivington with Monkland', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects

"(2) Taking effect of union.
"The union shall take effect upon the dis-unions of the united benefices of Monkland with Stretford and Leominster with Ivington becoming

"(3) Parsonage house.

"Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house belonging to the benefice of Monkland shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(4) Patronage.
"After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patrons of the benefice of Monkland having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"4. Alteration of boundaries

"With the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Reverend Ebenezer Charles, being the incumbent of the benefice of King's Pyon with Birley, all that part containing Dorstone of the parish of Birley which by clause 4 of the said Order in Council dated the 7th day of May, 1929, is directed to be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Stretford upon the taking effect of the uping of the benefices of Monkland and parish of Strettord upon the taking effect of the union of the benefices of Monkland and Stretford, shall, upon the taking effect of the disunion recommended and proposed in clause 1 of this Scheme, be severed from the parish of Stretford and annexed for all ecclesiastical pur-poses to the parish of Birley."

prepared and now lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme pursuant to the Episcopal Endowments and Stipends Measure, 1943, for vesting in us, the said Church Commissioners, all endowments and other property belonging to, or held in trust for, the Bishopric of Bradford or the Bishop thereof and for securing to the said Bishop the reduced stipend deemed to us appropriate:

"Whereas (the See being at present vacant) we have prepared this Scheme after consultation with the Right Honourable Sir Robert Anthony Eden, K.G., M.C., M.P., First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty during the vacancy of the See, and the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese of Bradford who have offered

Finance of the Diocese of Bradford who have offered no objection thereto:

"And whereas the said Right Honourable Sir Robert Anthony Eden, K.G., M.C., M.P., First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has also signified to us his consent to the preparation and submission of the Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the endowments and property belonging to the See of Bradford or held in trust therefor or for the Bishop thereof are described and

therefor or for the Bishop thereof are described and referred to in the Schedule hereunder written:

referred to in the Schedule hereunder written:

"Now therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, recommend and propose that upon and from the First day of January, 1956, all the endowments, securities and other property described and referred to in the said Schedule and all other if any the endowments belonging to or held in trust for the said Bishopric shall vest in us, the said Church Commissioners, pursuant to the said Measure and that we shall be entitled absolutely to the benefit, rents and profit thereof upon and from that date:

"And we further recommend and propose that we shall pay to the Bishop for the time being of the See by equal quarterly instalments in respect of the

See by equal quarterly instalments in respect of the quarters ended on the Thirty-first day of March, the Thirtieth day of June, the Thirtieth day of September and the Thirty-first day of December in every year the first such instalment to be the full quarter's payment due for the quarter ended on the Thirty-first ment due for the quarter ended on the Thirty-first

day of March, 1956, an annual stipend comprising the sum of £2,500 (or such greater sum or sums as we may from time to time determine) together with such further sums as we shall have been duly satisfied have been expended by the Bishop (I) in respect of the rent of and the rates on the house in which he shall with our approval reside and (II) in connection with the travelling required in and for the carrying out of his official duties and obligations as Bishop.
