other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal accounts for enforcing production thereof remedies for enforcing production thereof.

"SCHEDULE.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income the united benefice shall without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:—

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us and any other person or body and

"(2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof,

"and by deducting therefrom:-

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent.

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage

occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

"(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,

"(4) the rates payable on the glebe,

"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,

"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,

"(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe,

"(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income:

"(10) the annual payments in respect of capital

"(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,

"(11) any pension paid to a retired incumbent out of the benefice income,
"(12) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefice income.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of January, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—
"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Shenfield; Brentwood; Saint Paul, Bentley Common; Ingrave; Hutton; South Weald; and Christ Church, Great Warley, all in the diocese of Chelmsford.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be

"And whereas the Right Reverend Falkner, Bishop of Chelmsford, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Shenfield; Brentwood; Saint Paul, Bentley Common; Ingrave; Hutton; South Weald and Christ Church, Great Warley, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme. "THE SCHEDULE.

"A. The territory to be annexed to the parish

of Ingrave:

"(1) All that part (coloured purple on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Shenfield which lies to the southeast of the middle of the Chelmsford line of the British Railways (Eastern Region) and to the west of the parish of Ingrave.

"(2) All that part (coloured red on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Christ Church, Great Warley, which is bounded upon the northeast by that part of the parish of Shenfield hereinbefore annexed to the parish of Ingrave upon the east by the parish of Ingrave and upon the southwest by an imaginary line which commences on the boundary which divides the parish of Ingrave from the parish of Christ Church, Great Warley, at its junction with the wall or fence which forms the southwestern boundary of Walks Plantation and continuing thence northwestwards along the last mentioned wall or northwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the boundary which divides that part of the parish of Shenfield hereinbefore annexed to the parish of Ingrave from the parish of Christ Church, Great Warley.

"B. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Shenfield:—

"All those parts (coloured brown and yellow respectively on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Hutton and Ingrave which lie to the northwest of the middle of the Chelmsford Line of the British Railways (Eastern Region).

"C. The territory to be annexed to the parish

of Brentwood:

"(1) All that part of the parish of Shenfield (coloured pink on the map amexed hereto) which is bounded upon the southeast by that part of the parish of Shenfield hereinbefore annexed to the parish of Ingrave, upon the south by the parish of Christ Church, Great Warley, upon part of the west by the parish of Brentwood, upon the remaining part of the west, and upon the northwest by the parish of Saint Paul, Bentley Common, and upon the northeast by an imaginary line commencing on the houndary which divides the parish of Saint Paul the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Paul, Bentley Common, from the parish of Shenfield at a point opposite the northwestern end of the wall or fence forming the northeastern boundary of Close numbered 256 and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and thence southwestwards along the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of the last mentioned close to a point on the wall or fence forming the northeastern boundary of Close numbered 255 and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the northeastern end of the wall or fence which divides Close numbered 254 from Close numbered 255 and continuing thence first southwestwards then southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence which divides the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Paul, to its junction with the wall or fence which divides the last mentioned close from Close numbered 805 and continuing thence generally southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the point where it meets the ditch crossing the last mentioned where it meets the ditch crossing the last mentioned close and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned ditch to the point where it meets the northern end of the wall or fence which divides Closes numbered 805 and 803 from Close numbered 804 and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence which divide Close numbered 804 from Closes numbered 803 and 802 and along the walls or fences which divide Closes numbered 802, 800 and 848, from Closes numbered 835, 840, 839 and 841 and continuing thence in a straight line to the northern end of the wall or fence which divides Closes numbered 843 and 844 and continuing thence in a straight line to the northern end of the wall or fence which divides Close numbered 846 from Closes numbered 843 and 844 and continuing thence generally southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Close numbered 845 and continuing thence eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and thence southeastwards along the wall or fence and thence southeastwards along the wall or
